The coalition against Walker is more ex-  
tensive than is generally supposed. Not only  
all the States of Central America, but Vene-

ally, British influence being paramount in  
Costa Rica.

Case in State Standard

A question of considerable political interest  
and importance has lately been decided in the  
U. S. Supreme Court, and which is fully reported  
in the last number of *Worrell's U. S. Re-  
port of Court Reports*. The decision was made  
in an opinion of the court of Justice, which  
was induced from Federal Right, grounds  
for consideration. A majority of the Con-  
federate judges out of nine—submitted the appeal  
of the opinion of the court, which was delivered  
by Justice Wayne of Georgia, distinctly and  
emphatically denies the doctrine of State  
Rights, or the right of peaceful secession, as  
exposed by South Carolina, Virginia, and  
other Southern Democrats. From a summary  
of the case, New York Evening Post, it  
appears that one Walker, a citizen of the Com-  
munity Branch of Ohio, filed a bill in the U. S.  
Circuit Court against the directors of the State  
Bank, with whom, to injure them by paying a State  
tax, which he and they deemed illegal, but to  
which they were disposed to submit. The de-  
fendants contended that the question was one  
of State policy, and, that the United States  
had no jurisdiction in the premises.

The plea was overruled in the Court, however,  
and an appeal was taken to the Supreme Court. Here  
the parties insisted again that the Supreme  
Court of the United States had no jurisdiction  
over the case, and that it was a ques-  
tion of State sovereignty, for which  
State tribunals fulfilled all the remedies that  
any stockholder was entitled to. The plea was  
overruled, six out of nine of the Judges con-  
curring in their jurisdiction.

Judge Wayne, in the opinion adopted by the  
Court, thus explicitly defines the constitutional  
relationship between the General Gov-  
ernment and the States:

The Dept. of state of the government are  
legislative, executive and judicial. They are  
concerned in degree to the extent of the powers  
delegated to them, and in extent of the exercise  
of its power is independent of the people, but all  
rightfully done by either, is binding upon the  
people. The Constitution is supreme  
of itself, and, the people who ratified it  
may have made it so; constitutionality  
which may be done unauthorized by it, is valid,  
but it is not only over the departments of  
the government, but it is also over the people  
themselves, for it is the people who have  
delegated power, over all who made themselves  
representatives, and the persons, within those  
representatives, who have accepted the  
trust of the people, of the States, when they accepted  
the Constitution, their conventions. Nor does  
it affect the people of the United States, but  
their separate sovereignties, because they have ex-  
cluded themselves from any direct or immediate  
relation with it; and it did; and record that amend-  
ments should be made representative for them by the Congress of the  
United States, &c.
