THE PHILADELPHIA BANKS IN EXPLANATION OF THEIR COURSE.
At an adjourned meeting of the Directors of the Banks in the city of Philadelphia and adjacent counties, held on Wednesday evening, Oct. 21st, 1874, a resolution was adopted and a previous meeting to report and present an address to the citizens of Philadelphia, on the subject of the resumption of specie payments, which was read and approved by a vote of 21 yeas and 10 nays, and directed to be signed by the Chairman and Secretary, and published in all the daily papers.

TO THE CITIZENS OF PENNSYLVANIA.
The Banks of Philadelphia, having decided to suspend for a time the payment of their notes in specie, and to pay in gold, and to explain to the citizens of Pennsylvania the reasons of this measure. They will do so by the following address.

In May, 1863, the New York suspended payments in specie, and the Union followed their example. This just and necessary measure was required by the commercial relations between this country and Europe; and all the Banks of the United States immediately suspended their specie payments, in the honorable discharge of their duty to the public, and to prepare for the resumption of specie payments.
