Treasurer's Report: Alex mentioned that the utility bill for Jan. and Feb. was \$2,100.00. Thought utility budget would probably be only budgeted item to go over projection at this time. Bank balance would be around \$500. Discussion followed and it is noted that the rental income is still put into a separate account.

#### Committee Reports:

Stewardship: Ron reported that estimates (average) should be running around \$1,300.00 instead of the \$1,150.00 now received for the past seven weeks. It was noted that the terriable weather for at least three Sundays cut into this collection and should be looking better when the weather breaks.

Education: Marge reported that most of the Youth Activities were cancelled because of the bad weather. They managed to get to Lexington for the skating party. Noted that all the Sunday School classes have teachers for the next six months.

Sharing in Christian Service: Noted that the Week of Compassion offering was \$355 toward goal of \$600. Offering would stay open till goal reached.

Social Action: Elmer reported that the bad weather had closed the Human Concern Office down for 6 or 7 days. Noted that a small cash loan was made to a family and would probably be repaid. The Spring Sale would start around Feb. 26th.

Long Range Planning: Harold noted that a meeting would be held shortly to review other comments.

Living Memorial Fund: Noted that the ECHO will be publishing list of gifts. At this time there has been gifts in the honor of 51 persons. Living Memorial Book has not arrived.

It was reported that a challenge gift up to \$1,000 was made to the Church Membership-for every two dollars given, it would be matched by one dollar to a maximum of \$1000. Motion was passed and painting was to start as soon as possible with updates in the ECHO. Also noted by Towny that a new sewer line would have to Information was needed from be installed when the weather was better. city to where new line could be laid. Also noted that emergency lighting would be installed for stairs going down to Fellowhip Hall and other places.

Elder's Report: Elmer reported that a list of people that had and needed Communion taken to them would be established and there would be a Visitation schedule made up. Noted that Jack B. and Mary Jane would be on call for March.

Deacon's Report: Noted that Mayhew, Holbrook, Wells, Adkins, Hart and the Griffiths.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Discussed handout. Noted that he had 16 young people in his Pastor's class at this time.

Old Business: None

New Business: A letter from radio station WMKY was read. Noted that it was an invitation to others to use their Public Service time. A written request must be made to station manager, Myron Doan, requesting the time for our Sunday Broadcast.

At this time, Ellen Frost presented an AV program entitled, "KENTUCKY ARISE". Dealt with a Capital Campaign and would be discussed in a issue of the ECHO. Our goal toward this campaign is around \$14,054 over a three year period.

Education: Marge mention that plans were being formulate for a Church Vacation School. Also Senior Sunday would be May 19th and on June 2nd, youth minister Terry Ewing would be guest speaker.

Worship: Noted that all Easter programs have been planned. Choir robes to be cleaned.

Christian Service: Noted that there will be a special collection on the 5th Sunday for the Christian Church Homes. More information would be in the ECHO. Also that special envelopes would be in the Easter bulletin.
