## Constitution.

1. This Society shall be called the Christian Woman's Missionary Society of Morehead, Kentucky, and shall be auxiliary to the Christian Woman's Board of Missions.

2. Its object shall be to cultivate missionary spirit; to encourage missionary effort in this church; to disseminate missionary intelligence, and to secure systematic contribution for missionary purposes.

3. Any person may become a member of this Society by subscribing to this Constitution, promising to aid in furthering the objects herein named, and to contribute monthly a definite sum, not less than fifteen cents, ten cents to the National Treasurer and five cents to State Fund.

4. The officers of this Society shall be a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary, whose election shall take place at the regular meeting in September; at which time, also, annual reports shall be made by the Treasurer and Secretary. Any vacancy shall be filled by election at the regular meeting after such vacancy occurs.

5. The officers of this Society shall constitute an Executive Committee for the transaction of business, three of whom shall constitute a quorum.

6. The Society shall meet monthly, five members constituting a quorum, though a less number may adjourn from time to time
