On account of freight conjection twenty States are passing reciprocal demurrage laws. Extraordinary power are being given railroad commissions. arbitrarily being Adequate depots and stalimited. tions are being required. Twentyeight Staies have enacted railroad legis lation, or are considering such legisla-tion with the sanguie expectation of its early passage. Reduced fare, generally to two cents a mile, is demanded by nineteen States. 


