

Featured Program: Master of Arts in Social Sciences

In the fall of 2011, MSU introduced the Master of Arts in Social Sciences graduate degree program. The master's degree is an innovative program in interdisciplinary social sciences which offers classes that address broad topics such as globalization, race, and culture from the point of view of sociologists, political scientists, historians, and geographers. The program draws on the talents of many faculty members from several disciplines which include:

- * Ann Andaloro, Communications with a focus on feminism and television audience studies.
- Bernadette Barton, Sociology and the author of Stripped: Inside the Lives of Exotic Dancers and Pray the Gay Away: The Extraordinary Lives of Bible Belt Gays
- * Ric Caric, Political Science and focusing on American politics, African-American thought, and the history of popular culture.



- * Kristina DuRocher, History and the author Raising Racists: The Socialization of White Children in the Jim Crow South.
- * Daryl Privott, Education and the author of Military Recruiting on College Campuses: Legal, Theoretical and Practical Implications of Rumsfeld v. FAIR.
- * Suzanne Tallichet, Sociology and the author of Daughters of the Mountain: Women Coal Miners in Central Appalachia.

The Master of Arts in Social Sciences program is designed with several types of students in mind. Students who plan to apply to Ph.D. programs may further their efforts by seeking a social sciences degree. Social Studies teachers can use the degree as part of their qualification for a Rank I or Rank II position with approval from the Education Professional Standards Board. Likewise, because of the convenience of the online program, college graduates who have an intellectual interest in the social sciences but are not able to change locations can further their education as well.

In addition, the MA in Social Sciences program seeks to maximize student flexibility by providing the option of a fully online program or taking a combination of traditional and online classes. Thesis and non-thesis options as well as internship opportunities are also available. What's New in Grad School

Applying for Graduation Has Never Been Easier

It's the beginning of a new academic year at MSU and the Graduate School has implemented a few new things as well. As of this past July, the Office of the Registrar rolled out a new online graduation process for fall registration. The new graduation form, which is now located within the mymoreheadstate student portal, will allow students who are completing a master's, education specialist or doctoral degree the opportunity to apply for graduation and pay the graduate fee all online.

"The new process for applying for completion of a graduate program makes it more convenient for our students since it is now housed within the online student portal. This then allows the student to complete the form anytime without a call or visit to campus" stated Angela Ross, completion coordinator for the graduate school.

Angela, in collaboration with the Registrar's Office worked diligently on this process so that it would be up and running for the fall semester. Complete details are available on our web site.

The Advantages of ProQuest

Since fall of 2013, MSU students have been using ProQuest, an online database resource, for submission of their theses, applied projects, and doctoral capstones. The process before was quite cumbersome and costly to both students and the university. However, students now have the convenience of submitting their scholarly work electronically via the ProQuest web site in a more expedient and timely manner.

Still, there are even more advantages for students who use ProQuest. One major advantage is the increased visibility for students within the scholarly community made available to researchers through the Dissertations and Theses Global Database. Students may also perform their own searches for scholarly content using the ProQuest Research Library. Another important advantage is that ProQuest provides students with the option to electronically copyright their theses or dissertations, which wasn't an option previously.

The Graduate School is pleased to provide this new process for submitting scholarly work which is now more convenient and less complicated. Additionally, the advantages of enhanced research visibility to other scholars as well as copyright capability are just a few of the ways that we continue to strive to bring better customer service to our students.
