Building Entrance Smoking Policy

The interiors of the academic, administrative, and athletic buildings on campus have been smoke-free for several years. However, concerns continue to be expressed by our faculty, staff and students about the health risks of second hand smoke in and around the entrances to those buildings.

To help address those concerns, the Campus Wellness Committee was asked to review best practices in place at other universities and businesses. The purpose of the Campus Wellness Committee is to promote a quality physical environment for the University's students, faculty and staff, and to make recommendations for improvements for related issues. Based on the committee's recommendation, most of the entrances to academic, administrative, and athletic facilities have been designated as no smoking areas. Signage will be placed on the doors to the facilities indicating that smoking is not permitted within 25 feet of those entrances.

Most buildings will have one entrance where smoking will be permitted to provide some degree of shelter for smokers, when possible. Receptacles for the disposal of cigarette butts will be available at these entrances. A map showing the location of those entrances where smoking is permitted, is available at www.moreheadstate.edu/convocation. Individuals who wish to avoid the second hand smoke also will be able to identify from this map, the smoke free entrances for entering and leaving the buildings.

To assist individuals who may wish to stop smoking, the University will be offering smoking cessation classes for faculty and staff. The classes are planned to start around the middle of September. Information about participation in the smoking cessation program will be distributed nearer that date.

Change in Faculty Staff Parking Designations

Zone E becomes the parking designation for employees effective August 15, 2005. This replaces the old Faculty/Staff (F/S) designation. Signage will change in the former F/S lots to E. The former E

Traffic Changes & Updates

For the first time in two years, two-way traffic has resumed on Nickell Place, which connects Second Street and University Street behind the Howell-McDowell Administration Building. The street had been one-way north since August 2003 because of the ADUC construction project.

The street was reopened last week as a two-way route following removal of a barricade and widening of the intersection with Second Street to allow more room for right turns. A new crosswalk with stop signs in both directions has been added at the junction of Nickell Place and Second Street beside the Methodist Student Center.

Other changes in traffic flow and parking are expected in the near future.

Residence Hall Improvements – Open House for Faculty & Staff

Responding to student input, the Physical Plant and Student Housing staff have been busy readying residence facilities for students' return to campus. Most facilities have been painted. Some have new furniture and community kitchen facilities. Card access has been installed on all residence halls and Eagle Lake and Mays Hall Apartments.

Faculty and staff are invited to tour residence halls on Wednesday, August 17, from 3 to 5 p.m. Our halls are in great shape for 30+ year old buildings. Our student and professional staff are anxious to give you a tour and talk with you about our residence hall program.

Residential facilities will be tobacco-free complementing the campus smoking policy. Designated use areas away from entrances and air intake systems have been identified in residential areas.
