Revision of Bylaws

- Whereas:** The Student Government Association Congress meets 12 times during the fall semester and 15 times during the spring semester,
- Whereas:** Each Student Government Association Committee meets 13 times during the fall semester and 15 times during the spring semester,
- Whereas:** The students of Morehead State University expect their representatives to attend meetings regularly to serve as their voice,
- Whereas:** Attendance of approximately 85% of all SGA meetings per semester is not only expected and reasonable, but it is also highly attainable,
- Whereas:** The Election Rules have inefficiencies that need to be addressed;

**Be it Proposed:** Article II be amended by the following  
Section 1.  
Attendance

- A. SGA attendance will be regulated as follows; a maximum of 4 absences total will be permitted.. This will include attendance to congress and committee meetings.
- B. The Executive Committee will notify SGA Congress members individually after their second absence. After the fourth absence, the Executive Committee will notify the member in question to allow them to resign.

**Be it Proposed:** Article V, Section 1, Subsection C of the SGA Bylaws is amended to say:

The election will be open during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

**Be it Proposed:** Article V, Section 3, Subsection B of the SGA Bylaws is amended to say:

There will be no campaigning on the day of the election except approximately 25 ft. on the sidewalk east of the Bell Tower beside University Boulevard and approximately 25 ft. on the sidewalk west of the Bell Tower facing the Combs/Lappin Building.

- IV. Suspended Business
  - a. Academic Audit with Provost Hughes
    - i. The audit is coming about because programs have just been added over the years without adapting to successes. The premise is student success.
    - ii. New & different programs are need to be 21<sup>st</sup> century (cutting edge, use technology, etc), quality, and to prepare students.
    - iii. The faculty own the programs, they mandate, develop, and implement curriculum.
    - iv. There are audit teams at the department levels, so changes that are made go through these teams.
    - v. Structural issues are being covered first.
    - vi. This is a process of continuous improvement.
    - vii. Faculty has until Nov. to provide pros/cons and alternative suggestions. Deans and Dept. Chairs will look at these and in February or March they will go to the President's cabinet.
    - viii. The program will take about 3 years to complete.
    - ix. This won't cause any changes to funding from the state.
    - x. Students that are currently enrolled will be honored for the courses, etc. that they have completed, and can complete programs that are to be removed.
