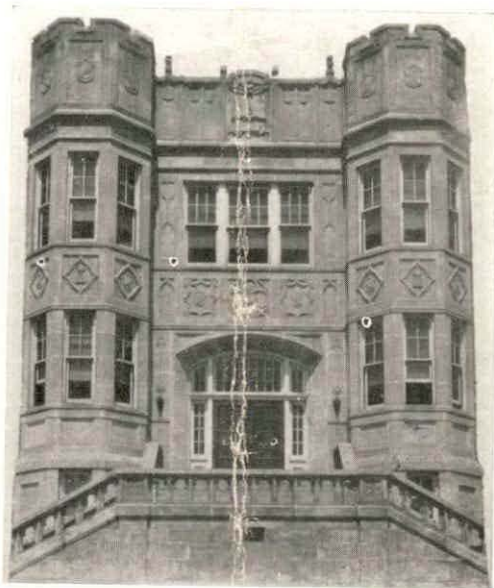

### CAFETERIA

The old cafeteria has been entirely remodeled to match the new addition. It can now boast of terrazzo floors, walls freshly painted to match the salmon colored tile wainscoting which extends up four feet from the floor. The ceiling of celotex completely absorbs the noise. New chairs and tables are arranged to comfortably accommodate the students. An extra steam table provides prompt and efficient service. The kitchen has been entirely equipped with electric appliances and the large refrigerators assure fresh well kept food. Chef Gammage offers appetizing food at remarkably low prices.

### ROOMING FACILITIES AND RATES

#### For Men Students:

Thompson Hall affords living quarters for 165 men. The building is steam-heated, well lighted and equipped with hot and cold water in the rooms, with two bathrooms on each floor providing showers. Most of the rooms are for two students and rent is \$1.50 a week per student. Three-student rooms rent for \$1.25 per week for each student.

#### For Women Students:

The women students find comfortable rooms in Allie Young Hall and Fields Hall. Most of the rooms are two-student rooms. The buildings are steam-heated, well lighted, and nicely furnished with rugs, metal furniture and comfortable chairs. The rooms are all freshly painted. Both halls are thoroughly modern in equipment, affording spacious parlors with pianos and radios where the young women make happy social contacts. Rates are the same as for young men.

#### MAJORS AND MINORS

### INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE REGISTERING

1. Freshmen should, with the advice of a faculty member, plan their schedules to meet the requirements for the College Elementary certificate listed on page 3 of this schedule. Freshmen who are not working for a certificate should plan to take prerequisites for courses in major field, as well as the general requirements of the College.
2. Upper classmen should consult the head of the department in which they are majoring and plan a schedule to meet the requirements for the Standard certificate, College certificate, or Degree without the certificate.
3. Chapel meets every Monday and Friday at 10 o'clock. Attendance is compulsory.
4. Class absences cannot be excused. Each absence is recorded against the student and must be made up. Read the catalog section relating to class absences.
5. If schedules are carefully planned, changes will not be necessary, and there is less danger of requirements being omitted. Plan your schedule carefully, making a minimum of changes necessary.

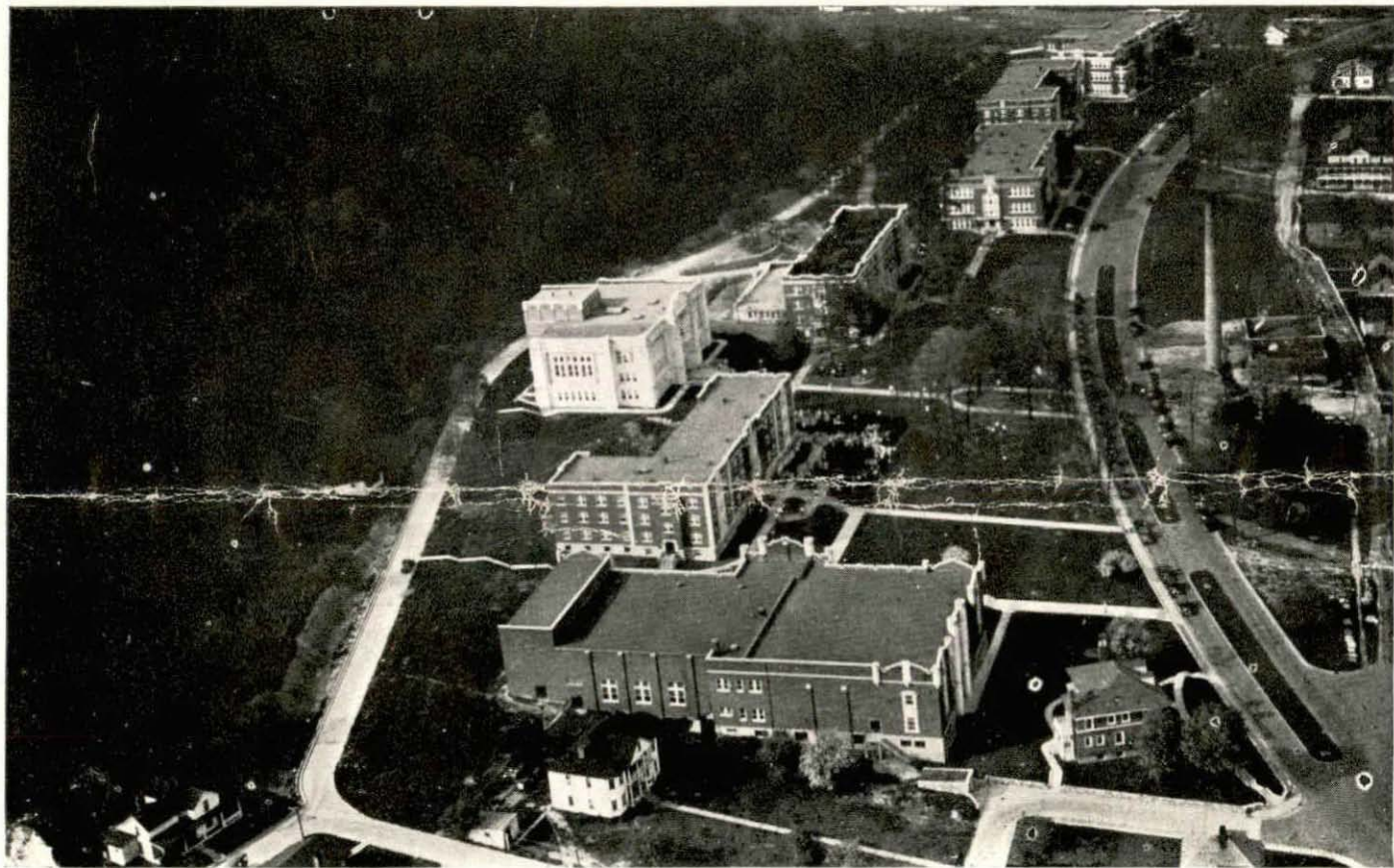
