January 27, 1987

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Randy Wells and opening prayer was presented by Jack Bizzel.

Board members present were: Jack Bizzel, Neva Griffith, Jack and Scharlene Whidden, Grace Cassity, Helen Patrick, Elmer and Elizabeth Anderson, Glenn and Ann Buckner, Alex Conyers, Chlo Calvert, Mary Jane Bowne, Jeannie Huie, Randy Wells and Al Evans. Guest present were Harold Tackett.

Minutes of November Board meeting were accepted as recorded on motion by Jack Bizzel and seconded by Elmer Anderson.

Treasurers Report: Alex Conyers presented handout of treasures report for the year 1986 and proposed budget for 1987. Discussion followed with explanation given to the new format for 1987. Noted that like-items were grouped together and other line items will be condensed for easier recognition or added later. Also noted that the Living Memorial Fund received over \$10,000 in 1986. A break down would be \$6,000 from the Christy estate, \$1,000 gift and over \$3,000 in memorial gift of church members that had passed away in 1986.

Committee Reports:

Worship: Harold Tackett reported for Fran Helphinstine that plans were made for Easter which will be the week of April 12-19th. Noted that the 1987 Advent 3 Guides would be in the mail soon.

Social Action: Elizabeth Anderson discussed the Annual Report whcih had been in the ECHO. Noted that 47 families were helped during Christmas. Because of bad weather, the Human Concerns Office was mostly closed during January. However, five families had been ehlped in January. Noted that the Morehead Ministerial Association had received \$300 from our church.

Membership: Jack Bizzel reported that a new listing of church members was in process of being completed.

Property: Glen reported that the Pastor's office work has been completed with new shelving. Hogge property, both inside and outside has been cleaned up along with most of the church carpet. Glenn noted that the church needs a new vacuum cleaner, preferable a heavy duty commercial type. Motion made by Elmer and sceonded by Chlo that the committee purchase what they need. Motion passed. Glen noted that the Youth Group was to get back to him on the cleaning of side walks and outside of church.

ELDERS REPORT: No report at this time, but would be meeting at Mary Jane Bowne's house for their next meeting.

DEACONS REPORT: Scharlene announced the following would be Deacons for February: Ron Walke, Helen Patrick, Jeanie Huie, Bob Franzini, Gail Tingle and Steve Thoms.

MINISTERS REPORT: Hqrold Tackett presented his report. Noted that the \$300 given to the Ministerial Association was part of each Church's pledge. This

is part of a relief package that will be administered by the Rowan County Civil Defense unit for those families needing help overnight, etc. The university will provide shelter in the form of empty trailers and security will be provided by the campus police. Harold noted the the church finances were in very good shape as well as its investments. Brought up the possibility of having an Financial Advisor for church investments for the future. Also noted that attendance at Sunday Worship was up by twenty persons. Questioned by board that this was actual head-count, not what was signed in the attendance books.

OLD BUSINESS: None at this time.

NEW BUSINESS: Noted that not all proposed budgets from each committee has been received and that needs to be done as soon as possible so Alex can finalize his figures. Jack Whidden made a motion that the proposed budget that Alex presented in his treasurers report at the beging of the meeting be approved, seconded by Elmer and motion passed. A discussion followed on the determination of Revival expenses, mostly which should be taken care of offerings per revival and ear-marked gifts. Noted that the Proposed Budget for 1987 would be in the ECHO.

Motion made by Jack Bizzel and Seonded by Glenn that the meeting adjourn at 8:23 PM Closing prayer was presented by Elder Elmer Anderson.

Monthly Board Meeting  
March 23, 1987

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Randy Wells and opening prayer was presented by Glen Johnston.

The following Board members were present: Alex Conyers, Ron Walke, Jack Landreth, Eva and Glenn Johnston, Helen Patrick, Elizabeth Anderson, Jack Bizzel, NC Marsh, Grace Cassity, Anne and Glen Buckner, Mary Jane Bowne, Neva and Tommy Griffith, Scharlene Whidden, Randy Wells and Al Evans. Guest present were Rev. Harold Tackett.

Minutes of the February Board Meeting were accepted as recorded on motion by Elizabeth Anderson and seconded by Glen Johnston.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Alex gave a brief report for the month. Noted that there were receipts of \$16,000 and expenses of \$20,000. This was that some of the items had been paid in advance and there was a balance of \$8,000 in the general account at this time. Explained how some of the monies had been transferred from the Inez Faith Humphrey account to other account and also to a money market account. Month of March would start with around \$7,000 in the Operating account and \$3,600 in the General Account at this time. Alex noted that so far \$1,860 had been spent on utilities and is down from the previous year by about \$1,000-1,500. Would be toward a mild winter and better energy habits in the church.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Property: Tommy noted that he would donated air condition units and the required duct work for the upstairs Sunday School rooms if the Board would agree to pay for the labor involved. Motion made by Helen and seconded by Glen Johnston that Tommy's motion be accepted. Motion passed. Thank you very much Tommy for this gift.

Worship: Noted at the bottom of tonights agenda. Everything is ready for the Easter Services. Noted that there would be a NEW communion format.

Christian Service: Announced that Week of Compassion offering was at \$450 and would be held open for one or two more Sundays.

Social Action: Reported by Elizabeth that a  $\frac{1}{2}$  price sale was in progress. There is a great need now for food and transporation as the clothing end is taking care of it self at the moment. Account had \$1,000. Was in planning stages for the move to the Hogge house, etc.

Long Range Planning: Several proposals were made by Tommy Griffith at this time. Noted that a State Certified Architect was needed for new church plans and would cost an additional \$1250. Also the maximum of \$3200 would be needed for new estimates, this would be a maximum amount to be paid with the estimated cost to be around \$1950. Ron Walke made a motion to accept Tommy's request, seconded by Jack Landreth, motion carried. Discussion followed on wireless mikes to be used in church servicees as well as small receivers for the hearing impaired. Three units needed to be purchased, minimum order, at a cost of \$738. Board had given prior approval.



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Living Memorial Fund: Noted that at this time there was \$46,000 in the Equitable Money Market account.

Membership: Jack Bizzel passed out a handout with inactive church members and held a brief discussion of whereabouts of lost members, etc. Noted that at this time there was 225 active church members.

Elder's Report: Noted that a new format would be forth coming in the next few Sunday Services.

Deacon's Report: April deacons would be: Al Evans, Jeff Bryant, May Williams, Anne Buckner, Hubert Allen and Sonie Griffith.

Minister's Report: Harold noted at this time the location of Christian Church homes was very favorable. A option was taken on the land by the new shopping center off of I-64 through the Jackson Builders, a 6 month option of around 21 acres.

Old Business: None at this time.

New Business: Noted that several other Human Concern office of other churches would like to merge into one centrally located office. This would include the Social Action group as well as a Food Bank for Eastern Kentucky. Tackett would be going to other meetings and would get back to the Board on any new information.

Adjournment was at 8:16 PM with closing prayer presented by Harold Tackett.

April 27, 1987

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Randy Wells and opening prayer was presented by Eva Johnston.

The following Board members were present: Grace Cassity, Scharlene and Jack Whidden, Neva and Tommy Griffith, Eva Johnston, Chlo Calvert, Mary Jane Bowne, N.C. Marsh, Ival Bryant, Jack Bizzel, Ann Buckner, Harold Holbrook, Alex Conyers, Marge Thomas, Randy Wells and Al Evans. Guest present were Linda Bryant, Fran Helphinstine, Mabel Reynolds and Harold Tackett.

Minutes: Were accepted as recored on motion by Jack Bizzel and seconded by Tommy Griffith.

Treasurer's Report: Alex discussed the new format that the treasurer's report was presented this evening. Discussion followed on the transfer of funds from various accounts. Alex noted that funds were placed in a deposit that was drawing 5.4% interest at this time. Noted that Safety of Deposit protection is a vital concern and explained to Board this type of protection.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Worship: presented by fran with a change of communion and offering will be revised for the next month. There will be Mother Day awards in May as the usual custom of the church. Noted that new Chrismons would be needed for the next Christmas Season and plans will be made to have procedures to make these items by September Dinner Meeting.

Christian Service: Grace Cassity noted that the Easter Offering was \$280 and would be held open for one or two more Sundays.

Social Action: Brief report presented by Elizabeth Anderson. Noted that this time the Human Concerns Office has more calls for assistance then ever before. Prgress was moving along to combine with other Church's Socail Action groups and noted that there will be an OPEN meeting when that time came.

Long Range Planning: Tommy reported that the architect was hired and should have a report shortly. Wireless Receivers were available for those needing them and that the air conditioner were installed and working on the third floor.

Living Memorial Fund: Harold mentioned the need for investment guidelines as well as the safety feature mention by Alex. Noted that the higher the interest rate, the greater the insecurity of the investment.

Property: Noted that the crack in the balcony will be repaired shortly. Mentioned that the church was in the best condition that it has been in several years. Renter above Steven Grote building will be moving out in May. Apartment was in poor shape and nneded work. All clothing store in Grote room will be moved to the Human Concern Office shortly. Brick house needs to be occupied by late

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June or insurance rates will go up. HCO Noted that they will be able to move at anytime. Discussion followed and was agree to wait to see what the architect would recommend.

CWF: Brief report by Mabel Reynolds.

ELDER'S REPORT: Had meeting at the Griffith's and discussed with the Worship Committee the new format for May. Noted that Communion and Offerring would be at end of Service during May. Recommend that the Deacons greet New Members and Visitors as the situation arises.

DEACON'S REPORT: Deacons for May are: Ron Walke, Charlie Tingle, Jean Hill, Jeannie Huie, Harold Holbrook and Dan Thomas.

MINISTER'S REPORT: Harold reported on a meeting of the community that was held at the church dealing with the location of the "Christian Church" home for the Morehead/Rowan County area. About 40 people were present and discussion followed. Reported that more or less 21 acres were held in a 6 month option near the new Church of God location and the new shopping Center by I-64. Zoning would be the big problem at this time. Several churches outside of Rowan County were at the meeting and about 100 names had been mentioned to occupy these residents/homes had been identified. Biggest issue at this time would be the re-zoning question.... Noted that a 6 month option had been secured at \$1,000/month and would be refunded if zoning could not be secured.

OLD BUSINESS: None discuss at this time.

NEW BUSINESS: What to do with the Grote Memorial room was discussed again. Building and room would be cleaned up as soon as possible. Ival Bryant asked if the Church will let its name be used in the Rowan County Church Softball League for 1987 at no cost to the Church. Motion made by Jack Whidden and seconded by Elmer that the Church name be used by Ival in the Softball League. Chair Randy Wells presented the following names to be members for the Nominating Committee of Elders and Deacons: J. Whidden, A. Buckner, C. Calvert, Susan Thomas, O. Teater (chair), Joyce Hart and Doug Thompson. Motion made by Jack W. to accept nominating committee as presented by Randy and Seconded by Ival motion passed. Committee report will be due next month. Eva Johnston mentioned that a new vacuum cleaner was needed at this time, and it was noted that the property committee already had approval to purchase a new one as soon as possible!!

Discussion also followed on the lawn care of the church property. Property committee was given permission to make a firm decision, have Youth Groups do the job or hire outside help. Noted that property will talk to youth group sponsors and get back with Board at next meeting.
