

ONE expected anything great to come from Galilee or Judea or from Bethlehem. In the sprawling Roman Empire these places belonged to the despised outposts.


Neither prophets nor presidents are necessarily born in palaces. The greatest of all was born in a stable. The decisive changes in history do not necessarily begin in parliaments nor on battle fields. In some unsuspecting corner of the world the Lord may at this very moment be grooming a leader and shaping another era. If we had eyes to see, we would not by-pass the world's outposts.

"The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight," said Phillips Brooks of the village of Bethlehem. A few shepherds believed, and three kings from the East. But the great world of Rome took no heed. The Person and the Event which divided the calendar of the world elicited none of the world's applause that night, soon two thousand years ago.

But the world has never been the same since then.

Light and Darkness



If we walk in the light, we shall want to bring the light of the World to all men.



The Good Samaritan

THE lawyer asked, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied with the well-known story of the "Good Samaritan" who, unlike the priest and the Levite, stopped to help the wounded stranger. Finished with the story, Jesus turned the question around and asked the lawyer who, of the three, was a neighbor to the man in need.

We dare not classify people and say, "This one is my neighbor and that one is not." In Christ's company all men become my neighbor and brother, and I have the mandate to be a neighbor and brother to all men. Of course I have an immediate responsibility to my child who is in fact my neighbor under my roof. But I also have a neighbor's responsibility to people of Asia and Africa whom I will never see, and to the family in the next block whose skin and politics and religion are unlike mine.

We tend to form cozy clubs to escape our neighbor. We like to be with people who are neither much richer nor poorer than we. We gravitate to people who belong to the same party and church as we. The others I like better at a distance—perhaps even in the ditch along the road. I may even justify my passing them up with the thought that if that's the way they like to live—in the ditch—why should I disturb them? Or, at least let "their own kind" help them!

A great peril to any congregation is that we may narrow our concern only to those who are neighbors by other standards than Christ's. His only standard is "Does he need a neighbor?" If he does, you are delegated by Christ to be it. You have no choice . . . if you want to be in Christ's company, that is!


The Sensitive Fisherman

OVE IS the first law for the fisherman. In fact, it is more than the first law, it is the only law. To love is more important than catching fish—or men. Jesus summarized the whole command of God in the simple mandate—love! We are to love God—and our brother. We are not to love God in order to wheedle things from God, nor are we to love man in order to pry him loose from one life and convert him to another. Love in itself is the totality of His command. Whether God gives us pleasure or pain, we are to love Him; whether man leaves his sinful ways or not, we are to love Him.

Any decent father will love his child no matter what that child does. In my love of my child, I want him to find the fullness of life; whether he finds it or not, I will love him still. I grieve when he fails or when he slips into ways of shame, but I love him still.

When Jesus invites us to be fishers of men, He makes sure that we have the kind of love which will continue steadfast whether we capture men or not. If they rebuke us, despise us or scorn us, we dare not drop them, forget them or hate them. They are all God's children for whom Christ died. We sorrow if they refuse the life which the Lord offers them, but we love them still. Only then can we be entrusted with the sensitive art of being fishers of men.

In the deepest sense, only God by the working of His Holy Spirit captures men. We are but to love, to witness this love in word and work, to extend His invitation, to seek ways and means to serve our brothers. Then are we in the company of the great Fisher of men.


What nonsense! Does a man change God when he buys a new model automobile? Is his wife outmoded now that he lives in the atomic age?

We believe that Jesus of Nazareth, who stooped to earth

We believe that Jesus of Nazareth, who stooped to earth to become man, is indeed God of God. Whether He stills the waves on a little lake in Palestine or holds the billions of stars in their orbits or comes silently to ease my aching heart —whatever He does in this vast and wonderful universe, He does it as the Lord of all.

Einstein had the same need of the same God as Abraham. Although our sense of distance has changed, the twentieth century astronomer joins the Psalmist of old in the same rhapsody, "The heavens declare the glory of God. ... "And the modern father who loses his son has need of the same God of Comfort to Whom David cried when he lost his son Absalom.

Let us not be beguiled by change. There is a changeless. One. The Suffering God

HY do the innocent suffer? This is the cry of mankind echoing down the generations. A child at birth is misshapen in body and mind. A young man, "gleam-faced, pure-eyed, strong-willed and high-hearted" is struck down by a passing truck. A mother devoted to her little family is swept off by polio. Is not undeserved suffering or death a defiance of all justice? Must we not protest to God and pit ourselves against it?

Albert Camus says that the Cross is no answer nor comfort; to have the Lord also suffer and die innocently is only to compound the problem.

Yet, to millions upon millions of people these many years the Cross of Jesus has been both answer and comfort. It has been so not because Someone greater than we is caught in the same unjust and miserable net, but because by His suffering and death He dealt a deathblow to suffering. In fact the Sinless One died not for the innocent, but for the non-innocent, the fallen, human race in which we are all trapped, so that in the end we are all saved from even the final just punishment of our offenses through Him. This strange exchange, the death of Christ for the sins of the world, can only be grasped and accepted by faith. For anyone else it must indeed only compound the riddle of suffering, being both an offense and a stumbling-block.

We move into the period of Lent, the most somber period of the church year. We follow the Lord on His way to Jerusalem, into the courts of Pontius Pilate, up the winding way to Golgotha's hill. We observe Him denied and betrayed, scorned and scourged and at last nailed to the cross. Deep cries to deep, and we are haunted by the lines of the spiritual, "It was for me He died upon the tree." And there wells up within us the beginnings of a rhapsody, "In the Cross of Christ I glory."

Justice and Law


E BELIEVE that all men have a conscience. This is a built-in sense of right and wrong, justice and injustice. Conscience may be distorted or defied, but through it God keeps troubling and guiding all men. Even a thief may have a sense of honor with his fellow-thieves.

In the final analysis, governments are built upon the fact of conscience. If men were like tigers, society would be one huge jungle. With conscience, men build governments of law. Even when the lust for power drives men to lunacy, there is a resident justice among the masses which limits and eventually destroys them.

Government has become big business, and its operation very complex. Experts are needed, but the basic question of justice is still in the hands of all men. G. K. Chesterton, commenting on the jury system, says, "When civilization wants a library catalogued or the solar system discovered, or any trifle of that kind, it uses its specialists. But when it wishes anything done which is really serious, it collects twelve of its ordinary men standing around. The same thing was done, if I remember right, by the Founder of Christianity."

Justice is serious business, and if we want good government to survive the threat of the jungle, every citizen is required to pledge himself to the use of his conscience. A horde of pressures on the outside will seek to deflect him, intimidate him and blind him from his allegiance to justice and law. An equally insidious attack from within his own selfish heart will seek to mislead him. Against these foes man must exercise eternal vigilance.

But he needs more than vigilance. He will need the help and correction from God Himself.

Death Is a Fraud

EATH is real, but he is a pretender. Death is an enemy, but he is defeated. He seems to hold the field, but the moment he is finished he too dies. His is not the victory!

We move these weeks in the memory of that journey to Golgotha's hill. Jesus was moving step by step to His death. His disciples warned and protested. They could not deflect Him. It was as if He were possessed.

Peter could not see beyond death, nor could John, nor Andrew. Even we, we who know the triumphant sequel of Easter, even we have difficulty ripping the mask off death and seeing life as the victor.

The entire drama of Lent builds up, not to Friday, but to an Easter Sunday. Jesus died not as a tragic hero, resisting His enemies to the end, but as a determined Savior whose death was to save the world from sin and death. He elected to die, for you and for me. By His death He shattered forever the power of sin and gave death itself the blow of death. His resurrection on the third day was the soaring climax, the glorious clue that exploded upon the earth to give all life its meaning. Because He lives, we too shall live! This is the irresistible conclusion of our faith.

Death remains an enemy, however. A mother dies, and the empty place at the table shrieks of the power of death. A child dies, and the little, unused shoes stab us with the power of death. But death is a pretender, a fraud. For mother and child have both gone to inherit a resurrection—a rising again—into a life of unending wonder and glory, with death forever gone. This is the gift of His Resurrection.

Our days, too, lead on to death. But death is done. Life is eternal.

The Place of Power


REHIND Pilate is Rome, the power of world empire. Behind Jesus is God, the Kingdom Eternal.



The Word of Truth

JESUS said, "I am . . . the truth." It is in Him, the living Word, that we find the clue to all truth. His message of salvation is the key to understanding both life and death. And His message centers in the cross.

Men die. They struggle to live, but they die. They protest the grim reaper, but they die.

The Lord of lords died too. He neither protested nor resisted. He had chosen to die—for the sins of the world. The cross belonged neither to Pilate nor to Caiaphas. The cross was His own.

It was in the long plan of God that His only Son would redeem the world. Why it had to be a cross remains a mystery. But there was no one else and there was no other way. Man could die but man could not by his death save himself from his sin and guilt. Only the Son of God could die and save.

The sneering mob that Friday cried, "If you are the Christ, save yourself." Failing to move Him, they taunted Him, "He saved others, himself he cannot save." And this cry of derision became a prophetic insight. For in saving us, He could not escape the cross and death. This was payment for our sins, redemption from guilt and shame, victory over death.

Can we hear this Word, unchanged? Do we pass this cross by, unmoved? Do we face this death of Christ as if we were attending some theater drama? Is it as if we were at the movies and needed not weep over the hero's death, because we knew all along that when the cameras were done with him, he went home to supper? Christ died for you and me because He loved us and wanted us, our sins forgiven, to share an imperishable Kingdom with Him. This is His Word to us!

EVERYONE is somebody's hero. Even a debased person will have some unsuspecting urchin imitating him. No one can escape the terrifying responsibility of being a shepherd of the sheep. No man lives to himself alone.

When Jesus put Peter to the test, He did not quiz him on his aptitudes or skills. He asked but one question, "Lovest thou me?" Three times He asked it, and three times Peter replied, "Thou knowest that I love thee."

And Jesus commissioned him, "Feed my sheep."

The world does not want for skills. We have enough knowledge in psychology, physiology and technology to make a veritable heaven on earth—if our skills are matched with love. The hand of love, though clumsy and inept, will do more good for the world than many hands of lust and greed, however clever and skilled.

To be captured by the great Shepherd of love, Jesus our Lord, remains the towering credential—if we are to be guides for the generations that follow us. The wisdom that comes from love is the wisdom of the ages.

All are eligible, for Jesus died for all, and His great heart of love is open to all. To let His love into our hearts will give us the Shepherd's heart and the Shepherd's wisdom.

Above the Turmoil


YOU will have trouble. In this life we will be tormented by fears, tragedies and death. There is no escape. Every path, however glorious, leads to a grave.

We walk in danger all the way. Our feet may slip and we may fall. But in the thick of danger, we have a peace. God holds our hand and lifts us when we fall. by choice. We elect to get married and establish homes. As we stand before the altar to pledge ourselves to one another, we become a home. When children come, we are ushered into the home's full responsibility.

Civilizations rise and fall. Rarely does a country fall to an enemy from the outside if its homes are strong. They need not be wealthy, nor even wise. They must be *good* homes, with fathers and mothers who love.

A good home is not one that escapes the tragedies of life. The sinfulness of man exacts its price in sorrows and grief everywhere. No home can hope for total exemption. The test comes in meeting the limitations of life. When plans lie broken, does the home rally in forgiveness and love? When temptations strike, do the members of the home close ranks in charity and courage to sustain and overcome?

We do not want for wealth. Few homes in our land go hungry. Thousands are insecure and fearful, however, for want of responsible love. Parents forget their promises to love one another until death. Their children grow up haunted by their parents' delinquencies, robbed of their rightful environment of affection. However lavish a father may be toward his son, if he forgets to love his son's mother he will have betrayed his son.

The well-spring of love is with God. To seek Him is to seek love. To send one's child to church is not enough. Better that father and mother seek the fountain of love themselves, and that their child learn from them and their lives the love of a Heavenly Father.

We may be driven from the land, but we have God.


Churches may be closed and Bibles burned, but we have God:

Education for Suffering

E SPEAK glibly of education for leadership. Christ never called leaders; He issued a call for disciples, for followers. And He prescribed that a follower should be like his Master.


Jesus, the great Master, is the suffering Servant. He is the Christ of the cross. He came to earth for the precise purpose of suffering. He calls His disciples to the role of suffering.

We suffer, to be sure. We suffer when the stockmarket dips, or when the wrong party wins the election. We suffer when dictators threaten our peace and prosperity. We suffer when the diagnosis is cancer.

But these sufferings are all-men's sufferings. The disciple must suffer as Jesus suffered. When He was wronged He suffered because the wrongdoers, whom He loved, were damaging their souls. When He was crucified He suffered because His crucifiers, whom He loved and for whom He was dying, failed to understand that the Kingdom was theirs. When He was hated and rejected and reviled, His sufferings were not pity for Himself but an infinite pity for those whose passions blinded them from the truth.

When a son strikes his mother, the mother's sorrow is not the sting in her cheek but the great ache in her heart for her son. The hurt in the heart of God is like that, the eloquent language of His love for us.

Many of our fine young men and women will be tomorrow's leaders. But the evidence of the church's success in their education will lie in their discipleship—in the love they have for God and man—in their role as servants—in their capacity for high suffering.


That Children May Know

NE generation builds upon another. Civilization is a cumulative heritage. It may also be a cumulative liability. For the life of man is a winding path. Let one generation miss the markers, and children and grandchildren may wander aimless and lost. No one can relax his vigilance; the jungle lurks ready to swallow its pilgrims.

The Christian faith is both a heritage and a discovery. A father cannot pass the faith on to his son as he can a farm. For in every generation the children must reappropriate the faith of the fathers and make it their own. Life with God comes fresh and new, as a radical discovery, to every man. It is never second-hand. On the other hand, if the children are to believe, they must hear; and if they shall hear, their fathers must speak. Each generation is under the awesome commission to witness, to proclaim, to confess, to teach.

This is as important for the fathers as for their children, for to live the faith must be transmitted. It cannot survive, bottled up secretly in the heart. It must be on the move, reaching out to the uttermost parts of the world. And on the way we find the children at our elbows. Many a Sunday school teacher who by word and life has set out to articulate the faith to a class of children has thereby found his own faith grow warm and strong.

The long future belongs to the teacher. The present moment in history may appear to be shaped by men of power—business tycoons, labor leaders, prime ministers and generals. But the march of ideas, the quiet ferment of basic beliefs, will shape tomorrow's world. What is far more important, the teacher of God's Word holds the key to eternity for the children who hear him.

On Reading the Bible

HE BIBLE is everyman's book. It is God's book. In it and through it, God comes to men. It has inspired thousands of other books. But no book can replace it. It is the fountain that feeds all streams.

It is a closed book for many. It need not be, if you will follow some simple rules.


First, you must open the book and read. It can do you no good if it only graces your bookshelves or your end-tables.

Second, you must ask the Lord to speak to you as you read. You read not out of curiosity, not to obtain information, nor even to find comfort. You cannot prescribe to God. Let Him address you as He wills. If He disturbs you, good! If He inspires you, good! If He chastises you, good! You open the book to meet God, on His terms.

Third, you must prepare to follow Him. His will for you may not immediately leap from the pages. You must search as one peers into the darkness for light. Much of what you read you may scarcely understand. But some things you will understand. And what you do grasp, you do. This is the key to discipleship.

There are many valuable helps for reading the Scriptures. Throughout the centuries many devout and wise disciples have written down their discoveries. They share these with you, through books and magazines. This is one of the blessings of fellowship in the communion of saints.

But there is no substitute for your own search. The Holy Spirit will teach you, as you come to the Book. And, if you are willing, He will empower you day by day to follow the Lord in glad obedience. For this Book is both knowledge and power.

The Preacher


JESUS preached to the people. Hearing Him, they went out to preach to others about Him. Their witness became recorded in little books. Twenty-seven of these were finally assembled into the New Testament. These are the apostolic witness. We believe that the Holy Spirit who inspired the prophets to write the Old Testament is the same Holy Spirit who inspired the evangelists and the apostles to write the New Testament. Together these books are therefore the Word of God, and are the sure guide for man in all matters of faith and life.

God did not call your pastor to preach his own words but the Word of the Lord. He is a carrier, an ambassador, who comes with a Word from the King. Your preacher may be clever and eloquent. He may be able to speak effectively on many subjects. When he enters the pulpit, however, he does not speak for himself, nor would you want him to do so. He brings you the Word of God.

And what a Word it is! It cuts like a two-edged sword, leaving you no comfort in your sins. It brings you the mercy and forgiveness of Christ, healing your wounds of guilt and remorse. It lifts you on wings of song, so that your heart bursts in thanksgiving and praise. It stirs your will to a new and strong obedience, so that your feet find paths of daily service.

No word of the preacher could do this; only the Word of God.

Each time we come within earshot of the preacher's voice we should pray that through his words the piercing and comforting Word of God might reach us. If we pray earnestly and listen devoutly, God will speak and we will hear.

Dare You Be Alone?


oneliness is the pain of being alone. Solitude is the glory of being alone. There is a world of difference between loneliness and solitude.

Nature is no cure for loneliness. Whether you sit on the crest of the hill at sunset drinking in the riot of autumn color that flanks the river or whether you watch the ominous roll of a tornado on the summer prairie or whether you stand fascinated and terrified as a snake swallows a croaking frog, you will still be flooded with a melancholy and a sadness. Nature can do no more.

The elemental loneliness of man is rooted in two basic life situations in which he must of necessity be alone—his guilt and his death. Try as you will, you cannot share your guilt with another. You may do as Adam who passed the buck to Eve, but the attempt will fail. You stand before God alone, with your guilt. Nor can you approach death in company; in death you drift out beyond the reach of the most loving arms that seek to hold you.

There is but One who can be with you in your guilt and in your death. Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for you, stands at your side to take away your guilt. And in the hour of death, when all others have faded away, he looms up to take you by the hand and companion you through the valley.

If you have Christ you are really never alone, and loneliness need never overcome you. Solitude replaces loneliness. And solitude is rich with peace. For solitude is in fact the glory of leaving behind the noise and distractions of the many in order to be alone—with him. Then even nature, in all its forms, becomes but the dwelling place of the Almighty, the warm and rich chambers where a man walks with his Lord.




If God were but an idea, you lose nothing by being an atheist. If God had created this world and then had left it for His home among the stars, you could well forget about Him. If he had only redeemed you on a Cross and then had left you to your own resources, you could well despair.

But God is abroad. He who created and redeemed is at work within us and among us. He has not left us nor forsaken us. This is the great message of Pentecost, the truth of the Holy Spirit. He is powerfully at work to comfort, to restore, to reshape and to keep us for Himself.

How desperately we need this reassurance! We are surrounded by powerful forces of caprice and evil that threaten to destroy us. We are tempted to give up. Who knows when a bomb will end it all? How can dictatorships, revolutions and crimes be stopped? What can I do to rise above my anxieties and fears?

Left to ourselves in this hour, we would have little heart to go on. Hope would flicker and die.

But we are not left to ourselves. God is here. He has not abandoned this world of His. Nor does He abandon His children. Even now, unseen to the historian, He may be shaping the events of nations into new and unexpected blessings. And whatever happens to nations, He is at work within our hearts, if we let Him in, to give us strength and peace.

If faith Be Sone

To in someone. You must not tell me to "hang on" unless you give me something to hold.


Much meaningless trash has been written about "faith." Faith is hanging on—to something. Faith is trusting—in someone. You cannot have faith in faith, for faith itself is an act.

Nor is it enough to say "Have faith in God." For you must have something to say of God. Is God but a vague power, like electricity? Is God but a grand idea, like beauty? Is God a remote being in the sky, like a sleepy monarch?

Jesus told his disciples, "You believe in God, believe also in me." And he added, "He that hath seen me hath seen the Father." God takes shape in Jesus Christ. Without Jesus, we would blunder about with no real image of God. It is for this reason that in two thousand years of history millions of people have so identified God with Jesus Christ that they have said of this man from Nazareth—he is God, Very God of Very God.

You come to this House of Worship today because you have acted on the supposition that God is indeed the God you know in the Person of Jesus Christ. This act is your faith. What Jesus said and did become the cornerstones of your faith. You believe in him! You trust him to forgive your sins and to open the doors of an eternal Kingdom for you.

If Jesus be gone, you cannot "hang on." Everything in your faith centers in him. You would reach into the thin air of furtive speculation if it were not that in reaching you find him. And you find him, because he is there reaching for you. This is the strange character of faith. In this faith you can say with assurance, "I know him whom I have believed."

Jesus Christ


EN MAY FAIL, even the noble and the great, for all have feet of clay. The Church may fail, for it is made up of men who are weak. The wonder is that despite its shortcomings, the Church has been a means of blessing during two thousand years. The secret is that in its weakness it has always had a strong Lord.

The chief errand of Jesus Christ, when He came to earth, was not to make men strong and good. His great reason for coming was to atone for their sins and to provide them forgiveness. Receiving forgiveness, men's hearts were opened to new power. But evil is stubborn, and even the best of men continue to be beguiled by its power. Until the end of life, every man will need daily the forgiveness of Christ.

It is the glory of the Church that within it men may find the forgiving Christ, the One who alone is strong and good.

Nor does He ever withdraw. There have been times in the history of the Church when His message of salvation has been muffled and even distorted. The words of men have replaced the Word of God. The Church has then failed, but He never fails. Even in those dark hours, when the indifference of men's lives and the errors of men's teaching have obscured the glory of the Savior, Christ has still broken through. In each generation the Church has been a place where men are captured by Jesus Christ.

You may not understand the language of its scholars nor may you be inspired by the lives of its members. But the Church is Christ's, and through His Word He invades the hearts of men to be their Savior and their Lord.

PERHAPS you're on your own—or think you are. Actually, no one is. Everyone works for someone. What would a doctor do without patients or a lawyer without clients or a teacher without students or a farmer without consumers? The president of the United States has almost two hundred million employers; in addition, many other nations count on his judgment to serve them in their pursuit of peace and prosperity.


We often turn things around, however. A doctor may use his patients to increase his fame, the lawyer may use his clients to increase his wealth. To make certain we would understand this role and would have the disposition to do it, He sent His only Son to the earth as a Servant of all. There is now no escape. If God Himself would be a servant, certainly we, His creatures, could not disdain to be servants.

THE home is supremely the Kingdom's workshop. In no other arena of life is it as possible to develop and discipline the qualities that belong to heaven. Neither the shop nor the office nor the field will test a man as will his home.


If a home fails, it becomes the nearest thing to hell on earth; if it succeeds, it can be a prologue of heaven.

Neither the Kingdom nor the home can flourish on rules. Each must capture the freedom of an expansive and outgoing love. If the members of a home live short of the rules, each getting by at the expense of the others, the home becomes a breeding place for neurotics. If its members play by the rules, each doing his fair share but no more and no less, the home becomes a cold and heartless place. Only when each member, father and mother and brother and sister, live far beyond the rules in constant vigilance to serve one another does the home become a radiant refuge.

Jesus came to remake us. If He succeeds with me, I will not have become a great singer or a great speaker necessarily. I will have become a *servant*. This is the end-product of His work of redemption and sanctification.

No home can succeed unless it be made up of a company of servants. It may not be important that the father might have become a great novelist had he had different opportunities; the important thing to God is that the father became a great servant. He assumed loving responsibility for the care and welfare of his family. It is of little loss to the world that the mother did not become an operatic singer, if she became a great mother, pouring out her life in daily concern for her family.

The crowning achievement of the family is that each, as a servant, has helped the other find his way to the Lord, the giver of life and of love.

Am I Somebody?






In order that we might the better be able to work, He gives us rest from the drain of energies which fears, hatreds, guilts and worries cause us. He gives rest for our souls!


