To aid in carrying on this war thus unconstitutionally commenced, the President ha ussumed the power of raising a revenue by evying a tax (without the consent of Conlevying a tax (without the consent of Con-gress) upon importations into Mexico, thus committing another violation of the Consti-tution, and wantoulty disregarding that clause thereof, that declares that "Congress alone shall have power to lay and collect taxes."

The object of the Constitution in giving to Congress alone the power to declare wa was, that by the rashness, impotence, o to Congress atone une power to uscura: was
was, that by the rashness, impolence, or
wickedness of one man, the country might
not be subjected to that greatest of all curses, but that as a last resort it might have
the free sanction of the people. And whilst
