FINANCIAL AFFAIRS.

The pillars were covered with gilt, and the ceiling of Napoleon's victories, Austrelitz, Waterloo, &c., and on each side of the pillars were three large oil colored pictures. From the door of entrance up the rails of the choir were placed a number of enormous candelabras, twelve or fourteen feet high, from which issued brilliant colored flames.

The choir and dome, which form perhaps more than half the church, separated from the nave by a flight of steps, were filled with purple and gold. At the summit, and brilliantly lighted by hundreds of candles, in the centre of the choir, in front of the altar, was erected an immense altar, covered with a cloth in gilded wood of the tomb that is to be erected in marble, supported by four pillars and surmounted by a canopy with outspreading wings. At 1 o'clock the cannon announced the departure of the King for the Tuilleries, and at 1:30 the Prince de Joinville, with the four hundred members of the Belle Poul, remarkably handsome in his military uniform, headed by the Archbishop of Paris, waited at the arrival of the body. This was decidedly the most magnificent and splendid ceremony; the steps leading up to the choir and on both sides with troops, and all down the centre of the steps and part of the aisle, the Emperor's flag, and again religious music, awaiting the entrance of the cortege.
