The Mexican Expedition

We slip the following article from the Frankfort Commonwealth, the State organ of the radical party in Kentucky. It will be seen that the Cores was held as outrage by this organ. It says:

The first dispatches received, announcing the results of the Cores expedition, impressed us with the idea that it was an unnecessary measure. The killing of 243 natives, with a loss of four or five men, looks like a waste.

We waited with patience the details of the whole transaction before forming an impartial judgment. Those details are now received, and place the action of our foreign minister and Admiral in a surprising light.

The American vessels were committing a trespass upon Cores waters. When fired upon they retired to the coast to effect a treaty with the natives, and were received by some of our officers who desired to know their object. The American minister and Admiral desired to have an interview with some higher officers of the Cores.

King refusing to receive those sent. Without money, they began a survey of the river leading to the Capital. This was a trespass upon Cores rights.

It was a thing that would not have been dared against England, or Prussia, or Russia, or any other powerful nation. While engaged in committing this trespass, the American vessels were fired upon. They returned the fire, silencing the Cores forts, and winning a victory.

Minister Lowe and Admiral Rogers were not content with this, but desired more satisfaction. They procured additional ships and prepared to destroy the Cores forts and kill a few of the natives to teach them that American had a right to trespass against weak foreign nations at will.

Approaching the Cores fortifications, they opened with great guns, throwing 8 inch shells and shrapnel, from the ships, and by land attack on shore. The Cores were overwhelmed, and taken prisoner, leaving 243 dead among the works, and having others drowned, or wounded and carried off.

On the American side, Lieut. Hugh McKee, and two others were killed and six wounded. While fighting bravely, the blood of Hugh McKee and his comrades is upon the head of Minister Lowe and Admiral Rogers. Acting under orders, they did like men. But the officers in command were engaged in an unjustifiable warfare.

It is all well enough to say that the Cores were barbarians, and therefore had no rights. That is neither law nor humanity. Human life is not so cheap as to be destroyed at random, nor is American blood to be spilled in vain.

Let us be maximally exact in our conduct with foreign nations. The death of three American citizens and of 243 citizens of Cores, aggregated by this act of trespass and aggression on our part, is too heavy a matter to be dismissed on general principles of "might makes right."

Civilization and enlightened international law have long since disarmed that maxim from

correct and honorable practice. If Minister Lowe were recalled and discharged from his position, and Admiral Rogers placed under arrest to be tried for violation of international law, they would get more than their deserts. It might even seem desirably to stop from placing us in the future in troublesome complications, and present the shades of the lives of other brave American soldiers and seamen.

Contrary to expectations, and hope founded on the unfavorable reports first received of the vote from West Virginia on the question for and against a new Constitution for that State, the friends of the measure creating a New Constitution have secured a majority for it of some two thousand votes.

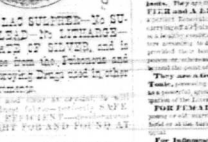
