Whereas, We, the citizens of Breathitt county, deeply deplore the fact that the people of the tobacco districts have brought disgrace and reproach upon the fair name of our belowed State, and although we've been deeply maligned in days past we desire to go upon record as deploring and condemning the state of lawlessness ex-isting in the Blue Grass and the Black Patch therefore, be it

Resolved, 1st. That we tender to the people of the tobacco district our deepest sympathy and condemn the lawlessness of those responsible for

it; and that we will co-operate with them in any reader as a second second market with the fair name of our belowed Kentucky. 2nd. That these resolutions be published in the Jackson Democrat and the Breathitt County News and that all Kentucky papers be requested to copy.






