RE: Quarterly Report on Proposals Submitted and Funded 1985-86

Attached is the Quarterly Report on Proposals Submitted and Funded for the period ending June 30, 1986. From July 1, 1985 through June 30, 1986, the faculty and staff of Morehead State University submitted 97 proposals totaling \$4,797,279 to external agencies. Forty-two (42) grants and contracts totaling \$1,849,119 were awarded during this period.

It is important to note that as of June 30, 1986, 39 proposals are pending final action by external agencies. Based on preaward negotiations of pending proposals, the Office of Research, Grants and Contracts is projecting a total of 75 grants and contracts totaling approximately \$3,337,275 will be awarded to Morehead State University for the 1985-86 fiscal year. This projection will represent an award rate of 77.3 percent of the submissions and 69.5 percent of the dollars requested.

The final results of the University's grant and contract activity for 1985-86 will not be known until notification is received on the pending proposals. Thus, the Final Report on Proposals Submitted and Funded in 1985-86 will be published by the Office of Research, Grants and Contracts in early 1987.
