KENTUCKY TEACHERS "GET A BREAK"

The year 1944 stands out as a landmark in the history of education in Kentucky. It will take its place with those other notable years that have been marked as milestones on the road to the realization of our educational ambitions.

1904—Establishment of the first State Normal Schools

1920—Passage of the County Superintendent's Law

1922—Two additional State Normal Schools provided

1934—Adoption of the present School Code

1938—Authorization of the Teacher Retirement System

1942—Passage of the Teacher Tenure Act
Adoption of the Equalization Amendment

1944—\$3,000,000 Retroactive Pay Appropriation
\$13,361,062.37 Per Capita Appropriation
\$1,500,000 Equalization Fund Appropriation
\$149,000 increase in the State's appropriation for the Retirement Fund

These increased appropriations are for the direct benefit of the teachers of Kentucky. The extra money is to be paid to them. The result will be to bring salary schedules more nearly in line with schedules found in the school systems, of other states and with pay scales in other lines of activity.

However, improved salaries for teachers will not guarantee more effective learning for the children attending the schools. The State, by paying better salaries to its teachers, hopes not only to correct an economic injustice but to improve its school system. Teachers, therefore, have an obligation.

The county school systems in the Morehead service area have 3,732 teachers and approximately 40 per cent of these teachers are now teaching on emergency permits. Neither is the general level of preparation what it should be. The salary situation is being improved. As a result, teachers should be in better position to secure additional training. If teachers meet this obligation, the State's additional investment in education will produce dividends.
