The celebrated climbing gafus so renowned in the sporting world, have been entirely superreded and rendered useless by a new and superior invention for which we are indebted to the ingeneity of our enterprising coon hunting friends, Messrs. Russ Folkerth and Warren Phillips. It is called a 'Coon Smeller,' and consists of a series of slender tin tubes which are carried by hunters, and which upon occasion may be joined together so as to form a tube of any length required. At the lower end it is wide, like a found.
