Scope and Content: Collection consists of audio recordings and transcripts of interviews conducted by Chris Green with some of the founders of the Southern Appalachian Writers Cooperative in 1990 and 1991. The interviews are with Gurney Norman, Jim Webb, Pauletta Hansel, Renee Stamper, George Ella Lyon, Richard Hague, Mike Henson and Bob Henry Baber. The collection also includes a letter from Pat Arnow on the history of the Cooperative.
