MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's Department of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences has received a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for a special continuing education program.

The \$16,795 grant will fund respiratory nursing workshops throughout the MSU service region. The purpose of the workshops is to provide information for registered and licensed practical nurses in Eastern Kentucky hospitals and health care agencies on ways to promote a higher level of health for coal miners suffering from occupational lung diseases.

Dr. Betty Porter, department chair, said that the respiratory nursing workshops were just one in a number of continuing education programs that the University has sponsored throughout the years.

A total of 11 workshops, a pilot at the University and 10 others at Eastern Kentucky sites, will be held during the year. The locations include: Ashland, Harlan, Hazard, Louisa, Jackson, Middlesboro, Mt. Sterling, Pikeville, Prestonsburg and Whitesburg.

"Recognizing our commitment to the region means taking the programs out into the area to meet the needs of nurses and that translates into meeting the needs of the people," Pauline Ramey, associate professor of nursing at MSU and author of the grant proposal, said.

There is a documented need for this type of education in the region, Ramey added. By 1990, 1.3 billion tons of coal will be mined each year, a 100 percent increase over 1980 levels. Kentucky is the nation's leading coal producing state and more than 75 percent of the state's coal is mined in Eastern Kentucky.

National Center for Health Services data shows that between 1968 and 1978, the national death rate from respiratory diseases rose by 22 percent, while death rates for most other diseases declined. According to statistics provided by U.S. Rep. Chris Perkins, 7th District of Kentucky, the incidence of respiratory diseases in Eastern Kentucky is 35 times greater than the national average.

In addition, the coal miner's rate of stomach cancer, lung cancer and hypertension is many times greater than that for the general population.

"If you add to those statistics the 20,000 or so people working in Eastern Kentucky coal mines, you see the urgent need for respiratory nursing education," Ramey said.

Despite obvious health risks associated with the coal mining industry, a 1985 survey of nurses in the region showed that the majority of health care professionals have only a minimal educational background in respiratory nursing.

An estimated 418 nurses will participate in the program, though this number does not reflect the health care professionals from adjacent coal-mining communities in Ohio, Virginia and West Virginia that may attend, according to Ramey.

A pilot workshop, held at MSU in early June, drew a larger number of participants than expected, Dr. Porter said. She added that makes her believe that the 418 estimate for the entire project is very low.

"From the response we have had already, everyone seems to be very enthusiastic," said Dr. Porter. "Several congressional leaders from the area were very interested in this project being funded and we are appreciative of their support," she added.

In addition to the workshops, MSU will provide an annual meeting to update Eastern Kentucky nurses of the latest knowledge in respiratory nursing care. According to Dr. Porter, the possibility exists for this program to become a long-term project of the Department of Nursing and Allied Health Sciences.

"I think this project is a feather in MSU's cap," Dr. Porter said.

Nurses attending the regional workshops will receive seven contact hours as approved by the Kentucky Board of Nursing. The cost is \$20.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's headcount enrollment for Summer I is 2,051 and includes a significant increase at the freshman and sophomore levels over Summer I last year, according to figures released today by MSU President C. Nelson Grote.

"While the University experienced a slight drop overall, down five students from this period last summer, there is an interesting trend developing with an increased number of freshmen and sophomores taking summer classes," Dr. Grote said.

The freshman headcount is 292 as compared with 230 in 1987 and sophomore student enrollments increased by 22.

"A surprising number of these students are taking classes either to accelerate their college-going career or to lighten their class load during the regular academic year," Dr. Stephen S. Taylor, vice president for academic affairs, noted. "Others are enrolled in summer school to improve their grade point average," Dr. Taylor added.

Graduate enrollment for the first summer term was down but, according to Dr. James Gotsick, dean of graduate and special academic programs, the number of MSU's off-campus classes offered during the regular academic year has increased by 45 percent since 1985.

"Not only are we placing more classes at our regional locations in the fall and spring, but we also are more efficiently scheduling specific classes to meet student needs," Dr. Gotsick said. "This means that many graduate students no longer have to make provisions to attend summer school," he added.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University has been chosen by Harvard University's School of Public Health to participate in one of 24 air quality projects nationwide.

The Morehead Air Quality Project is directed by Dr. Richard Hunt, associate professor of chemistry at MSU. Dr. Hunt collects samples of sub-microscopic, fine and coarse particles three times per week from air traps on the roof of Reed Hall and sends them to Harvard for processing.

According to Dr. Hunt, the researchers are looking for acidic pollutants--salts, aerosols and solids. In addition to monitoring the air particles, the project includes a health survey of residents in the area for pollution related problems.

The project has been in operation at the University since April and the \$6,080 grant will fund the program through March 1989.
