"So well are we convinced that the final subjugation of Mexico is inevitable, that we predict the movement of a resolution, at the opening of Congress, declaring that Mexico is territory of the United States by right of conquest, and we further predict the passage of such a resolution by an overwhelming majority. It seems to us that it is the only way to cut the Gordian knot, which the Executive has tied for the nation."

"THE WHOLE OF MEXICO IS UPON US. It is already ours. We have it and we know it. Had we a man in the Executive Chair, had we men in the Departments—how different would be the conduct of the American Government. The universal voice give up conquered Mexico—shall we agree to the terms which the vanquished in his weakness prescribed? Shall we confess ourselves conquered? Shall we forego the American people's proud claims in a shout of thunder—NO!"

He was a bold man, who first suggested the conquest and subjugation to our Government, of the vast Territory of Mexico—people with many millions of semi-barbaric people. Yet it was the boldness which takes possession of a spirit, reckless of consequences; and not the loftier courage of a hero, who dare sustain the right—under the very shadow of an impending avalanche, of prejudice and error.

But that step has been taken; and there are doubtless many—very many, who will ever long entice themselves to the vulgar mire of following a bad example. New issues are springing up with each turn of the political Kaleidoscope—The old land marks of party are being rapidly obliterated; and even the sacred barriers of the Constitution itself are being broken down, by the Vandalsism of the modern "progressives." Nor are the political sins of those, who set themselves up as teachers of the people, rebuked as they should be, by the sentiments upon the watch towers of liberty, who know that every breach in the sacred walls of the Constitution becomes a loop hole from which to point Executive cannon; in any further contest; that usurpations of authority lose interest, in proportion to their frequency; that he who sins according to precedent, commits but a venial offence, if any at all, in the estimation of those, whose patriotism is measured by their blind adherence to party.

Such has been the terror of our reflections, whose contemplating the developments of the last few weeks, upon the subject of our war with Mexico, and its consequences—Could Nations, like individuals, be permitted to address the throne of the omnipotent, through the genius of their institutions; what so appropriate a petition for the American Republic, as "Lead me not into temptation." Mr. Polk has so managed the affairs of the Union in the conduct of our intercourse with Mexico, that it requires the exercise of the purest principles of National morality; to keep from doing wrong—He has exceeded the organs of acquiescence and combatsiveness upon the National Crucian both at once, and endangered not only our national character abroad, but our internal Peace and harmony at home, by presenting to the nation, the alternatives, of a total abandonment of the half gathered fruits of—expensive and bloody war, on the one hand—or the annexation of her immense territory, with its incidental questions, on the other.

The extract which precedes the foregoing remarks, is presented to our readers, as a specimen of its kind, peculiarly striking because it is found in a paper, which sports the name of "Whig" at its mast-head, and which is certainly opposed to the general policy of Mr. Polk's Administration.
