Still Tariff on Paper

The tenth of May has been decided upon as the final day of the long session of the sixtieth Congress and this means, of course, that the legislation which the President and the Democratic minority in the House are so desirous of having enacted will be abandoned.

Urges Stringent Legislation

The President has this week sent another brief message to Congress urging additional legislation for the suppression of anarchism. There is however little hope for legislative action to this end.

Four More Battleships

It will be remembered that the President asked for appropriations for four battle ships of the most powerful class. The House has voted for only two battle ships but has failed to appropriate for the other two.

An International Disturbance

Attracting even more attention than the Presidential contest are the foreign questions in which the United States is becoming involved. The first of these is of course, the consular question in Harbin, Manchuria.

Mrs. Elenor Glynn Barred

The action of Speaker Cannon, the prince of "Stand Patters" in "letting Congress" intrude into the "Paper Trust" is more than sig-

nificant. The Speaker has stood against tariff revision like the "Rock of Gibraltar" and heretofore he has proved unswerving. But "Uncle Joe" would rather see some modifications of the tariff this session, than to see the Speaker's chair filled by John Sharp Williams in the next Congress.

The Shadow of the Blue Grass.

At a mass meeting recently held at Jackson the following resolutions were adopted which shows the name in store for poor old Kentucky.

Whereas, A state of anarchy, lawlessness and a reign of terror exists throughout the central and western sections of our State, known as the tobacco belt, and

Whereas, People from other States, being afraid to pass through the lawless Blue Grass and Black Patch, are kept from Breathitt and other law abiding mountain counties thereby hindering us in the development of our natural resources, and

Whereas, We, the citizens of Breathitt county, deeply deplore the fact that the people of the tobacco districts have brought disgrace and reproach upon the fair name of our beloved State, and although we've been deeply maligned in days past we desire to go upon record as deploring and condemning the state of lawlessness existing in the Blue Grass and the Black Patch, therefore, be it

Resolved, Ist. That we tender to the people of the tobacco district our deepest sympathy and condemn the lawlessness of those responsible for it; and that we will cooperate with them in any effort to suppress the same, and to restore the fair name of our beloved Kentucky.

2nd. That these resolutions be published in the Jackson Democrat and the Breathitt County News and that all Kentucky papers be requested to copy."

The opposition to Taft seems about to collapse, sixty days ahead of the national convention. Even the States where "favorite sons" were developed for the purpose of holding back popular expressions in favor of Taft are joining the Taft column.

Taft's Opposition Disappearing.

Indiana is for Taft. Out of courtesy to the Vice President a delegation will present the name of Fairbanks, but it will hardly live through the first ballot.

Illinois is even less devoted to Cannon. The Cannon nomination has never interested even the citizens of Illinois. There is a friendly feeling to the speaker, though it is waning because of his arbitrary action in the chair.

In New York the people want Taft nominated, and those that most heartily support Gov. Hughes in the work he has done as the chief executor of the empire State are Taft men. Hughes was taken up by the enemies of the Roosevelt administration for the purpose of dividing the followers of the administration in New York and not for the purpose of honoring Gov. Hughes.

The enemies of the administration in New England, led by Senator Crane, of Massachusetts, sixty days ago were declaring that New England would go to the convention solidly opposed to the administration, yet in Massachusetts two thirds of the delegates are for Taft and would have been instructed for Taft had not Senator Lodge joined with Senator Crane in urging the convention to leave the delegation uninstructed as the best means of promoting harmony.

The New York State Committee, anti-Bryan has voted itself a perpetual tenure of office. It does not propose to have the Democrats of the Empire State enfranchised. In that it is much like the Democratic Committee in Kentucky. And that is what is the matter with the Democratic party. It fears to face the people.
