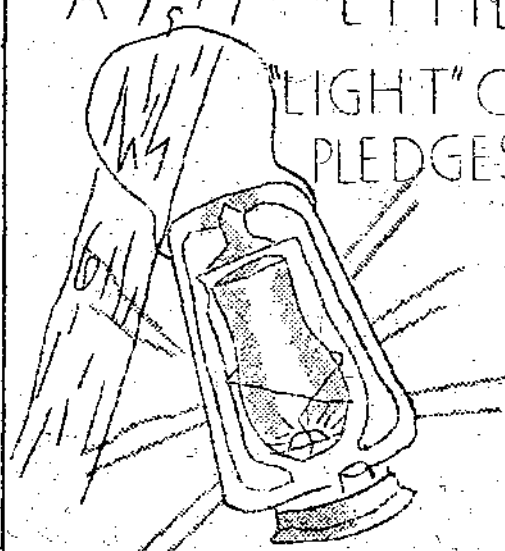

A LITTLE "LIGHT" ON PLEDGES-



In order to ascertain just how many persons in our church made a pledge toward the budget and how much each pledge amounts to in the light of the total number of pledges made, the following table was compiled by the Church Treasurer:

These figures in the adjoining column are revealing. Here are a few facts that are gleaned from them:

(1) The pledges total 91, but they represent the giving of 138 persons, because some of them are the joint pledge of husband and wife, or husband, wife, children in one family.

(2) 22 of the 138 pledges represent giving to our Church by other than church members. That means that only 116 persons in our total membership (240 in all) even make a pledge toward the support of the church. LESS THAN ONE HALF OF THE MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH INDICATE THEIR INTEREST BY MAKING A PLEDGE. There are some who give regularly, but do not make a pledge. Their number, however, is not large enough to make a difference in the foregoing facts.

(3) The total amount of all of the pledges is \$ 3,494.40. Nine pledges, representing 17 persons, amount to \$ 1,365.00. This amount is more than one-third of the total amount pledged. In other words, 17 persons carry over one-third of the financial burden of the church.

(4) The figures, of course, do not show it, but not all of the pledges have been paid. Compare the total amount of the pledges, which is \$ 3,494.40 and the amount paid in pledges (see reverse side) which is \$3,386.47; deducting some for those who give, but do not pledge, and one sees the approximate amount.
