Because of bad weather, the Human Concerns Office was mostly closed during January. However, five families had been ehlped in January. Noted that the Morehead Ministrial Association had received \$300 from our church.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Randy Wells and opening prayer was presented by Glen Johnston.

The following Board members were present: Alex Conyers, Ron Walke, Jack Landreth, Eva and Glenn Johnston, Helen Patrick, Elizabeth Anderson, Jack Bizzel, NC Marsh, Grace Cassity, Anne and Glen Buckner, Mary Jane Bowne, Neva and Tommy Griffith, Scharlene Whidden, Randy Wells and Al Evans. Guest present were Rev. Harold Tackett.

Minutes of the February Board Meeting were accepted as recorded on motion by Elizabeth Anderson and seconded by Glen Johnston.

TREASURER"S REPORT: Alex gave a brief report for the month. Noted that there were receipts of \$16,000 and expenses of \$20,000. This was that some of the items had been paid in advance and there was a balance of \$8,000 in the general account at this time. Explained how some of the monies had been transferred from the Inez Faith Humphrey account to other account and also to a money market account. Month of March would start with around \$7,000 in the Operating account and \$3,600 in the General Account at this time. Alex noted that so far \$1,860 had been spent on utilities and is down from the previous year by about \$1,000-1,5000. Would be toward a mild winter and better energy habits in the church.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Property: Tommy noted that he would donated air condition units and the required duet work for the upstairs Sunday School rooms if the Board would agree to pay for the labor involved. Motion made by Helen and seconded by Glen Johnston that Tommy's motion be accepted. Motion passed. Thank you very meuh Tommy for this gift.

Worship: Noted at the bottom of tonights agenda. Everything is ready for the Easter Services. Noted that there would be a NEW communion format.

Christian Service: Announced that Week of Compassion offering was at \$450 and would be held open for one or two more Sundays.

Social Action: Reported by Elizabeth that a  $\frac{1}{2}$  price sale was in progress There is a great need now for food and transporation as the clothing end is taking care of it self at the moment. Account had \$1,000. Was in planning stages for the move to the Hogge house, etc.

Long Range Planning: Several proposals were made by Tommy Griffith at this time. Noted that a State Certified Architect was needed for new church plans and would cost an additional \$1250. Also the maximum of \$3200 would be needed for new estimates, this would be a maximum amount to be paid with the estimated cost to be around \$1950. Ron Walke made a motion to accept Tommy's request, seconded by Jack Landreth, motion carried. Discussion followed on wireless mikes to be used in church serviceeas well as small receivers for the hearing impaired. Three units needed to be purchased, minimum order, at a cost of \$738. Board had given prior approval.

Living Memorial Fund: Noted that at this time there was \$46,000 in the Equiable Money Market account.

Membership: Jack Bizzel passed out a handout with inactive church members and held a brief discussion of where abouts of lost members, etc. Noted that at this time there was 225 active church members.

Mlder's Report: Noted that a new format would be forth comming in the next few Sunday Services.

Deacon's Report: April deacons would be: Al Evans, Jeff Bryant, May Williams, Anne Buckrer, Hubert Allen and Sonie Griffith.

Minister's Report: Harold noted at this time the location of Christian Church homes was very favorable. A option was taken on the land by the new shopping center off of I-64 through the Jackson Builders, a 6 month option off around 21 acres.

Old Business: None at this time.

New Business: Noted that several other Human Concern office of other churches would like to merge into one centerally located office. This would include the Social Acion group as well as a Food Bank for Eastern Kentucky. Tackett would be going to other meetings and would get back to the Board on any new information.

Adjourment was at 8:16 FM with closing prayer presented by Harold Tackett.
