### Southern Economic Conditions Section 1-Economic Resources

Section 1—Economic Accounces

Since Kentucky has become rightfully known as "The Gateway to the South" Southerns economic conditions are of especial interest to Kentucky. These conditions are of interest also to Morehead and Rowan countians as they live on a highway that has a vital connection with southern traffic—Route 60. Herewith is the first section of the report as presented to the President of the United States:

In the South, as elsewhere, the two most In the South, as elsewhere, the two most important economic endowments are its people and its physical resources. The 1937 census estimates showed that the 13 Southern States had more than 43 million persons. While this population is descended from the peoples of virtually every country of the world, a larger percentage derives from early American stock than that of any other region in the United States; 97.8 per cent, according to the last census, was native born; 71 per cent white, and 29 per cent colored.

The birth rate in the South exceeds that of any other region, and the excess of births

The birth rate in the South exceeds that of any other region, and the excess of births over deaths makes the South the most fertile source for repleating the population of the country as whole is becoming stationary, there is a continuous stream of people leaving the South to work in other parts of the Nation-greatly in excess of the corresponding migration to the South.

The South is a huge crescent embracing 52 million acres in 13 States from Virginia on the east to Texas on the west. It has widely varying topographic conditions—wast prairies, wooded plains, fertile valleys, and the highest mountains in the eastern United States.
