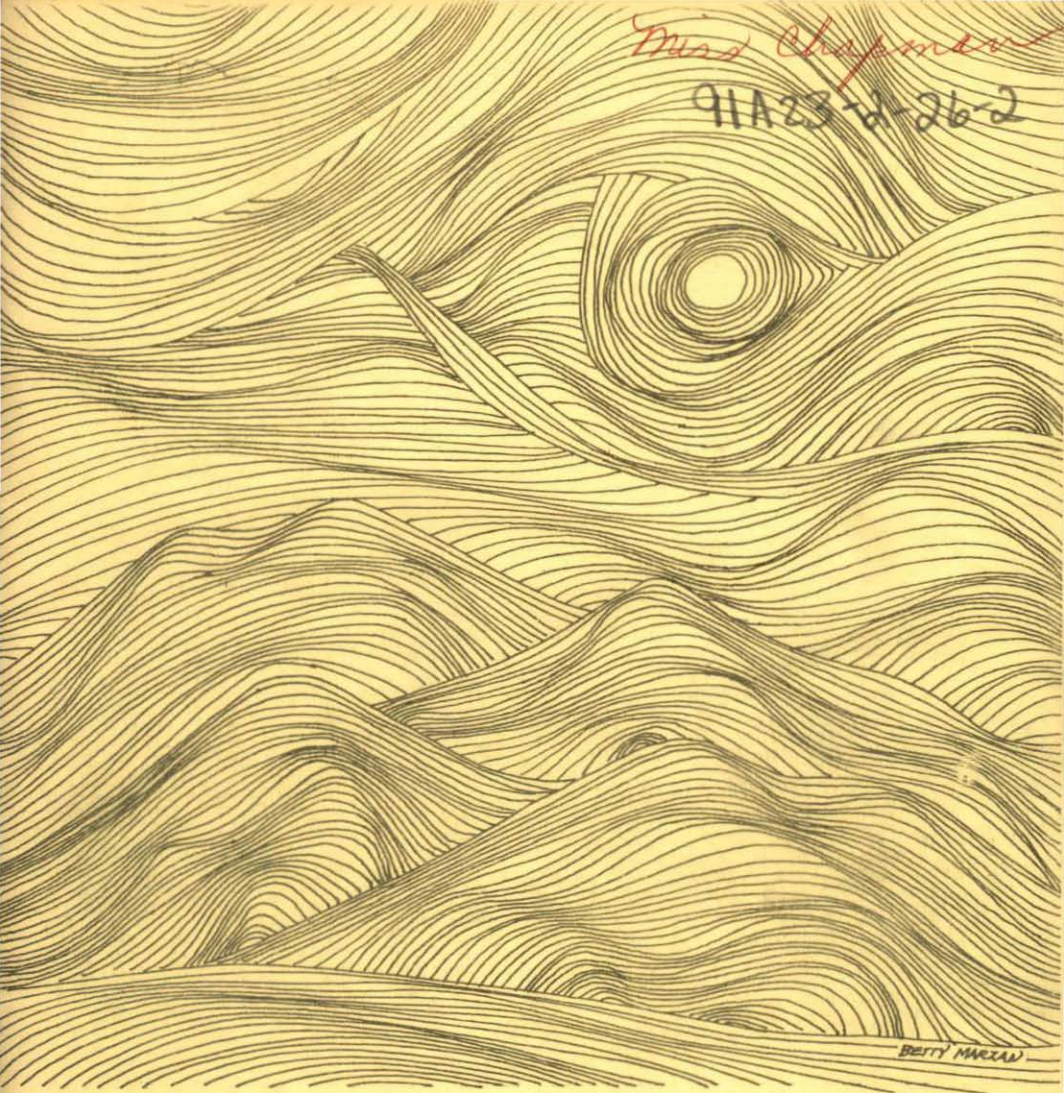

### DIRECTIONS FOR REGISTRATION

For Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate Students

READ CAREFULLY: The University reserves the right to revise this schedule  
in any way that seems desirable.

1. Student goes to his school Dean's office between January 3 and January 14 for:
  - (a) Schedule cards
  - (b) Trial schedule cards
  - (c) Class schedule

Fill in the information requested on all of the cards except the class schedule on the White Registrar's card and Student Affairs card which will be completed when you register. All blanks should be completed in ink except the Trial Schedule. The Trial Schedule card is to be signed by your advisor before registration and you are advised to have it signed between January 3 and January 14.

2. Student goes to Advisor: (If you do not know who your advisor is, please go to the Dean of your school who will assign you to a temporary advisor.)
  - (a) student and his advisor decide on courses needed by the student
  - (b) they prepare a realistic schedule
  - (c) changes of schedule by drop-add will be limited in most cases to correction of scheduling errors

## DIRECTIONS FOR REGISTRATION (CONT'D)

The advisor should retain one copy of the advisee's schedule for his records.

Special permission must be secured to carry a student load of more than 17 hours.

Courses numbered in the 300's and 400's carrying the letter "G" may be taken for graduate credit by qualified students. Graduate students enrolling for any of these courses should check carefully with both the course instructor and the Dean of Graduate Programs to be certain of prerequisite qualifications.

3. Report to Button Auditorium according to the following schedule:

4. Pick up the remainder of your registration packet at the front of the Auditorium.

Complete the information requested on the new cards you have received. Wait in the Auditorium until you are told to go to the Gymnasium. Graduate students who do not have a number six (6) in the block marked "class" on the Pink Master Card should report to the Dean of the Graduate School. Graduate students who have not completed all three sections of the Graduate Record Exam are to report to the G.R.E. table in Button Auditorium.

5. After admission to the Gymnasium, go to the departments concerned to pick up your Class Cards. Give the individual distributing the cards you desire your Trial Schedule Card and pink Master Card only!

Before he gives you a Class Card the instructor concerned will initial your Trial Schedule Card thereby confirming the class assignment. If a change in your schedule becomes necessary because of conflict, closing of a section, etc., be certain that any Class Cards you have already received but will not be able to use, are returned to the instructor who issued them. If you have any trouble with your schedule that cannot be resolved by those handing out cards and advising, please go to the Dean of your school.

## DIRECTIONS FOR REGISTRATION (CONT'D)

6. After you have received Class Cards for all the courses you are to take, go to the tables set up in the bleachers on the north and south sides of the Gymnasium and enter your approved schedule in ink on the reverse side of the Registrar's Card (White), and the Dean of Students Card (Yellow).
7. Go to the "Final Check" Station for final approval of your schedule of classes. (Students on probation report directly to the Dean of Undergraduate Programs.) It will be necessary at this time to present for checking in this order:
  - Your Master Card (Pink)
  - Your Trial Schedule Card
  - Your Registrar's Card (White)
  - Your class cards arranged in the order listed on your registration card
8. After your Registrar's Card (White) has the Dean's signature, proceed to the east end of the Combs Classroom Building to complete registration.
9. Classes will begin at 8:00 A.M. on Thursday, February 2, 1967.

### PART-TIME FEES

The Registration Fee for undergraduate students who are residents of Kentucky and enrolled for less than twelve hours of work during a regular semester is \$9.00 per semester hour. This fee for out-of-state students is \$22.50 per semester hour.

The Registration Fee for graduate students who are residents of Kentucky and enrolled for less than twelve hours of work during a regular semester is \$12.00 per semester hour. This fee for out-of-state students is \$30.00 per semester hour.

All students enrolling for more than six hours during a semester are required to pay the regular Incidental Fee.

### FEES FOR GRADUATE INSTRUCTION

Residents of Kentucky - \$12.00 per semester hour. Maximum \$100.00

Out-of-state students - first nine hours, \$30.00 per hour. Maximum \$270.00

### OTHER EXPENSES

The University maintains a modern cafeteria and grill in the Doran Student House and food may be purchased at reasonable rates.

Books and necessary supplies may be secured at the University Bookstore. Prices on these items are held at a minimum.

Consult the Catalog for special fees for late registration, change of schedule, private instruction in music, and graduation.

### REFUNDS

Refunds of fees will be made as follows:

A student withdrawing during the first week of school will be refunded 75 percent of his fees.

A student withdrawing within the first three weeks of school will be refunded 50 percent of his fees.
