MOREHEAD, Ky.--Music lovers can enjoy "Mozart in the Mountains" at the fifth annual Morehead Chamber Music Celebration, July 10-16, at Morehead State University.

The Chamber Music Celebration, sponsored by MSU's Academy of Arts and the College of Arts and Sciences, is a week-long series of workshops and concerts. The Celebration is an opportunity for serious musicians to convene, rehearse, and perform in informal, unstructured settings. Taking part in the event are active amateur chamber musicians and professional musicians from regional and metropolitan orchestras from across the United States.

Kicking off the 1988 Celebration will be a concert featuring the Renaissance City Winds from Pittsburgh, Penn. The Winds have become one of Pennsylvania's foremost chamber music ensembles since their founding in 1975 and are known for their varied programs that range from Baroque and classical favorites to popular music arrangements. The ensemble's performances throughout the eastern United States have included an appearance at the Kennedy Center.

The Chamber Music Celebration will present the Queens String Quartet from New York in concert, Wednesday, July 13. The Quartet first gained national attention by winning the 12th annual Artists International Musicians Award which resulted in a New York debut at Carnegie Recital Hall in 1985. Since its debut the Quartet has gone on to perform internationally and participate in many of the nation's foremost music festivals.

Other Chamber Music Celebration concerts include: a Participants' Recital on Thursday, July 14; the Morehead Chamber Music Celebration Orchestra conducted by Manfred Blum from Earlham College on Friday, July 15; and a Composer's Night featuring violinist and composer Joseph Baber of Lexington on Tuesday, July 12. All concerts take place in Duncan Recital Hall at 8 p.m. Several noon concerts will also be featured during the week. The concerts are free and open to the public.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Nearly 400 undergraduate and graduate classes will be offered during the Summer II session at Morehead State University, July 11-Aug. 5.

Summer II registration will be conducted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Monday, July 11, in the Crager Room of the Adron Doran University Center. Classes begin on July 12 and will continue through Aug. 5.

Admission to registration will be based on an alphabetical system by the student's last name. All fees should be paid at the time of registration.

Undergraduate tuition for the session is \$45 per credit hour for Kentucky residents and \$129 per credit hour for out-of-state students. Kentucky residents graduate tuition is \$66 per hour, with out-of-state graduate tuition \$188 per credit hour.

Students who pre-registered for Summer II classes during the spring semester without paying fees must report to the registration area to do so. Those students planning to register will need to meet with their advisers to prepare a trial schedule before entering the registration area. Advisers will be available in ADUC throughout the day.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Manfred Blum, one of today's outstanding conductors, will share his talents and expertise as artistic director and conductor during the fifth annual Morehead Chamber Music Celebration, July 10-16, at Morehead State University.

Blum, a native of Cologne, West Germany, was a child prodigy who graduated from the University of Cologne's Academy of Music at age 17. He gained recognition in Europe as an outstanding violinist and violist, and came to the U.S. in 1951 to perform for several years before becoming professor of music at Earlham College in Richmond, Ind. In 1956, he founded the Richmond Symphony Orchestra and in 1981 he began the Anderson (Ind.) Symphony Orchestra. Blum received a special award for his musical insight from the National Endowment for the Humanities in 1975.

Blum will conduct the Morehead Music Celebration Chamber Orchestra in concert on Friday, July 15. Trumpeter Vince DiMartino will be a special guest soloist for one of the evening's musical selections, J.S. Bach's Brandenburg Concerto #2.

DiMartino, professor of trumpet and jazz ensembles at the University of Kentucky, has a diverse background in both classical and jazz music. His experience includes performances with the Rochester Philharmonic and such jazz legends as Sarah Vaughn and Joe Williams. He also serves on the staff of the internationally-renown Tanglewood Music Festival.

Other highlights of the 1988 Chamber Music Celebration include: The Renaissance City Winds in concert on Monday, July 11; Composers' Night with violinist Joseph Baber of Lexington **and other** composers on Tuesday, July 12; the Queens String Quartet in concert on Wednesday, July 13; and a Participants' Recital on Thursday, July 14. All concerts take place in the Duncan Recital Hall at 8 p.m. and are free to the public. Noon concerts are also scheduled during the week.

The Morehead Chamber Music Celebration, which draws professional and skilled amateur musicians from across the United States and Canada, is a week-long series of workshops and concerts.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Dr. Eugene Young, associate professor of English at Morehead State University, has been awarded a \$20,000 grant from the Kentucky Department of Education to continue offering writing process workshops for public schools.

Now in its second year, the program provides a summer workshop at MSU, followed by in-service workshops for 20 Eastern Kentucky teachers during the 1988-89 academic year.

The grant, which is to be matched by the University, enables Dr. Young, along with Joy Gooding of Fleming County High School, to conduct the program for teachers in elementary and secondary schools.

According to Dr. Young, the workshops are affiliated with a national writing project that has been successful since the 1970s. "The goal of the program is to have teachers--not necessarily language arts teachers--look at content in addition to grammar and punctuation when grading writing assignments," Dr. Young said.

Rosemarie Gold, fourth and fifth grades gifted and talented teacher at Flemingsburg Elementary School, was a member of the 1987-88 workshop and has seen vast improvement in her students after allowing them the creativity the writing process teaches.

"It's brought out things in these children that I've never seen before in students this age," Gold said. "The improvement was unbelievable. My peers even commented that they could see a difference in the youngsters' writing abilities."

Gold explained that her students visited the State Capitol in early February and met privately with Gov. Wallace Wilkinson. After returning to Flemingsburg, she asked each one to write a letter to Gov. Wilkinson about the trip to Frankfort. The letters were mailed along with a huge Valentine the students designed. Gold believes the quality and creativity of the letters is what prompted Gov. Wilkinson to send 22 personal letters to the fourth and fifth graders.

"It's the most beneficial class I've had since my undergraduate work," Gold said. "I wish I could go back and take it again; I liked it that much," she added.

Similar four-week workshops are scheduled for all other regional universities, the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville.

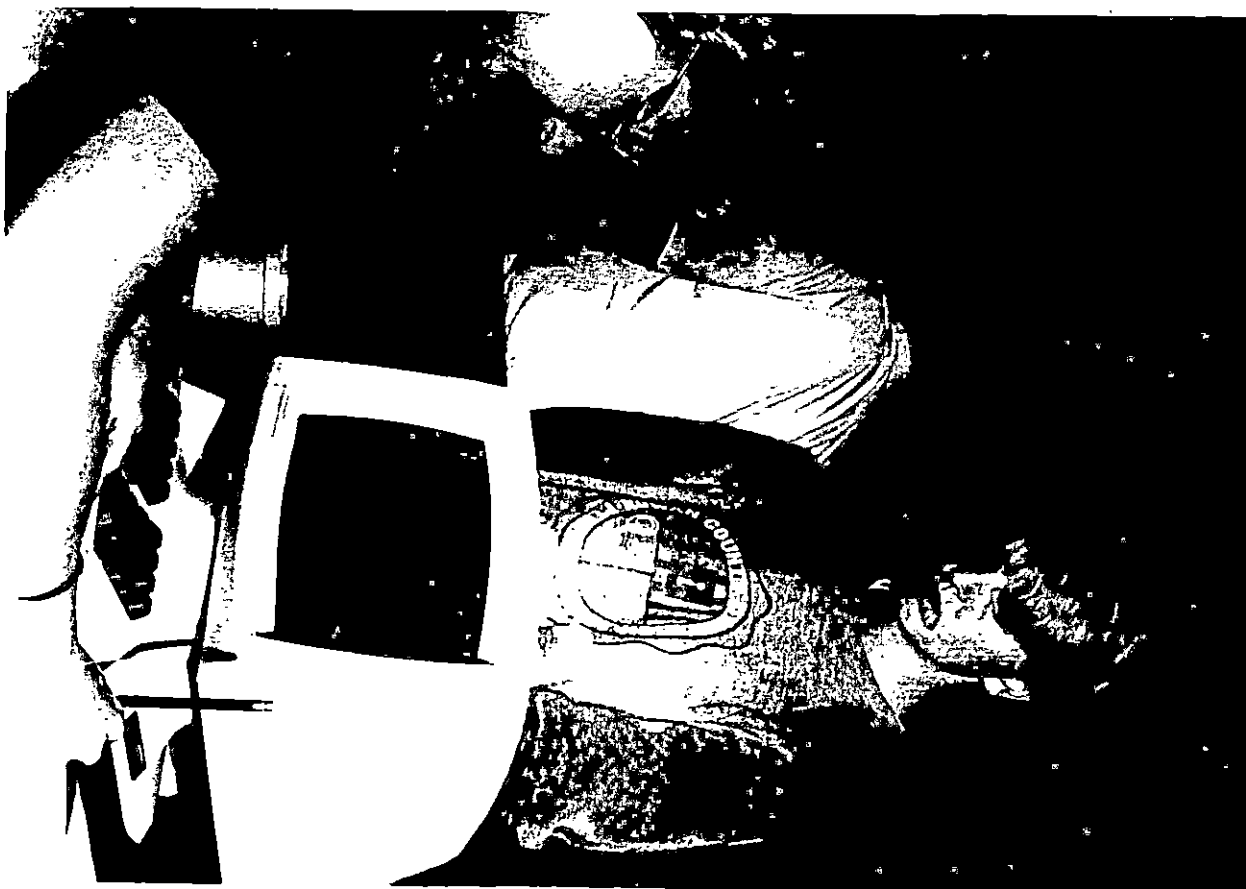

MOREHEAD, Ky.--WMKY, member supported radio from Morehead State University, has received national recognition from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting for achievement in community service.

WMKY's Blood Drive Campaign, an effort the public station launched in December 1987, was chosen as one of three nominees from among more than 200 entries for the CPB's 1988 Public Radio Program Award in Community Service. The other two nominees were stations located in Washington, D.C., and Urbana, Ill.

The basic goal of the blood drive campaign was to help educate the public about the blood donation process and to generate additional blood donations in the regional communities which WMKY serves. The campaign ran through the Christmas and New Year season, a critical time for regional blood centers.

The WMKY staff worked with regional blood center officials and medical professionals to produce and broadcast information features about AIDS and blood donation, the actual donation process, and misconceptions about giving blood. During the six-week campaign, WMKY also kept listeners informed of bloodmobile visits throughout Northeast Kentucky.

According to Tom Watts, administrator of the Central Kentucky Blood Center in Lexington, the 1987-88 holiday season was the first in which the blood center did not experience a crisis situation. Watts said, "We feel the information provided by WMKY will help donors feel more comfortable about donating and will have a positive effect."

WMKY Promotion and Development Director Judith Flavell explained, "Our staff felt it was important to get involved and serve our community by launching a project that would help people in a tangible way.

"Personally, I'm very excited that we have been recognized for the effort. The best public stations in the nation are recognized by the CPB in this way," Flavell added.

WMKY Production Director Dan Hittepole, who coordinated production of features and gave listeners a walk-through of the donation process, gives blood regularly. He was pleased with the success of 90.3 FM's campaign.

"Giving blood is simple and it's badly needed in this area, especially around the holidays. I think our campaign helped convince some people to become donors," explained Hittepole. He added, "I'm also tickled that we were recognized by CPB. We were up against some pretty tough competition."

WMKY Program Director Susan Westfall said that the 50,000 watt public radio station plans to continue putting together campaigns similar to the blood drive effort.

"This type of campaign is a real community outreach effort, which is what radio is all about. It's something that WMKY feels very committed to and we will continue to serve our community in the future," Westfall said.

Westfall accepted the nomination on behalf of WMKY at the 1988 Public Radio Conference in St. Louis.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--More significant research in the education field is being done in the United States than almost anywhere else in the world, according to Dr. Derek Whordley, coordinator of the educational services unit in Morehead State University's School of Education.

A native of Warwickshire in central England, Dr. Whordley believes that there is much more work being done on the cutting edge of education research in the U.S. than in Britain.

"The British are just beginning to take an interest in teacher performance and the diagnosis of children's problems in special education, things that have been a major concern in the U.S. for years," Dr. Whordley said.

He believes the reason Americans are in the forefront of education research is the American need to measure everything.

According to Dr. Whordley, in America, when a child is learning to read, the emphasis is placed on skill development and basal readers. In the United Kingdom, instructors are more concerned with the writing process and teaching children's literature.

"It's much easier to measure the size of a child's vocabulary than to measure the way the child uses that vocabulary," he said.

In addition to having been a professor of education and director of the teaching-learning center at Mercer University in Atlanta, the position he held before coming to MSU in January, Dr. Whordley has taught at the elementary level in London and was the principal of the British Embassy International School in Turkey.

He believes that the difference between the American and English education systems stem from the ideological, historical and cultural differences in the approaches to education used by the two countries.

"Since the British have always had an elitist view of education as opposed to the populist American view, trying to compare the two is really like trying to compare apples and oranges," Dr. Whordley said. "When I'm talking about the two, I'm never interested in a better than, worse than scenario, but in a 'different than' look at the systems," he added.

Another difference in the British and American systems is that in England, an elementary school with an enrollment of 500 students is considered enormous and the principal is more of a principal teacher rather than an administrator, according to Dr. Whordley.

He said that in recent years the British have been looking to the Americans for ways to deal with multi-cultural students in the same school systems. The United States has been dealing with the needs and problems of children with different backgrounds attending the same schools for many years, while the mass immigration from former British colonies to the United Kingdom has occurred only during the last 20 to 30 years.

Although he comes from England, Dr. Whordley believes his background is very similar to that of the people in the Eastern Kentucky area.

"I came from a coal mining family in a rural village, so it's very interesting to be back in that kind of community," Dr. Whordley said. "I have a passion for collecting and refinishing primitive American furniture and artifacts which whets my interest in Appalachian history and culture," he added.

Dr. Whordley noted that many Europeans feel that Americans lack a definite culture, that Americans instead are content with the ancestral heritage of the European settlers of the country. Dr. Whordley, on the other hand, said he thinks that many areas of the U.S.--especially Appalachia--have a distinctive cultural identity.

"The kids coming out of the towns and hollows in the area don't realize the rich, cultural heritage they have," he said.

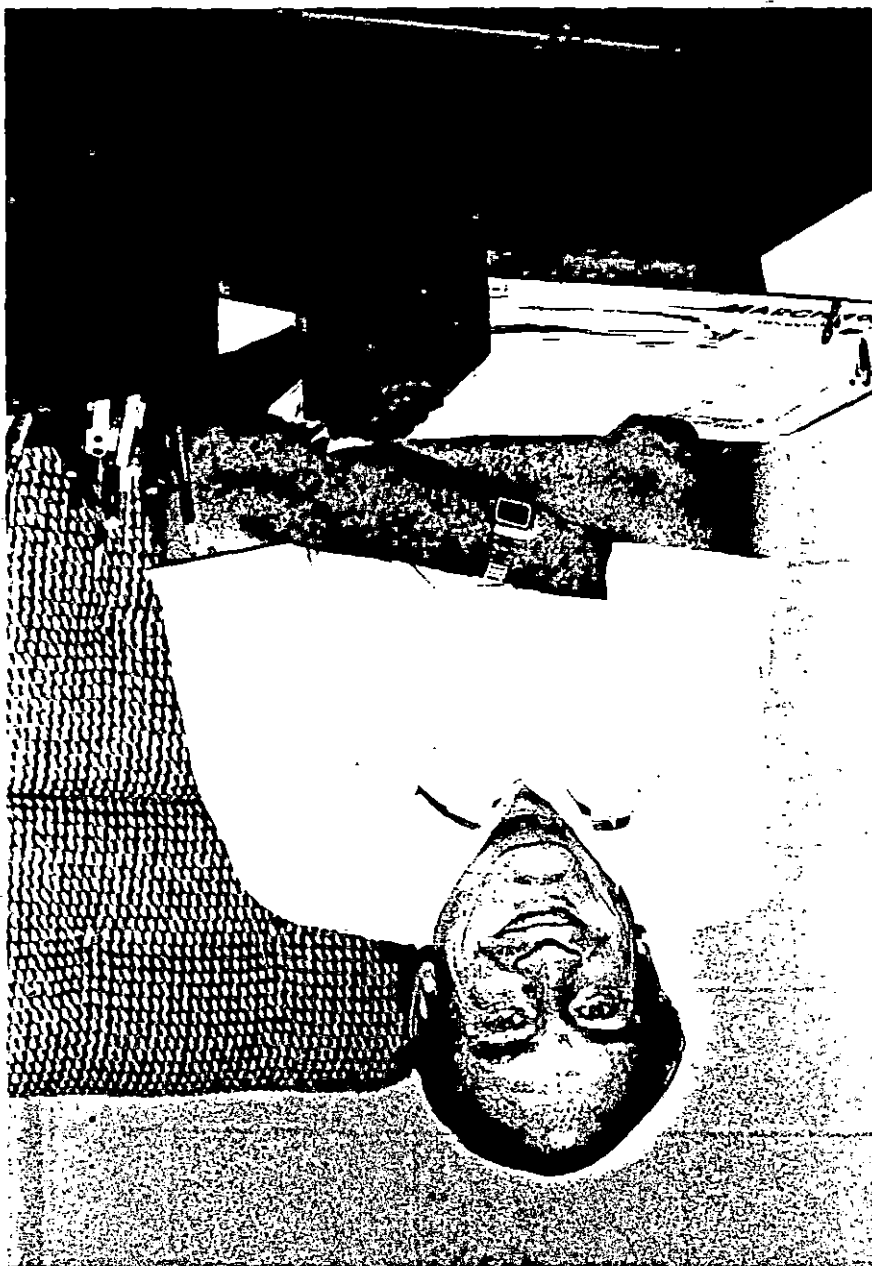
Dr. Whordley received his certificate of education from Borough Road College in London. He earned both his master's and doctoral degrees from Michigan State University.

He has published numerous articles in infant-toddler assessment, multi-cultural education and language arts and reading. His professional affiliations include the National Council for Teachers of English, the American Dialect Society and Pi Delta Kappa, education honorary fraternity.

Dr. Whordley and his wife, Kitty, a native of Toledo, Ohio, have two daughters.

When students arrive at the University, some things will be different concerning academic programs.

Although no real changes have been made in the curriculum, Data Processing has had a name change. According to Dr. Judy Rogers, professor of English and assistant to the vice president for academic affairs, data processing courses now will come under the category of computer information systems.

The University has implemented two new degree programs, both part of the College of Applied Sciences and Technology.

MSU is upgrading the veterinary technology program from an associate degree to a bachelor degree program. Dr. Donald Applegate, coordinator of the veterinary technology program, said that MSU is one of the first universities in the country to offer a four-year degree in vet-tech.

The new program will feature anesthesiology and pre-veterinary options within the vet-tech curriculum.

The bachelor's degree program will be implemented in on a two plus two system. Students in the program will continue to receive an associate's degree with the option of pursuing a B.S. degree. Graduates of other associate degree vet-tech programs will be eligible to enter MSU on a limited basis.

The other addition is an associate degree in child development under the Department of Home Economics. According to Dr. Marilyn Sampley, department chair, new state regulations require that child care center directors have an associate degree in child development and center workers complete six hours annually leading to an associate degree.

Dr. Sampley said that the program was developed because of the new regulations but also because according to U.S. Census Bureau statistics, by 1990, one in two mothers of pre-school children will work outside the home.

(on a 4.0 scale) based on seven semesters of work and submit a completed scholarship application to MSU.

To be considered for the Alumni Award, at least one of the applicant's parents must be an MSU alumnus and an active participant in the MSU Alumni Association. In addition, the student must be a Kentucky resident, entering MSU as a freshman or transfer student. High school students must have a 2.75 cumulative g.p.a. (on a 4.0 scale) based on seven semesters of work or a composite ACT score of 20. Transfer students must have a 2.75 g.p.a. (on a 4.0 scale) for the equivalent of at least one term. Applicants must also submit a scholarship application to MSU.

The Regional Honors I scholarship, valued at \$2,000 per year, is renewable for four years if the student maintains a minimum cumulative 3.00 g.p.a. during the freshman year and a minimum 3.25 g.p.a. thereafter. 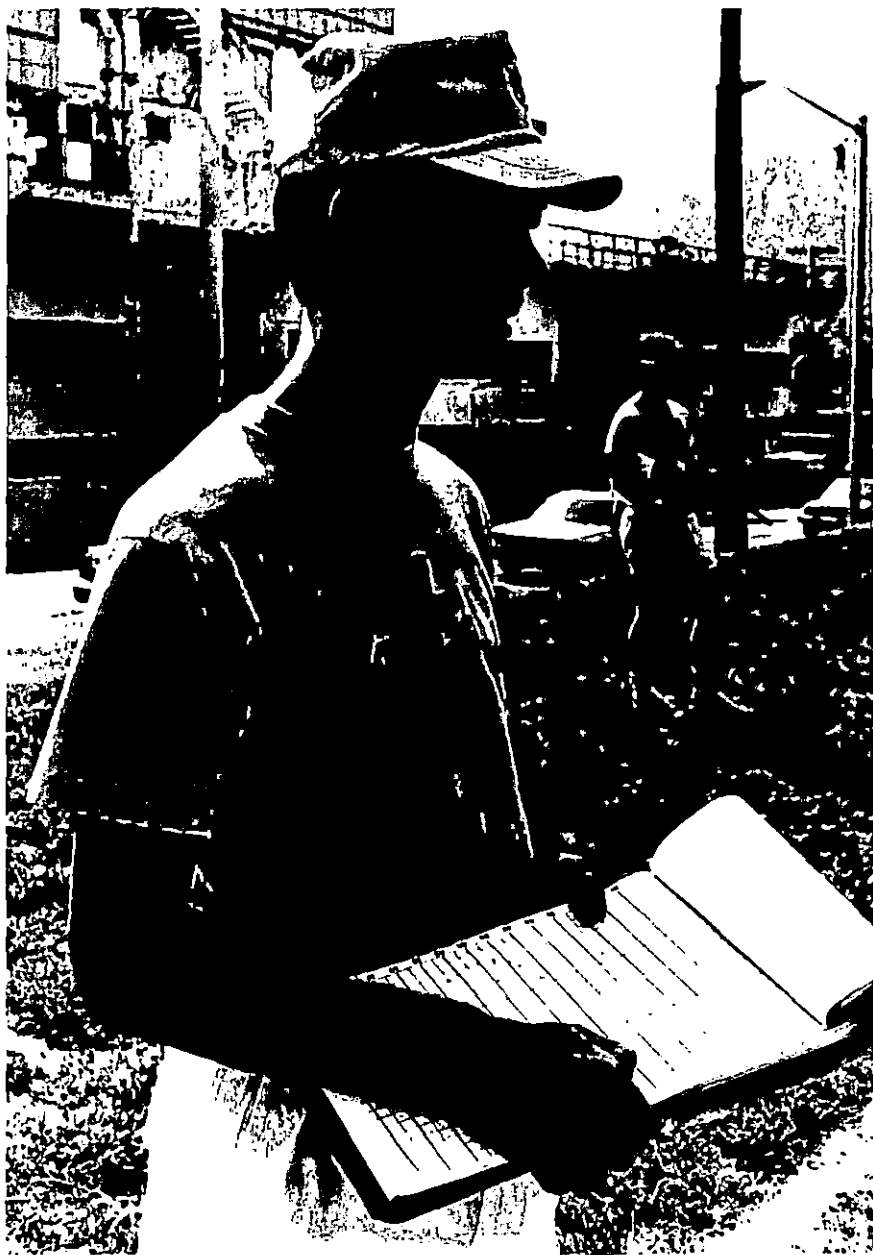

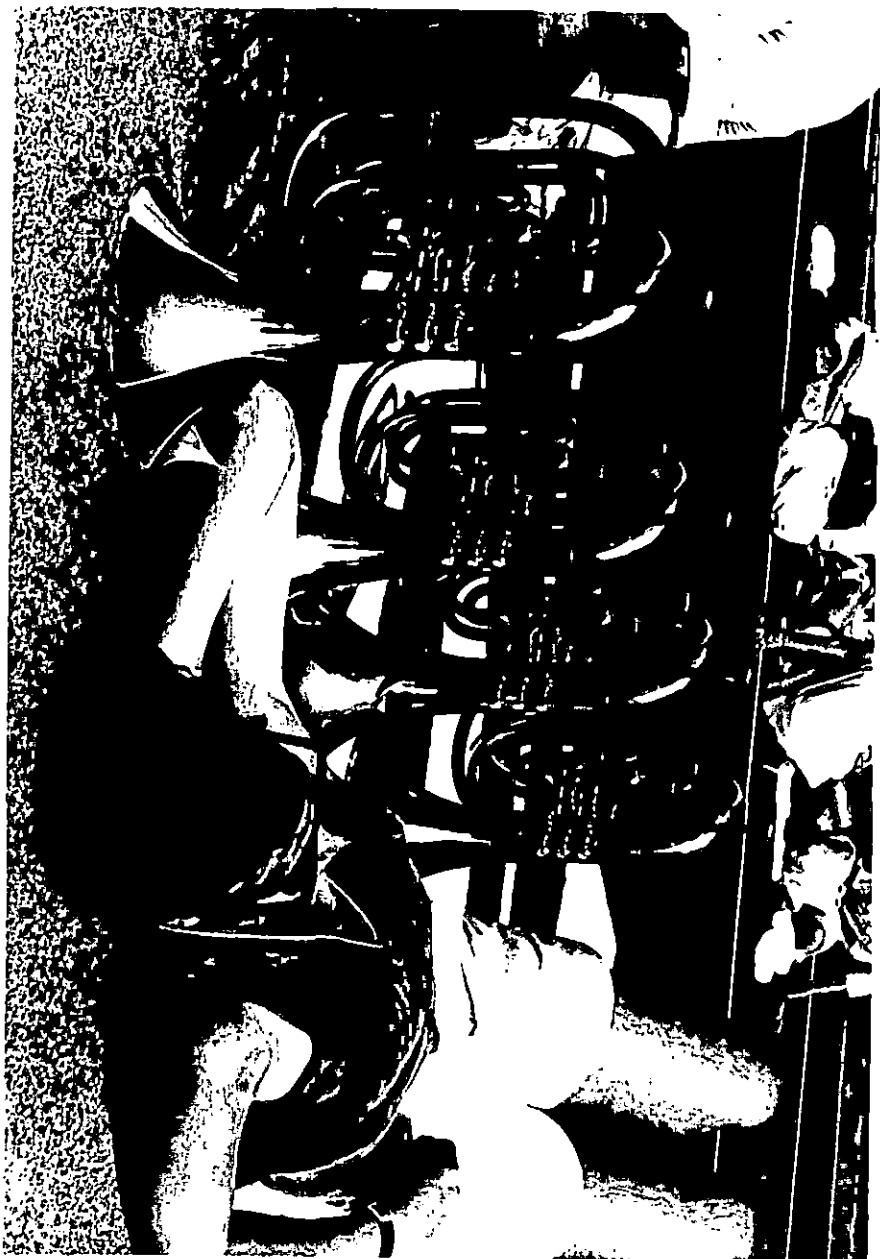

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Educational television pioneer O. Leonard Press will receive the honorary Doctor of Public Service degree from Morehead State University at the school's 1988 Summer Commencement on Saturday, Aug. 6.

MSU Board of Regents Chairman Louie B. Nunn will present the degree during the ceremonies slated for 1:30 p.m. in Button Auditorium.

More than 300 undergraduate and graduate students are candidates for degrees to be conferred by MSU President C. Nelson Grote.

Press, executive director of the Kentucky Authority for Educational Television since 1963, initiated plans for the Kentucky Educational Television Network between 1958 and 1960. Spending the next six years securing support for KET, Press saw it go on the air in 1968 as the largest state ETV network in the nation.

In the late 1940s and early 1950s, Press initiated and produced some of the nation's first educational television programs. As a consultant to the National Association of Educational Broadcasters, he originated the weekly broadcast from the National Press Club which still airs on public radio.

During his career, he has served as a consultant to various state ETV networks, to the U.S. Department of Education where he established the Broadcast Facilities program, and to National Educational Television.

He has served on boards, commissions and task forces for various national and regional broadcasting agencies, including the Corporation for Public Broadcasting and the Public Broadcasting Service. A former NAEB chairman, he founded the Congressional Coverage Consortium.

Inducted into the Kentucky Hall of Fame in 1986, Press earned the B.S. and M.S. degrees from Boston University. He is a former University of Kentucky faculty member and Broadcasting Services supervisor.

College of Arts and Sciences graduating senior Sharon Gabbard of Hazel Green, formerly of Jackson, will be the student speaker. Graduating with honors, she will receive a B.A. degree in para-legal studies. She is a member of Phi Alpha Delta pre-law fraternity and Pi Gamma Mu international social sciences honorary.

The wife of Harvey Gabbard, principal of Sebastian Middle School in Jackson, and mother of four, she began her degree in 1967, but took a sabbatical to raise her family. After taking classes at Lees College, she returned to MSU in 1985. Already doing graduate work at MSU, she hopes ultimately to enter law school at the University of Kentucky.

Active in the Elkatawa Community Church, she is the daughter of Nancy J. Brewer of Jackson and Frank Gabbard of Beattyville.

Once the degrees are awarded, the new alumni will be inducted into the MSU Alumni Association by its president, Lisa Browning.

Dennis Karwatka, associate professor of industrial education and this year's Distinguished Faculty Award recipient, will serve as grand marshal, assisted by Dr. Gerald DeMoss, Department of Biological and Environmental Sciences chair, and Alex Conyers, associate professor of finance.

Student marshals will be Donna and Larry Holland of Morehead, representing Graduate and Special Academic Programs; Kandy Allard of Morehead and Patricia Barker of Olive Hill, College of Applied Sciences and Technology; Sabrina Kiser and William Whitaker IV, both of Morehead, College of Professional Studies, and Brenda Webb of Soldier and Jennifer Willey of Morehead, College of Arts and Sciences.

Following commencement, Dr. and Mrs. Grote will host a reception for graduates and their families.

Commencement activities will begin at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday with the traditional pinning ceremony for graduates of the radiologic technology program in Reed Hall Auditorium.

A rehearsal for degree candidates participating in commencement is scheduled for 6 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 5, in Button Auditorium.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--WMKY, member supported radio from Morehead State University, is reviving a dying art--the art of radio drama.

WMKY will air a radio adaptation of the stage-play "Braids," by Kentucky author George Ella Lyon at 7 p.m. Friday, Aug. 5, and Sunday, Aug. 7.

WMKY Program Director Susan Westfall said that 90.3 FM decided to air the radio drama because of its regional interest. "It's a stage-play written by an author from the region and the production makes good use of regional facilities and regional talent. It's a quality production with regional impact."

"Braids" tells the story of Emma, a young woman struggling to define herself among the conflicting views of her parents and her two sets of grandparents. The characters talk to the audience largely in monologues, telling their opinions of the other characters.

"Each monologue is a story within a story," said Lyon. "While they're telling anecdotes, things that really happened, the subtext is their position in the family and their way of making the family work."

The Lexington author said the original title "Braids Too Tight to Sing," seemed to be a good image of Emma's dilemma. "She's so bound up in these people that she can't find her own voice."

Nationally known actress and National Public Radio commentator Jo Carson plays Lou, one of the grandmothers. Carson said radio drama is a challenge for a stage actress.

"You have to make everything you think, everything you feel, happen in your voice," she said. "All your training, every bit of drama training you get in your whole life, goes in just the opposite direction. It has to do with your whole body and making it work that way. But when you have to take it back down again, and make it work with only a tiny part of what you'd been using, it becomes an entirely different problem."

WEKU-FM and WEKH, public radio stations at Eastern Kentucky University, received grants from the Kentucky Arts Council and the Kentucky Foundation for Women to produce the radio version of "Braids."

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Dr. Stephen S. Taylor, vice president for academic affairs at Morehead State University, has been elected to the board of directors of the American Association of University Administrators.

Dr. Taylor was elected to the 30-member board by the 810 members of the AAUA for a term ending spring 1991.

Composed of college and university presidents, vice presidents, deans, directors and department chairs, the AAUA was chartered in 1970 as a non-profit, educational organization designed to promote the professional development of higher education administrators and to establish ethical and professional standards for the administrators and the institutions.

Dr. Taylor has been assigned by the AAUA to work primarily with a task force on university planning and leadership development.

He is the first administrator from any college or university in Kentucky to be elected to the AAUA board of directors.

A member of the MSU faculty since 1973, Dr. Taylor holds the faculty rank of professor of education and has served the University as executive director of academic support systems, director of academic assessment and evaluation and acting vice president for student development.

Dr. Taylor received his bachelor's degree from Glenville (W. Va.) State College, his master's degree from Stetson University and his doctorate from Florida State University.

His professional affiliations include the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development and the American Association of Adult and Continuing Education. Dr. Taylor was the recipient of the Kentucky Department of Education Distinguished Achievement Award in 1979.

A native of Walton, W. Va., he is married to the former Carolyn Dotson of Pennsboro, W. Va. They have two children. He is the son of Mrs. Dorothy Taylor of Spencer, W. Va.
