Requires that houses used for the storage of Hemp shall be closed at sun-down and remain closed until sun-rise, and imposes a penalty of ten dollars for any vic lations of this provision, and the same find upon any person for entering such houses after night, or at any time with a light matches or fire, or for leaving the doors or
