THE WESTERN REVIVAL

The time was August in the year 1801. The place was this very spot. Here were gathered at least 15,000 (some say 25,000) men, women, and children for the largest and most significant religious camp meeting ever held in America.

"Men who approached the scene reported that the noise was louder than Niagara, audible, upon a favoring wind, for miles through the forest. One said it was the loudest, most awesome and terrifying sound ever heard on the North American Continent; another, that he could feel it strike through his head and smash into the tree trunks behind him."

"At a distance the sound was all roar and confusion, but as one came near its components could be distinguished. The voices of thousands of human beings raised in chants and psalms, in incoherent screaming, in endlessly repeated shouts of Jesus! Jesus! or Glory! Glory! If it was not the loudest sound ever heard on the continent, it could well have been the most awesome, and -- for all that it was the praise of the Lord -- the most frightening."

"The Cane Ridge meeting lasted six days and six nights. In the darkness so many torches hung from the trees, the forest appeared to be on fire. And in a figurative sense it was. The American frontier in the year 1801 had begun to blaze with the Western Revival."


