Personal Address

To the Voters of Carter County

McGone, Ky., Nov. 30, '08. To the Voters of Carter County: Dear sirs:—

As I am a candidate for the office of County Court Clerk of Carter County and being unable to see you all in person and talking my race over with you, I take this method of consulting you.

I am a poor man. I have spent all I have made in qualifying myself, until I could make a living for my family; now that I have done this, let's reason the case.

1st. Let us take the present Clerk, James Fultz. I will say he is a gentleman, but he is an able-bodied man, has run two races before this and has been honored with the office for four years, has made something like ten thousand dollars out of it. He told the people he would never ask for it again if elected; has he stuck to his word? Again, he draws a large pension sufficient to keep up his family as long as he lives. Whether rain or shine, sick or well, the Government will continue to pay him. Isn't this better than an office? I think so. Then is it not fair to change things around.

2d. We will consider Sam V. Wilcox. He is an able-bodied man; has made two races for an office before the people before this one, was elected to the office of Supt. once. Though he is a

gentleman so far as I know, only give us all a show.
