European Intelligence.

The dates brought by the French steam, lately arrived at New York, are from Paris and Havre of the 9th ultimo, London of the 8th, and Calcutta of the 14th August. We make the following extracts from the New York Commercial Advertiser...

M. DE HUMBOLDT has recovered from his illness, and goes to Paris to spend the winter.

The Earl of Dalmezzo arrived in London on the 7th, on his way to Calcutta, to assume the duties of Governor-General. DRABEADUL ACCIDENT AT BRISTOL. An unusually painful accident was witnessed in the case of a young lady, named Welsh, having fallen over St. Vincent's rocks, at the highest point.

After this she was standing at a great distance from the edge of the precipice, but that, however, she could speedily returned. Of course the mode in which the accident occurred must remain a matter of conjecture, but it is probable, the grass being short and the weather very slippery, that in walking she missed her footing and slipped over an altitude of more than three hundred feet. Some men, who were working at the bottom of the precipice, seeing her fall she stretched out her hands and tried to grasp some dry bushes which grew from the cliff. The effort was, however, a futile one; in another moment she struck against a rock, and in a trice fell to the bottom of the precipice.

IRELAND. The county of Tipperary was in a state of great disorder, the property being pillaged by murders and other outrages. A Mr. Roe, of Rockwell, a magistrate of the county, was shot at noonday, receiving eleven wounds, two of them in the arms, and proving instantly mortal. The murderer had not been discovered. The only supposed reason for the murder is, that Mr. Roe had evicted some tenantry.

RUSSIA. The Cholera.—Private letters from St. Petersburg of the 24th of September say that the cholera continued to advance, and rapidly by the 25th of the month. It arrived in 1831. It had reached the environs of Toula, (distant forty miles from Moscow.) Its intensity differed according to the localities. As formerly, the greater number of victims belonged to the classes of the lower orders; but it also attacked persons in easy circumstances.

ITALY. Whether it is that the movement in Italy is subsiding, or that the probability of it is so great, and the chances of conflict are losing consistence, certain it is that the Paris powers, who have received quite much less space to the subject than was allotted to it in former publications. We quote such paragraphs as we find: FROM THE JOURNAL DES DEBATS. The news from Italy, which we have just received, is favorable. The affairs of the peninsula have become more tranquil, and the cause of pacific reforms is every day making progress.

Government News.—Semi-official. Correspondence of the Philadelphia "Public Ledger." WASHINGTON, NOVEMBER 1, 1847.

Up to this moment we are yet without official dispatches from Gen. Scott. Though their contents have been anticipated by letters from other distinguished officers of the army, we should like to see the report of the commander-in-chief. How matters were conducted, and what prospects we have in future.

The Congress which is to meet at Quebec, may or may not think of offering an amendment, but it is quite certain that the active war is at an end, and that no small army will be opposed by large bodies of troops. As the central government of Mexico is destroyed, and the most valuable property has fallen into our hands, a guerrilla war, which itself a means of producing and perpetuating anarchy, is all that we have to prepare against, and this is most likely we will be able to do with very little cost.

The Brussels papers of October 3, makes comment upon an alleged cessation of diplomatic intercourse between the Courts of Belgium and Rome. M. Leclercq, the Belgian Ambassador, having resigned, for which various reasons are assigned, so no contradiction is intelligible, but the only proper general ignorance on the subject. All agree, however, that there has been a breach between the Ambassador and the Pope, but whether personal, or of a man or of a sign origin, seems to be an unsettled question.

AUSTRIA. The Emperor of Austria has recently issued a decree revoking the Diet of Hungary for the 7th of November next, in order to effect the election of a new Palatine and other important business.

SWITZERLAND. The Government of Lucerne has put upon active duty all the regular troops and the militia of that canton. The Grand Council of Schaffhausen has adopted, by a vote of 65 to 9, the instructions offered by the permanent committee of the Diet against the execution of the decree of the Diet against the Sonderbund and the Jesuits.
