Dear Academic Colleagues and Friends,

The quantity and quality of research and creative production represented in this Annual Report for 2002 provide an impressive statement about scholarship at Morehead State University. The report illustrates the full range of scholarly activity characteristic of academic excellence and essential to student success. To the faculty and staff cited in this report, I wish to express my appreciation for your contribution to the mission of Morehead State University. As a result of your efforts, new knowledge or works have been created, existing knowledge has been integrated in a more meaningful and useful form or applied to meet the needs of our region, and student learning has been enhanced.

I wish also to express my gratitude to the staff in the Office of Research, Grants and Contracts for their continued and tireless support of your efforts and the University's mission. If you have not thanked an RGC staff person lately, now would be an appropriate time to do so.
