The motion was taken up, and was under consideration. At our latest issue, the Treasury Note bill had not been disposed of in the House of Representatives.

The **North Carolina Banks** were expected to resume specie payments, upon receipt of intelligence of the resumption in Maryland and Virginia.

Amulation has passed the House of Representatives of the Kentucky Legislature, setting the 18th of the present month as the day of final adjournment.—It is thought the Senate will concur.

Messrs. EXPOSITION—A report reached here yesterday, via Cincinnati, that the Pennsylvania Bank of the United States, after a short period of resumption, had again been forced to suspend specie payments. The people have lost confidence in its solvency, and if the report is true, the famous regulator of currency will scarcely ever be able to stand upon its legs again. She is, and has been for some time, irrevocably and hopelessly bankrupt.

The votes for President and Vice President of the United States, were to have been opened in the presence of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, on yesterday the 10th inst.

The **PAE-FRONTION BILL**. This important measure finally passed the Senate on Tuesday, the 2nd inst. The amendments to the bill were made by Mr. Crittenden, taking upon him the view of delaying it, a proposition to discontinue the proceeds of the public lands under the states, was lost by a decided majority.
