From July 1, 1984 through June 30, 1985, the faculty and staff of Morehead State University submitted 127 proposals totaling \$4,568,637 to external agencies. Ninety-one (91) grants and contracts totaling \$2,795,584 were awarded during this period. A breakdown by major administrative unit is reflected below:
