The new academic year begins and brings fresh starts and new excitement for growing graduate programs at Morehead State. In the past year, the Graduate School initiated a new general marketing plan that involved contacting potential students in selected areas who had taken the GRE, GMAT, and MAT, advertising in Graduate Schools.com, actively reaching out to graduating seniors from MSU, providing College of Education-specific program information to teachers/administrators in the service region, and beginning to plan for the use of Graduate Dean's Scholars for focus groups and as student ambassadors.

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EARLY GRAD SCHOOL: MSU'S BEST KEPT SECRET

The word is getting out about the Early Grad School program and students are beginning to take advantage of the many opportunities that it offers. Early Grad School gives undergraduate students the ability to earn up to 12 graduate credit hours while holding undergraduate concurrent admission. Enrolling in graduate courses at the undergraduate level permits students to "try out" graduate school while giving them a jump start on their graduate school education.

However, one of the biggest benefits is that students who are admitted to the Early Grad School Program are billed at the undergraduate tuition rate for graduate level courses. This means that early grad school students have the opportunity for huge savings while potentially completing almost half of their graduate degree program.

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FEATURED PROGRAM: MASTER OF ARTS IN SOCIOLOGY

The Master of Arts in Sociology program has expanded its areas of concentration and is now entirely online beginning Fall 2016. The program offers four areas of concentration: General Sociology, Criminology, Chemical Dependency, and the newly added Interdisciplinary Social Sciences.

There are several different types of jobs for which our graduates are qualified. Examples include education (teaching, administration, or research); business (management, marketing consumer research, planning or human resources); human services and community relations (counseling, advocacy, mental health and social services agencies); criminal justice (law enforcement, corrections, rehabilitation or judiciary) and the environment (health and planning agencies at the federal, state and local levels and nonprofit advocacy and consulting nongovernmental organizations).
