

Guidelines for Special Funding Allocations 1996-1997

- 1. The purpose of the Special Funding Committee is to review all funding application requests for the Student Government Association. Therefore, organizations outside SGA must submit their funding application to the Special Funding Committee.
- 2. The Committee must treat every proposal in a critical and unbiased manner.
- 3. Every funding proposal that is outside the scope of the SGA should be brought before the Special Funding Committee.
- 4. Funds approved by SGA are to be used for the explicit purpose as stated in the proposal. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of funds allotted or reimbursement would be required back to SGA. The Committee also reserves the right to ask for summarization of expenditures after event.
- 5. SGA will fund no more than 50% of the total cost of a proposed funding request without exception. The funding request is to be itemized on the application. All proposals exceeding \$1000 shall be itemized to one third of the total cost.
- 6. Those student organizations with budgets directly funded by the University should not submit any applications to the Committee.
- 7. Funding must benefit the entire campus. The burden of proof lies upon the organization itself, not the SGA. The event must have some impact on the students, be it entertainment or education. An organization planning an activity should notify the SGA before planning it so that they know beforehand if the money is available.
- 8. Organizations must show a genuine need for the funds. They must have raised at least 50% or more of the expected cost before submitting a request for funds.
- 9. Persons explaining or presenting their proposals will be asked to leave when a vote is taken. The SGA office will contact the persons, or they can learn of it by reading the minutes of the SGA meeting by 1:00 p.m. each Thursday.
- 10. Any member on the Special Funding Committee who is a member or has documented ties to the organization requesting funding will not participate in a vote to bring the proposal to Congress at large.
- 11. Those organizations who have previously received money from the SGA are not guaranteed any allotment for the following year. A registered student organization is eligible to receive money one time per semester each academic year. A student organization that is not registered with the University is not eligible for SGA funds.
- 12. The Special Funding Committee will be allotted a definite amount of money that can be used for Special Funding proposals. Those members of the Special Funding Committee must be cognizant of the amount of money available for use. That amount will be mandated by the approval of a budget by Congress to be presented at the first or second SGA meeting of each semester by the Executive Committee. The amount of money may be different each semester.
- 13. It is advised that applications be submitted to the SGA office at least one calendar month before the money is needed.
