MOREHEAD, Ky. --- Morehead State University's Eagle basketball team will try to break a four-game losing streak Thursday at the Murray State Racers visit Wetherby Gym.

The Eagles, 5-4 on the season and 0-1 in the Ohio Valley Conference, jumped to a 5-1 start, but have lost four straight on the road, including a 64-57 contest at Middle Tennessee Saturday in MSU's OVC opener.

Coach Wayne Martin's charges took a 34-33 halftime lead over the Blue Raiders and held a 49-46 lead with 8:55 remaining. MTSU rallied to hand MSU its initial conference loss of the season.

Center Jeff Tipton, Ashland freshman, led the Eagle attack with 13 points and five rebounds. Norris Beckley, Shelbyville junior, added 12 points while Eddie Childress, Muncie, Ind. sophomore, had 11.

Against Murray State, MSU will face an opponent that was particularly tough last season. The Racers downed the Eagles three times last year, including an overtime contest in the first round of the OVC playoffs.

The Racers are led by junior forward Kenny Hammonds and sophomores Lamont Sleets and Glen Green. Coach Ron Greene's squad had a 4-4 overall slate entering action Monday night at Towson State.

Glenn Napier, Hazard junior, continues to lead the Eagles in scoring with a 16.3 point per game average, with Beckley and Childress also in double figures at 13.4 and 11.1 respectively.

In rebounding, Beckley leads the squad with an average of 5.6 grabs per game, with Childress adding 4.9 rebounds per game and Tipton and Greg Coldiron, Loyal junior, averaging 3.9 per contest.

In the most recent statistics released by the NGAA, Napier ranked eighth in the nation in free throw percentage, hitting on 32 of 33 attempts for .970 percent. Since those figures were released, the 6-3 junior has extended his streak to 24 consecutive free throws and a season total of 37 of 38 for a mark of .974 percent.

Following the Murray State clash, the Eagles face another stern OVC test as they host the Austin Peay Governors of Coach Ron Bargatze.

APSU opened OVC play with a 67-64 win over Tennessee Tech in Clarksville Saturday night.

Tipoff for both contests is 7:30 p.m. EST.

MOREHEAD, Ky. --- Following an 89-70 home court loss to Murray State, Coach Wayne Martin's Morehead State University Eagles put together two consecutive wins, including the team's first road victory of the year.

Saturday night, the Eagles used hot shooting to down Austin Peay 86-75, hitting a season high 64.1 percent on 34 of 53 field goal attempts.

Glenn Napier, Hazard junior, led MSU with 20 points, while Jeff Tipton, Ashland freshman, added a career high 15 points, Greg Coldiron, Loyal junior, had 12 and John Solomon, Rahway, N.J., added 11.

Against the University of Charleston Monday, MSU again relied on shooting accuracy, as the Eagles connected on 28 of 51 shots for 54.9 percent.

Eddie Childress, Muncis, Ind. sophomore, led the MSU attack with 17 points and all rebounders with eight. Other Eagles in double figures were Napier with 14 points, Coldiron 12 and Tipton 10.

Now 7=5 on the season and 1-2 in Ohio Valley Conference action, MSU enters what could be termed a "crucial" part of the schedule, as OVC action gets into full swing.

Following a home encounter with the University of Akron on Thursday, the Eagles go on the road for games at Tennessee Tech Saturday, Eastern Kentucky on Jan. 22 and Western Kentucky on Jan. 24.

Aside from the OVC race, the spotlight has been on the free throw shooting of Napier.

Through the Eagles' first 12 games, the 6-3 guard has hit on 54 of 55 for 98.2 percent, good enough for national leadership.

Napier is also approaching an MSU and OVC record, as he has hit on 41 consecutive free throw attempts. His only miss of the season came in the first half of the Tennessee State game in the finals of MSU's McDonalds Eagle Classic.

The mark for consecutive free throws is 42, held by former MSU All-American Harold Sergent, who set the record during the 1964-65 season.

The national record for consecutive free throws is 60, set by Bob Lloyd of Rutgers during the 1966-67 season.

six Bass Fishing Institutes on April 4 and 5.

Sessions will focus on eight areas of concern to the fisherman including conservation, seasonal patterns, balanced tackle and casting techniques, lures, structure and pattern fishing, depth finders, sounders, locators and graphs, rivers and streams, reservoirs, natural lakes, strip pits and farm ponds.

Also to be discussed are lure techniques with instructors demonstrating the speed, depth and action of particular lures in a 3,500-gallon simulator to show how particular lures work over and around different kinds of structures.

There will also be special areas including a youth casting area and manufacturers' display with more than 50 manufacturers of fishing equipment represented.

"Many people have the mistaken feeling that this is just for the club or tournament type fishermen," said Harry Ryan, coordinator of campus events at MSU. "But, the Bass Institute really stresses family involvement which is apparent by last year's combined totals of participants which showed that approximately 20 percent were women and 12 percent were youth."

He continued:

"So, the institute is really family oriented and is not just for the tournament fishermen, but the weekend fishermen and the fishermen who fish from the bank."

MOREHEAD, Ky. --- A 66-51 loss to the nationally-ranked Kentucky Lady Kats closed out the 1980-81 regular season for Coach Mickey Wells and the Morehead State University Lady Eagles, but a tie for the runner-up position in the Kentucky Women's Intercollegiate Conference (KWIC) sent MSU into post-season action.

Entering the play-offs with a 15-14 record, the Lady Eagles defeated Northern Kentucky University in the opening round 97-83.

Robin Harmon, Lovely junior, scored a game high 31 points and Martha Rust, Southgate sophomore, pulled down 12 rebounds.

The Lady Eagles advanced to the final round of play against Eastern Kentucky University and recorded an 83-72 win. Donna Stephens, Cynthiana junior, was the game's top scorer with 23 while Harmon and Lynn Miley; Sarahsville, Ohio freshman, each added 16.

MSU ends the season at 17-14 overall, 8-6 in the KWIC behind Kentucky (12-0) and 3-3 in the Ohio Valley Conference.

Several Lady Eagle records fell during the season including three to Whick junior guard Irene Moore who broke the mark for most assists in a single game with 12. The record was previously held by Susann Brown during the 1976-77 season with 11. Moore clipped her own mark later in the season with 15 assists and rounded out her assault on the record in the KWIC play-off game with Northern when she handed out 16 assists.

Moore also ended the season with 178 assists to break the season record of 127 held by teammate Harmon. Moore also broke her own record of free throw accuracy with .868, clipping her previous mark of .814.

The 1980-81 season saw two Lady Eagles join the 1,000-point scoring club with Harmon reaching the mark on the road against Eastern Kentucky and teammate Stephens reaching the mark at Marshall University.

Coach Mickey Wells will lose four players to graduation including Debbie and Dorothy Burk of Warsaw, Loretta Hummeldorf of Morning View and Connie Ryan of Hillsboro, Ohio.

The Lady Eagles will have four juniors return for their senior campaign next year including record-setters Irene Moore, Robin Harmon and Donna Stephens. Frances Moore of Booneville will also be closing her MSU career next season.

Included in a six-game winning streak were a doubleheader sweep of Anderson College by 2-1 and 19-0 scores, a 10-0 win over the University of Kentucky in Lexington and three wins over Purdue.

The Eagles managed 5-4, 6-5 and 6-4 wins over the Boilermakers before dropping a 9-6 decision in the second game of a twin-bill.

One of the main reasons for the reversal in form is the play of junior outfielder Glenn Jones.

The Frankfort High School product is currently hitting at a .560 clip on 28 of 50 at the plate, and has hit safely in all of MSU's 14 games. Jones has also hit with power, slamming five home runs, including three in the UK game.

Other Eagle offensive leaders are junior Jamey Bennett with a .365 batting average and five home runs; senior John Combs with a .357 average; freshman Joe Mitchell with four home runs and junior Mark Davis with three home runs, all against Purdue.

Another big reason for the turnaround has been the performance of the Eagle pitchers.

During the six-game streak, MSU pitchers allowed only 10 earned runs in 48 innings, for an earned run average of 1.88. Including the 9-6 loss to Purdue, the staff ERA is 3.11 since returning from the spring trip.

One of the surprises of the young season has been the pitching performance of senior lefthander Mark Molitor in the starting rotation.

Troubled by a back injury most of last season, Molitor has compiled a 2-1 record and allowed only three earned runs in 25 innings for a 1.08 ERA.

Two other pitchers that have recorded wins are junior Mike Mattox and freshman Ricky Layne.

Mattox currently is 2-2, but has won his last two decisions on complete-game performances. Layne, 2-1 on the year, has posted wins over Mississippi and Kentucky and has a 2.35 ERA in 15 1/3 innings of work.

The other Eagle hurler to record a win is junior Glenn Napier, who downed Purdue Saturday for his first decision of the season.

The Eagles open play in the Northern Division of the Ohio Valley Conference Saturday, hosting one of the hottest teams in the league, Eastern Kentucky, in a 1 p.m. doubleheader at Allen Field.
