That is why the Adjustment Administration is asking the Nation's farmer's in 1936 to adjust about 10 million acres of land normally planted to corn to soi-building or erosion-pre venting crops.

A downward adjustment in acerage needs to be continued in 1936, states the AAA, for two rea sons: First, to keep corn production in line with livestock feeding reourrements, and second, to help vent an overexpansion in hog duction in 1937.

Under the 1935 contract, farm Under the 1935 contract, farmers participating in the corn-hop program retired 11 1-2 million acres from corn production, and most of these acres were in the Corn belt where higher than average yields are obtained. Nevertheless, the corn supply for each grain-consuming animal on farms this winter is larger than in any year since the war, except 1925.


