The William H. Natcher award is given by the Kentucky Library Association to an individual, organization, or corporation that has made a significant philanthropic contribution to Kentucky Libraries.

Dr. Jack Ellis was recently recognized as one of those individuals for his extensive collection, which he donated to the Rowan County Public Library.

"I'm just so proud and honored to be among the others awarded," said Ellis. "I look at the list and am blown away by the contributions others have been selected for. I'm so thankful for this recognition." Others who have re-

ceived the award include; Lucille Caudill Little, William T. Young Sr., Toyota Motor Manufacturing of North America, Inc., Ashland Inc., and Dan Groneck and the U.S. Bank Northern Kentucky Team. 





NOMINATION of DR. JACK D. ELLIS for the KENTUCKY LIBRARY ASSOCIATION WILLIAM H. NATCHER AWARD

Dr. Jack D. Ellis has spent most of his life collecting and compiling information about Morehead and Rowan County, Kentucky. Over the years, he has written articles and columns for The Morehead News about the history of Rowan County people, places, businesses, and historical events. In cooperation with the Jesse Stuart Foundation and as an independent author, he has written several books about Morehead and Rowan County: Morehead Memories: True Stories from Eastern Kentucky, Kentucky Memories: Reflections of Rowan County, 1856-2006, A Sesqui-Centennial Edition, Patriots & Heroes: Eastern Kentucky Soldiers of WWII; Alpha M. Hutchinson: The Biography of a Man and His Community, and, Missing Christmas: My Life in the Depression and World War II. Dr. Thomas Clark, a close friend of Dr. Ellis, wrote the introductions for both Morehead Memories and Kentucky Memories, saying: "The history of a county in Kentucky is little short of being a microcosm of the state itself. Dr. Jack Ellis has performed for Rowan County, Morehead, and the outlying communities an invaluable service."

On April 4, 2013, during a special joint meeting of the Rowan County Public Library Board of Trustees and the Rowan County Chamber of Commerce, Dr. Ellis officially donated his life's research to the Rowan County Public Library. The hundreds of files and audiovisual formats include photos, clippings, articles, announcements, and numerous other historical pieces. The Collection is even more valuable because most of the people and places are identified.

Because of the uniqueness and significance of the materials, and because of the extreme interest in accessibility to the Collection, the Kentucky Department for Libraries and Archives has been contracted to digitize the materials for inclusion in the online catalog of the Rowan County Public Library.
