

## TROOPS FOR ROWAN COUNTY.

Militia to Be Sent There to Protect the Circuit Court.

LExINGTON, Ky., July 30.—[Special.]—Adjutant Roger D. Williams of the Second Regiment of State Guard and Dr. Duvall, the regimental surgeon, were ordered tonight to report to Maj. McKee at 13 o'clock Monday for service. This means beyond doubt that troops will be sent to Morehead during the session of the Circuit Court, which convenes there Thursday. Judge Cole of the Rowan County Circuit Court met Gov. Knott in this city last night and by an earnest solicitation induced him to reconsider his determination to not send troops to Morehead. The Governor urged that his own knowledge, confirmed by the report of Adjutant-General Caselman, was to the effect that the presence of troops would only afford momentary relief from the disorder that has afflicted Rowan County, and he thought it useless to use the military when no permanent good was promised; but Judge Cole was peremptory in his demand for troops, and today a detail of seventy-five men was made from the Louisville Legion to go to Morehead. The troops are not to do police or bailiff duty. The detail will go up Monday morning under command of Maj. L. W. McKee of Lawrenceburg, with R. D. Williams of this city as Adjutant and D. Alvin Duvall as Surgeon. There are no new developments at Morehead. The presence of armed men guarding the town continues, and many wild rumors as to skulking bodies of men that are supposed to be bent on an attack. One hundred Winchester rifles, with abundant ammunition, were shipped by the Adams Express to Seth Young of Mount Sterling, who has been the County Attorney.

William Barker, while building a fence on the outskirts of Morehead this afternoon, was shot through the head by a man in ambush, supposed to be a Tolliver man. At Mount Sterling this afternoon Green Manin, who was arrested a few days ago charged with conspiracy to kill the Logan brothers June 7, was tried before Judge Cooper, who held him in \$2,500 bond to appear before the Rowan County Circuit Court next Wednesday.
