### PART-TIME FEES

The Registration Fee for undergraduate students who are residents of Kentucky and enrolled for less than twelve hours of work during a regular semester is \$9.00 per semester hour. This fee for out-of-state students is \$23.00 per semester hour.

The Registration Fee for graduate students who are residents of Kentucky and enrolled for less than nine hours of work during a regular semester is \$12.00 per semester hour. This fee for out-of-state students is \$30.00 per semester hour.

All students enrolling for more than six hours during a semester are required to pay the regular Incidental Fee.

### OTHER EXPENSES

The University maintains a modern cafeteria and grill in the Doran Student House and food may be purchased at reasonable rates.

Books and necessary supplies may be secured at the University Bookstore. Prices on these items are held at a minimum.

Consult the Catalog for special fees for late registration, change of schedule, private instruction in music, and graduation.

### REFUNDS

Refunds of fees will be made as follows:

A student withdrawing during the first week of school will be refunded 75 per cent of his fees.

A student withdrawing within the first three weeks of school will be refunded 50 per cent of his fees.

No refunds will be made after the first three weeks of school.

As you enter the gymnasium you will notice blue boards for each school. This will indicate the courses which are closed. Please check these boards to see if the courses you have scheduled have been closed. ### DIRECTIONS FOR REGISTRATION

For Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate Students

READ CAREFULLY: The University reserves the right to revise this schedule in any way that seems desirable.

STEP 1. Undergraduate students go to the office of the Dean of the School offering their first major or area for advising. Graduate students report to their advisers or, for the assignment of a temporary adviser, to one of the following according to their program:

Students undecided about their major will report to Baird Music Hall at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 12 for advising.

The following materials will be obtained by the student at the time of advisement:

- (a) Registrar's card
- (b) Student information card
- (c) Program of student's card

Fill in the information requested on all of the cards except the class schedule on the White Registrar's Card and the schedule on the Student Information Card which will be completed when you register. All blanks should be completed in ink. The Student Information Card is to be signed by your adviser before entering the Laughlin Building for registration.

Special permission must be secured to carry a student load of 18 hours at the undergraduate level. Sixteen hours of course work is considered a normal load. A minimum load for full-time students is twelve hours for undergraduates and nine hours for graduates.

### GRADUATE RECORD EXAMINATIONS

Graduate students who have not taken all three sections (aptitude, area, and advanced) of the Graduate Record Examination (G.R.E.) must register for the exam(s) with the Morehead State University Testing Bureau on, or before, the day of registration.

### ADMISSION TO GRADUATE STUDY

Students who have not been admitted to graduate study at Morehead State University, but who expect to enroll in the 1967 Fall semester are urged to complete application procedures not later than August 9, 1967.



## ADMISSION TO GRADUATE STUDY CONT'D

A student who appears for registration without having been admitted to graduate study must present to the Dean of Graduate Programs an official transcript (bearing the raised seal of the institution) of all undergraduate work, before his application can be considered. In most cases, late applicants who qualify may be granted "temporary admission" but may not enroll in 500 & 600 level courses.

### PREREQUISITES FOR GRADUATE CREDIT IN 300 AND 400 COURSES

Not all of the courses numbered in the 300's and 400's may be taken for graduate credit. However, graduate credit may be earned in 300 and 400 courses followed by the letter "G" provided the student has certain undergraduate preparation in the field. The minimum undergraduate requirements in the several fields of study are as follows:

AGRICULTURE - Twelve hours of credit in agriculture and course prerequisites.

ART - Eighteen hours of credit in art and course prerequisites.

EDUCATION - Nine hours of credit in education and course prerequisites.

ENGLISH - Eighteen hours of credit in English and course prerequisites.

BUSINESS - Eighteen hours of credit in business and course prerequisites.

SPEECH - Eighteen hours of credit in English and Speech, including six hours in speech, and course prerequisites.

DRAMATIC ART - Eighteen hours of credit in English and dramatic art, including six hours in dramatic art, and course prerequisites.

HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION - Eighteen hours of credit in health and physical education and course prerequisites.

HOME ECONOMICS - Twelve hours of credit in home economics and course prerequisites.

INDUSTRIAL ARTS - Eighteen hours of credit in industrial arts and course prerequisites.

MUSIC - Eighteen hours of credit in music and course prerequisites.

\*ECONOMICS - Twelve hours of credit in economics and course prerequisites.

\*GEOGRAPHY - Twelve hours of credit in geography and course prerequisites.

\*HISTORY - Twelve hours of credit in history and course prerequisites.

\*POLITICAL SCIENCE - Twelve hours of credit in political science and course prerequisites.

\*SOCIOLOGY - Twelve hours of credit in sociology and course prerequisites.  
(EXCEPTION: \* Students who hold Provisional Elementary Certificate issued since 1952 and those who have completed an Area of Concentration in Social Science may take courses for which they have the required course prerequisites)

\*\*BIOLOGY - Twelve hours of credit in biology and course prerequisites.

\*\*CHEMISTRY - Credit for Organic Chemistry.

\*\*PHYSICS - Credit for College Physics.  
(EXCEPTION: \*\* Students who hold the Provisional Elementary Certificate issued since 1952 and those who have completed an Area of Concentration in Science, may take courses for which they have the required course prerequisites)

\*\*MATHEMATICS - Credit for Differential and Integral Calculus.

- STEP 4. Pick up the remainder of your Registration packet in the Lobby marked "B". The number in the block marked "class" on the Pink Master Card should be written in the appropriate space on each of the cards received from your adviser. These numbers indicate student classification as follows:

- STEP 5. After admission to the Physical Education Room through entrance "C", go to the appropriate department to pick up your Class Cards in area "D". Give the individual distributing the class cards you desire your Student Information Card, Pink Master Card, and in some cases your Fee Card will be requested.

As you sign your Class Card the instructor concerned will initial your Student Information Card thereby confirming the assignment. If a change in your schedule becomes necessary because of conflict, closing of a section, etc., be certain that any Class Cards you have already received but will not be able to use, are returned to the person who issued them. If you have any trouble with your schedule that cannot be resolved by those handing out cards and advising, please see the Dean of your School.

- STEP 6. After you have received Class Cards for all the courses you are to take, go to the tables set up at area "E" and enter your approved schedule in ink on the reverse side of the Registrar's Card (White), and the Student Information Card.

- STEP 7. Go to the "Final Check" Station at area "F" for final approval of your schedule of classes. (Students on probation report directly to the Dean of Undergraduate Programs.) It will be necessary at this time to present for checking in this order:

Your Master Card (Pink)  
Your Student Information Card  
Your Registrar's Card (White)  
Your Class Cards arranged in the order  
listed on your registration card

- STEP 8. After your Registrar's Card (White) has received the "final check" proceed to the Student Affairs desk, area "G", to complete Registration.

- STEP 9. Proceed to the Business Table, area "H", to pay fees etc., and leave by exit "I".
