

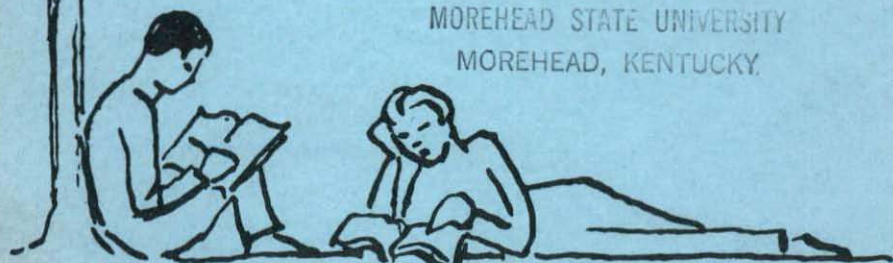

REFUNDS

The work in English 416G will consist of reading through linguistics and will include literary, compositional, and grammatical elements. If the student is qualified to take English 596, the entire range of English, literature and non-literature, will be treated from a presentation point of view, with methods and techniques involving audio-visual materials.
