Indians, or some other people from American antiquity, left drawings and figures of men carved on rocks along the Guyandotte and Ohio rivers. This rock was located on the Kentucky shore, about opposite the foot of Bond Street. It was known by the figure cut into it as "Indian Head" rock. The rock, due to changes in the river, is no longer visible. This was taken in 1903, and the photograph is from the Carl Ackerman collection.
