ABSENCES

When a student enrolls he is expected to attend all regular exercises of the college. Class absences seriously hinder scholarship and the college authorities request the cooperation of parents in reducing absences to a minimum. Parents are, therefore, urged to refrain from asking permission for students to be absent preceding or following a holiday or to take frequent trips over the week-ends.

Absences immediately before or after a holiday are counted as double cuts in the classes missed.

Frequent week-end trips have a definite effect upon the scholarship and health of the student. For this reason, beginning students and students of low scholastic standing will be limited to a minimum number of week-end trips during the semester at the discretion of the Dean of Women.

CHAPEL ABSENCES

For every unexcused absence from chapel in any one semester one-tenth of a quality point shall be deducted from the total number of such points achieved by the student who has been absent.

MAJORS AND MINORS

Candidates for the Standard Elementary certificate and the Bachelor's degree are not required to major in any subject. The thirty hours of required work in Education and the other group requirements satisfy the general requirements of a major and minors.

Candidates for the Provisional High School certificate and the Bachelor's degree must have an academic major (Education cannot be included) and two academic minors, or two academic majors. A major shall consist of not less than 24 hours and a minor of not less than 18 hours.

At least 43 hours of work offered for a degree must be in courses of junior and senior rank.

CERTIFICATES ISSUED ON AND AFTER SEPTEMBER 1, 1935

(Excerpts from Kentucky Common School Laws of June, 1934.)

Elementary Certificates:

THE PROVISIONAL ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE, valid for three years, shall be issued to a person who has completed a curriculum of two years (64 semester hours) for the training of elementary teachers in a standard college or university, and which curriculum meets the minimum standards prescribed by the State Board of Education for the issuance of such certificate. This certificate may be reissued or renewed after two years' teaching experience during the life of the certificate or upon the presentation of one-half year (16 semester hours) of additional standard college or university work earned during the life of the certificate and prescribed in the same manner as for the original issue, and may be renewed thereafter upon the presentation of one-half year (16 semester hours) of additional standard college or university work earned during the life of the certificate and prescribed in the same manner as for the original issue.

THE STANDARD ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE, valid for four years, shall be issued to a person who is a graduate of a standard four-year college or university and who has completed a curriculum of four years (at least 120 semester hours) for the training of elementary teachers, which curriculum meets the minimum requirements prescribed by the State Board of Education for the issuance of such certificate. This certificate may be reissued or renewed every four-years after three years' teaching experience during the life of the certificate or upon the presentation of one-half year of standard college or university work of a graduate grade prescribed in the same manner as for original issue.

The standard elementary certificate may be extended for life upon the presentation of evidence of the holder having completed a standard four-year college or university curriculum (at least 120 semester hours) for the training of elementary teachers and in addition thereto, one year of standard college or university work of graduate grade, prescribed in the same manner as for the original issue, and three years' teaching experience in the elementary field during the life of the certificate.

Each elementary certificate shall show on its face the curriculum the holder has completed for its issuance.

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High School Certificates:

THE PROVISIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE, valid for four years shall be issued to a person who is a graduate of a standard four-year college or university and who has completed a curriculum of four years (at least 120 semester hours) for the training of high school teachers, which curriculum meets the maximum standards prescribed by the State Board of Education for the issuance of such certificate. This certificate may be reissued or renewed every four years after three years' teaching experience during the life of the certificate or upon presentation of one-half year of standard college or university work of graduate grade earned during the life of the certificate and prescribed in the same manner as for the original issue.

I. Major and Minor Requirements:

Each curriculum must include two majors (exclusive of education) of at least twenty-four semester hours or a major of twenty-four semester hours and two minors of 18 semester hours each.

Special Curricula

Special Curricula will be offered in agriculture, home economics, and music.

* If three units or more of a foreign language are offered for admission, six semester hours in the same language will be required; if two units of a foreign language are offered for admission, nine semester hours in the same language will be required; if one unit or less of a foreign language is offered for admission, twelve semester hours in the same language will be required.

THE STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE, valid for five years, shall be issued to a person who is a graduate of a standard four-year college or university and who has completed a standard four-year college or university curriculum for the training of high school teachers and who, in addition thereto, has completed one year of standard college or university work of graduate grade, all of which work meets the minimum standards prescribed by the State Board of Education for the issuance of such certificate.

The standard high school certificate may be extended for life upon presentation of evidence that the holder has had three years' teaching experience in the high school field during the life of the certificate.

Each high school certificate shall show on its face the curriculum the holder has completed for its issuance.

CERTIFICATES IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION: These certificates shall be valid for use in any position of superintendent, principal, supervisor, teacher, or attendance officer.

PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION, valid for four years, shall be issued to a person who has had at least two years' successful teaching experience and who is a graduate of a standard four-year college or university and who has completed a standard four-year college or university curriculum (at least 120 semester hours) for the training of administrators and supervisors, which curriculum meets the minimum standards prescribed by the State Board of Education for the issuance of such cer-

tificate. This certificate may be reissued or renewed every four years after three years' experience during the life of the certificate or upon presentation of one-half year of standard college or university work of graduate grade, prescribed in the same manner as for the original issue.

The Provisional Certificate in Administration and Supervision will be issued to any person who has completed a four-year curriculum leading to the Provisional High School Certificate or the Standard Elementary Certificate and who has had the following professional courses:

STANDARD CERTIFICATE IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION, valid for five years, shall be issued to a person who has had at least two years' successful teaching experience and who is a graduate of a standard four-year college or university and who has completed a standard four-year college or university curriculum for the training of administrators and supervisors, and who, in addition thereto, has completed one year of standard college or university work of graduate grade, all of which work meets the minimum standards prescribed by the State Board of Education for the issuance of such certificate.

The standard certificate in administration and supervision may be extended for life upon presentation of evidence that the holder has had three years of successful experience during the life of the certificate.

Each certificate in administration and supervision shall show on its face the curriculum the holder has completed for its issuance.

ATTENDANCE OFFICERS CERTIFICATE. The State Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, shall prepare rules and regulations providing for the certification of attendance officers.

Curricula for Attendance Officers: The Council on Public Higher Education recommends to the State Board of Education that any curriculum leading to a teacher's certificate shall qualify for attendance officer, provided such curriculum includes 3 hours in pupil accounting.

A year of graduate study shall be interpreted to mean the completion of the requirements for a Master's degree in a standard graduate school.

Five-year curricula for the training of Elementary Teachers shall meet the requirements of a four-year curriculum prescribed by the Council on Public Higher Education and approved by the State Board of Education for the training of Elementary Teachers, and in addition thereto the requirements for the Master's degree in a standard graduate school.

Five-year curricula for the training of High School Teachers shall include the requirements for the completion of a four-year curriculum

for the training of high school teachers as prescribed by the Council on Public Higher Education and approved by the State Board of Education, and in addition thereto the requirements for a Master's degree in a standard graduate school.

Five-year curricula for the training of Administrators and Supervisors shall include the requirements in the four-year curriculum for the training of administrators and supervisors as prescribed by the Council on Public Higher Education, and approved by the State Board of Education, and in addition thereto shall complete the requirements for the Master's degree in a standard graduate school in the field of Administration and Supervision.

A period of adjustment shall be provided during which colleges and students shall be given opportunity to meet requirements of the curricula prescribed by the Council on Public Higher Education. This period of adjustment shall continue until September 1, 1937. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and regulations for the administration of curricula during this period of adjustment.

CERTIFICATES OF FORMER ISSUE: The validity of any certificate or license in force at the time this act goes into effect shall not be impaired by this act, and such certificate or license shall be reissued or renewed in accordance with the terms of the law applying at the date of issue.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES; CERTIFICATES REQUIRED: No person shall receive or hold any certificate provided for in this act who does not present evidence of a good moral character, or who is under 18 years of age; and no one shall be eligible to hold any public school position for which certificates may be issued, or receive salary for services rendered in such position, who does not hold a certificate of legal qualifications for such position.
