EVERY RAILROAD CROSSING-A DEATH TRAP

The Safety Bureau makes a report that we may all heed with misgivings. It says there were fifty percent more cross-ings deaths in November compared to that of October, at railroad crossings.

Why then, should fatalities increase? The answer is apparent at every grade crossing. Inadequate protection — protection which leans too much on the frailty of human senses. A warning is not necessarily a protection. There must be found some REAL protection for railroad crossings," the eau says
