## ARMY NOW IN EFFECT

War Department Issues Instructions for the Guidance of Officials Concerned.

### GOVERNORS TO HAVE CHARGE

There was a time in the country's history when military emergency, beckoned by happenstance, went out among the people to take emergency measures. Today, under the principle of universal liability to military service, the people are called upon to perform their duty in the voting process.

The president is authorized to call upon all public officers to assist in the execution of the law. The plan is, however, to rely on the people for the proper execution of the law. It is expected that patriotic citizens will offer their services as registrars.

Such services will be gratefully acknowledged. Volunteers for this service should be contacted immediately with the proper official.

There was a time in the country's history when military emergency, beckoned by happenstance, went out among the people to take emergency measures. Today, under the principle of universal liability to military service, the people are called upon to perform their duty in the voting process.

The governor of each state is the chief of registration there. The majority of registration in each county is in the hands of the county clerk, and the county physician, acting ex officio, under a different board.

All persons within the age limits prescribed are required to present themselves for registration at the county clerk's office, or at the place designated by the governor.

The proportion of registrars shall be one for each 100 persons to be registered. Each state is to have a committee of one for each 100 persons to be registered.

For instance, all men between nineteen and twenty-five years of age, inclusive, are to be registered. The registrars would have to enroll about 7 per cent of the precinct population.

It is desirable to accept the services of competent volunteer registrars to serve without compensation. All registrars should be given the proper training.

The mayor of a city containing more than 30,000 inhabitants, or the officials designated by the governor, shall, with approval of the governor, appoint for each ward or convenient subdivision containing about 20,000 people one registration board, and shall designate the members of each board to perform duties similar to those imposed on the sheriff, as heretofore outlined.

If the mayor desires, he may appoint a central board to co-ordinate the work of the boards. Duties of County Clerks, and of Clerks of Cities of Over 30,000 People.

On the fifth day after the president has issued his proclamation, clerks of counties and cities of over 30,000 must secure a supply of blanks and copies of the registration regulations from the sheriff or from the mayor. Absentees and the sick will apply to such clerks to have their registration cards filled out. In case small such persons are given registration certificates. They are to be instructed by the clerk that the burden is on them to see to it that the cards reach the registrars of their respective precincts.

### FEWER WOMAN WORKERS

High Wages Are Responsible for More Marriages, According to One Authority.

Difficulty in securing sufficient labor, has been one of the greatest of the many problems with which the many manufacturers have been confronted during the past year and a half. Since the first of the year the supply of male labor has become better, but there is still a great dearth of female workers.

In the manufacture of many goods there are some processes in which girls are used almost exclusively. Small and simple fingers are required. Up to the end of the year 1916 there was a plentiful supply of female help for factory work, but thereafter the supply became inadequate to meet the demand.

Manufacture plants went into the market for female workers and did not hesitate to offer higher wages than were being paid elsewhere. This lured large numbers of girls away from other parts of the country. It has been estimated that there are actually less women working at these tasks today than formerly. The young men have been earning wages better by far than formerly received, and this is not considered. As a result the girls are marrying faster.

Moreover, many girls who went into the factories because the family earnings were not sufficient to keep them in school or at home, are now again taking up their studies or home duties because the wages of the father have increased sufficiently. — Electrical World.

Richness and Poverty. The extent to which poverty in New York city is caused by sickness and the results is shown in the statistics for the fiscal year ended September 30 of 1916.

For improving the condition of the poor, out of \$150,000 spent for material relief for destitute families in their own homes, \$150,000, or approximately 50 per cent, was used to families whose "cause of need" was the sickness or death of the wage-earner.

"Causes of poverty dealt with other than sickness and its result," says the report. "The causes of poverty and unemployment, such as those mentioned, produced a small but not insignificant number of cases as compared with sickness and its consequences."

estimates based on growth since the census of 1910. It would create an army of 991,250 in addition to the regular army and would be the national guard. Should the initial call be for only 500,000 men, then, the balance of the army would, of course, be cut in half.

Each State a Unit.  
Between the call for registration and the date of its opening there will be a period of 12 days, during which the machinery for its work will be organized by the various states, counties and municipalities, including election boards, police and sheriffs, forces and volunteers, and the like. The plan contemplates that the enrollment will be completed in five days, and ten days later the first day of the strike upon the Government. Each state is to make its return through the Secretary of State, the Governor being the recognized head of the state system.

The general call in the bill, by which by law, and everybody will have to take his chance in the drawing after the drawing, then the names are drawn will be made to be examined first for physical qualifications and then for moral and political fitness. The names will be drawn to make up the first class of the army, and the second class will be drawn to make up the second class of the army.

The general exemption is: "Those not morally or physically fit; those members of a recognized religious sect or creed which forbids its members participating in war; ministers of the gospel; mail carriers; employees in navy yards, arsenals or military establishments of the Government; and persons in industries the operation of which are necessary to the military establishment, such as munition factories, etc." This also extends to persons the department finds necessary to agriculture as well.

Persons exempted will be given a service button and papers to show that they are a part of the industrial or agricultural service, but the exemption lasts only while they actually are needed. They might be called in for military training if their service in industry or agriculture no longer exists. Persons where it is clearly shown that they are not needed behind also will be exempt under rules to be laid down.

**Rule To Marriage.**  
But there probably has been a misconception as to the exemption of married men. This will not mean that those who have no more vital plan than that they are married. There must be a wife or children or other actually dependent upon them for their living and who would be rendered destitute or helpless through their going into the army. The word "man" who whose wife is not actually dependent upon his labor for sustenance is not to be exempted on the plea that he is married.

Proper penalties are provided for those who seek to escape registration and the police and sheriffs will take up the business of rounding up such shirkers for the prescribed punishment.
