MAJORS AND MINORS

Candidates for the Standard Elementary certificate and the Bachelor's degree are not required to major in any subject. The thirty hours of required work in Education and the other group requirements satisfy the general requirements of a major and minors.

Candidates for the Provisional High School certificate and the Bachelor's degree must have an academic major (Education cannot be included) and two academic minors, or two academic majors. A major shall consist of not less than 24 hours and a minor of not less than 18 hours.

At least 43 hours of work offered for a degree must be in courses of junior and senior rank.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES UNDER
ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 1934. (SEE SECTION
4502-3 KENTUCKY STATUTES.)**

THE PROVISIONAL ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE valid for three years shall be issued to a person who meets the general requirements of law and the regulations of the State Board of Education and files a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of the following curriculum:

a. Education, including

1. Education Psychology or General Psychology..... 3 hours
2. Fundamentals of Elementary Education 4 hours
3. Supervised Student Teaching 3 hours
4. Elective Course in Education 3 hours

b. English, including

1. Oral and Written Composition 6 hours
2. English Literature or American Literature or
Survey of Literature 3 hours
3. Children's Literature 3 hours

Total 12 hours

c. Social Science, including

1. American History and Citizenship (integrated).... 6 hours

THE PROVISIONAL ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE shall be issued to a person who prior to September 1, 1935, partially fulfilled the requirements for the Standard Elementary Certificate, based upon two years of college, provided that the remaining work required for the Provisional Elementary Certificate shall be selected from the curriculum for the issuance of the Provisional Elementary Certificate, which courses selected shall include three semester hours in supervised student teaching.

THE STANDARD ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE valid for four years shall be issued to a person who meets the general requirements of law and the regulations of the State Board of Education and files a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of the following curriculum for elementary teachers:

THE STANDARD ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE valid for four years shall be issued to a person who partially completed the requirements for the Standard Elementary Certificate before September 1, 1935, provided that the additional work required for the completion of the four-year curriculum for the issuance of the Standard Elementary Certificate shall be selected from the prescribed courses in the approved four-year curriculum for the issuance of the Standard Elementary Certificate, and provided that six semester hours of credit shall be in supervised student teaching.

THE PROVISIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE valid for four years shall be issued to a person who meets the general requirements of law and the regulations of the State Board of Education, and files a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of a curriculum which includes the following courses and minimum standards:

- a. Major (minimum of 24 semester hours) and two minors (minimum of 18 semester hours each) or two majors selected from subject fields in the curriculum adopted by the State Board of Education for the public elementary and/or public secondary schools.
- b. A core curriculum as follows:
 1. English 12 hours
 2. Science, selected from Biology,
Chemistry, General Science,
Geology, Physics 12 hours
 3. Health 2 hours
 4. Social Sciences, selected from
Economics, Government, History,
Sociology 12 hours
 5. Mathematics (exclusive of Arithmetic) or 6 hours

- *6. Foreign Language 6 to 12 hours
- 7. Physical Education 1 hour
- c. 18 semester hours in Education as follows:
 - 1. Supervised Student Teaching 6 hours
(At least three hours in student teaching shall be done in the secondary school.)
 - 2. Psychology or Educational Psychology 3 hours
 - 3. Elective (selected from at least two phases of secondary education) 9 hours
- d. Elective 51-65 hours
- Total required hours 120-128 plus degree.

* If three units or more of a foreign language are offered for admission, six semester hours in the same language will be required; if two units of a foreign language are offered for admission, nine semester hours in the same language will be required; if one unit or less of a foreign language is offered for admission, twelve semester hours in the same language will be required.

A PROVISIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE valid for four years shall be issued to a person who meets the requirements of law and general regulations of the State Board of Education and files a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of the requirements for a Smith-Hughes teacher of Agriculture or Home Economics, who holds at least a Baccalaureate degree, and who has met the education requirements set by the Council on Public Higher Education and approved by the State Board of Education as follows:

- a. Supervised Student Teaching 6 hours
(At least three hours in student teaching shall be done in the secondary school.)
- b. Psychology or Educational Psychology 3 hours
- c. Elective (selected from at least two phases of secondary education) 9 hours

A PROVISIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE valid for four years shall be issued to a person who meets the requirements of law and general regulations of the State Board of Education and files a transcript of standard college credits showing that he has met the requirements for a Baccalaureate degree in music education and the requirements set by the Council on Public Higher Education and approved by the State Board of Education as follows:

- a. Supervised Student Teaching 6 hours
(At least three hours in student teaching shall be done in the secondary school.)
- b. Psychology or Educational Psychology 3 hours
- c. Elective (selected from at least two phases of secondary education) 9 hours

THE STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE valid for five years shall be issued to a person who meets the requirements of law

and general regulations of the State Board of Education and files a transcript of credits showing the completion of the four-year curriculum for the training of high school teachers as prescribed by the Council on Public Higher Education and approved by the State Board of Education, and who, in addition thereto, completes the requirements for a Master's degree in a standard graduate school.

THE PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION valid for four years shall be issued to a person who has fulfilled the requirements of law and the general regulations of the State Board of Education, who has had a minimum of two years' successful teaching experience, who has completed a four-year curriculum for the training of elementary or high school teachers as approved by the State Board of Education, and who presents a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of the following courses in Education:

- a. Courses in Administration and Supervision..... 6 hours
- b. Courses in Elementary Education 6 hours
- c. Supervised Student Teaching 6 hours
- d. Courses in Secondary Education 6 hours

THE PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION valid for four years shall be issued to a person who holds a Standard Certificate in Administration and Supervision issued under the laws of 1932, provided that the holder makes application and presents a transcript of standard college credits upon which the certificate-to-be-converted was issued.

THE STANDARD CERTIFICATE IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION valid for five years shall be issued to a person who has met the requirements for the issuance of the Provisional Certificate in Administration and Supervision and in addition thereto files a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of the requirements for the Master's degree, with a major in the field of Administration and Supervision, in a standard graduate school.

A STANDARD CERTIFICATE IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION SHALL BE ISSUED to a person who has met the requirements of law and the regulations of the State Board of Education, who on September 1, 1935, held a certificate based upon four years of college training, and who presents a transcript of standard college credits showing the completion of the requirements for the Master's degree in a standard graduate school, with a major in the field of Administration and Supervision.

ATTENDANCE OFFICER'S CERTIFICATE valid for three years shall be issued to a person who has met the requirements of law and who, in addition thereto, completes (a) a two-year curriculum for the training of teachers, which curriculum shall include three semester hours in pupil accounting, or (b) completes a two-year standard col-

lege curriculum which shall include 12 semester hours in education courses with 3 semester hours in pupil personnel. This certificate may be reissued every three years upon three years experience as attendance officer, or 16 semester hours of standard college training.

VALIDITY AND TENURE OF CERTIFICATES

Certificates issued before September 1, 1935, will be valid as long as they remain in force. They can be renewed, or extended upon the conditions set out in the law and regulations in force at the time they were issued. A certificate issued before September 1, 1935, and valid for holding a particular type of position will be legally valid for holding the same type of position after September 1, 1935.

Certificates issued after September 1, 1935, will be valid at the school levels and positions for which they are issued.

A period of adjustment shall be provided during which colleges and students shall be given opportunity to meet requirements of the curricula prescribed by the Council on Public Higher Education. This period of adjustment shall continue until September 1, 1937. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and regulations for the administration of curricula during this period of adjustment.

CERTIFICATES OF FORMER ISSUE: The validity of any certificate or license in force at the time this act goes into effect shall not be impaired by this act, and such certificate or license shall be reissued or renewed in accordance with the terms of the law applying at the date of issue.
