MOREHEAD, Ky.--"This is a week of ideas, potential, possibilities that are only limited by the ideas you can come up with and your own personal dedication to those ideas."

This was the message delivered by Bob Babbage, state auditor, when he addressed the more than 300 high school seniors from across the state at the first general session of Kentucky Boys' State on the Morehead State University campus (June 2).

Not only this week but throughout your life, my wish for you is the great challenge of leadership, Babbage said. "Each and everyone has something to contribute and the challenge of leadership is to find that mark," he said. "The second challenge is to find those special points within your own mind and give them away--that is leadership."

Amidst a rain storm where the sounds of thunder were sometimes louder than his voice over the microphone, Babbage acknowledged the sound as acceptance of his remarks and continued to tell stories from his life that had special significance.

Remarking that prior to the ninth grade he had not been "much of an athlete or a good student," Babbage told the group how he had believed he would bumble through college, shoot for "C's," go into the military and then go to work for his father. But reality--in the form of a talk with his father--forced him to reevaluate the situation. "That summer for the first time in several years, I got an "A," he said.

Babbage would continue to get involved and was chosen to attend Boys' State the first week of June 1968. He recalled the impact made by Martin Luther King's death earlier that year and how he and fellow Boys' Staters watched television and followed the happenings that surrounded the death of Robert Kennedy. "He gave the ultimate sacrifice of leadership," Babbage said.

Reminding the young men that the friendships made during this week will remain for life, Babbage told of a call from a fellow Boys' Stater last week when he won the Democratic nomination for secretary of State. "You may have won the election by the biggest majority, but I beat you at Boys' State," he quoted his friend.

Urging the group to make some commitments to get the most out of life, Babbage said there were many ways one could make a contribution in public service. "It doesn't matter whether you are an architect, dentist, work in a shoe store or manage a McDonald's you can still serve," he said. "The condition of politics is not as good as it can be and we can do better in Kentucky."

"The fall election, which I am about to enter, will not have the debate of issues that you will see in five days at Boys' State," Babbage said.

Babbage said he would like to see an election channel added to the cable system for the months of May and October; would like to make voter registration easy by making the process available when one renews their driver's license, and would push for a project called "Students Voting" whereby students would get in the habit of voting with their parents and would know what to do when the time was right.

Fielding questions from the audience, Babbage said there was a place for show horses and work horses in our society because both serve a purpose. "The experience of leadership in its best form is to learn the process of taking a great idea from A to Z, set goals, get your hands dirty, and see it finished."

When asked about the mudslinging that took place in the recent primary election, Babbage said he had run for political office seven times and "would rather not run or lose the election" rather than participate. "We are driving people away from the polls and from public service," said the grandson of former Kentucky governor Keen Johnson.

Kentucky Boys' State is sponsored by the American Legion. Throughout the week, the delegates will learn about the state's political system by developing their own two-party system; electing state and city officials; and introducing, enacting and debating bills as in the Kentucky General Assembly.

Elected state officials, including governor and lieutenant governor, will be announced on Wednesday, June 6, and on Thursday they will travel to Frankfort to meet their real life counterparts. Wednesday's program also will include retired U.S. Army Col. Jerry Cecil of Hazel Green as a guest speaker. Cecil is a graduate of the U. S. Military Academy at West Point.

A graduation awards ceremony will conclude the week's activities on Friday, June 7. U.S. Rep. Carroll Hubbard, 1st District of Kentucky, will be the keynote speaker for the luncheon, scheduled to begin at 11 a.m. in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--"Stand up for what you believe in and don't let anybody tell you that you can not accomplish anything."

This is the advice Lt. Gov. Brereton Jones passed on to the Boys' State delegates when he addressed the group today at their 51st session being held this week (June 2-7) at Morehead State University.

"If you work hard enough you can achieve your goal," Jones said. Describing the path along the way as being full of criticism and envy from others, he quoted from former President Teddy Roosevelt who said to ignore critics and remember that those who strive valiantly to achieve are always winners even in defeat.

He encouraged the more than 300 high school seniors from across the state to always take the "high road" and they would achieve success. "Here you can get from point A to point B very quickly because there are not a lot of people up there," he said. Jones added that the bottom is crowded and you find a lot of bad things there.

Using examples from his life, Jones said the key to making it in the world is to stay on the high road, letting your word be your bond and keeping a positive attitude. He credits this philosophy for him being elected the Democratic nominee for governor during the recent primary election.

Jones expressed his concern for the low voter turnout in the May primary, where only 39 percent of the Democrats and 29 percent of the Republicans voted.

"The average Kentuckian is turned off by the current political system," he said, declaring that it "stinks" and negative ads reflect badly on the person doing the mudslinging. He has adopted Norman Vincent Peale's power of positive thinking--to always think of how you will make things work instead of how to tear things down.

Earlier in the day, Jerry Cecil, retired U.S. Army Colonel, told the group that success was as easy as ABC--ability, breaks and courage. Reminding the Boys' State delegates that they had ability or they wouldn't be here, he urged them to look closely because breaks were sometimes disguised and to develop courage to say yes or no at the right time.

Kentucky Boys' State, sponsored by the American Legion, is a practical experience in state and local government. Throughout the week, the delegates learn about the state's two party system and elect state officials who will go to Frankfort on Thursday, June 6, to meet their counterparts.

A graduation awards ceremony will conclude the week's activities on Friday, June 7. U.S. Rep. Carroll Hubbard, 1st District of Kentucky, will be the keynote speaker for the luncheon, scheduled to begin at 11 a.m. in the Adron Doran University Center.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's Big Sandy Extended Campus Center in Prestonsburg now has both a physical location and an administrative head.

Dr. Roland L. Burns, MSU professor of geography, has been named interim director of the extended campus center which will be in its Highlands Plaza Shopping Center location when classes begin this fall.

Dr. Burns, a native of Ashland and a member of MSU's faculty since 1969, will assume the post Aug. 1. James Ratcliff of Prestonsburg Community College, will continue to serve as site coordinator.

"Jim Ratcliff's assistance to MSU in the past has been immeasurable and his help especially during this transition period will be extremely valuable," said Dr. John C. Philley, interim vice president for academic affairs.

"Dr. Burns is familiar with the area and people. We are truly pleased that he has accepted this new role of administrator. Among his primary responsibilities will be identifying specific course needs and promoting the extended campus center's programs within the region," said Dr. Philley.

An active conservationist, Dr. Burns earned his Doctor of Education degree in higher education administration from the University of Southern Mississippi. His work in conservation has brought him numerous honors.

The shopping plaza owners (Paran Management Co. of Cleveland, Ohio,) are projecting that the renovations will be finished in time for the start of classes on Aug. 19, according to Porter Dailey, MSU vice president for administration and fiscal services.

"With these two events, the University's physical presence in the Big Sandy area is nearing reality," said MSU President C. Nelson Grote. "MSU is most appreciative of the support given to us by Prestonsburg Community College in providing us instructional space over the years. In return for that support, PCC will be welcome to use our space when it is available. Of course, we may still need auxiliary classroom space at PCC.

"Without the cooperation of PCC and other area educators, the Big Sandy Extended Campus Center might never have been realized," the president said.

(MORE)

"With almost 400 students enrolled at the center last fall, our growth in the Big Sandy area has been phenomenal. We plan to increase our course offerings this fall and will further expand the schedule next spring," Dr. Grote said.

The University has leased 14,250 square feet in the shopping plaza at a cost of \$9 per square foot, plus utilities. The space will give the MSU center 10 classrooms, five offices, lounge area and a lobby/reception area. Two computer lab areas, one of which is expected to be equipped this fall, are planned for the classroom area.

In addition to the director, the Big Sandy Extended Campus Center's administrative staff will include a secretary and the part-time coordinator of regional student services Debra Salyer. While MSU faculty members will continue to commute to the center, there will be some resident faculty in business, education and nursing.

In fall 1986, Morehead State University added upper-division undergraduate courses--primarily junior and senior level--to the schedule of graduate courses traditionally taught at Prestonsburg. Working closely with PCC, the University sought to identify the needs of those people with two years of college but who could not leave the area to take additional work toward a four-year degree program. MSU officials stress that they will continue to complement PCC's offerings, not duplicate or compete with the community college.

In September 1989, the Council on Higher Education designated MSU's regional site in Prestonsburg as an Extended Campus Center. With CHE approval to offer formal undergraduate and graduate degree programs in education at the center, MSU also offers other coursework in a variety of areas and is seeking formal degree program status for three of these--accounting, management, and the registered nurses track of the B.S.N. degree.

MSU officials project that the center's direct operating costs--excluding equipment, furnishings and teaching costs--will be approximately \$225,000 during 1991-92. Approximately \$132,000 will come from a 1990 General Assembly appropriation, with the remainder from the University's budget.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's Presidential Search Committee has hired an executive search firm, Heidrick and Struggles, Inc., to help in identifying the University's next president.

MSU's current president, Dr. C. Nelson Grote, announced last year that he would retire on June 30, 1992.

The Chicago-based firm will assist the search committee in developing an expanded pool of potential candidates, in reviewing the applicants' credentials and in making thorough and confidential background checks.

Heidrick and Struggles will be paid one-third of the next president's first-year salary, up to a maximum of \$30,000, direct expenses such as travel and lodging, and indirect expenses such as postage not to exceed \$2,400, according to Wayne Martin, committee chair.

R. William Funk, managing partner of the firm's Southwest headquarters in Dallas, is the executive assigned to the MSU search.

The search committee has set an Oct. 4 deadline for applications and nominations. The pool of potential candidates will be narrowed to 20 by early November and a list of six finalists submitted to the Board of Regents by mid-December. The board expects to name Dr. Grote's successor by March 2 and the new president will assume the post July 1, 1992.

The nine-member search committee is composed of representatives from the board, faculty, staff, student body and alumni.







MOREHEAD, Ky.--After serving one-half of his two-year term as president of the Morehead State University Alumni Association, Ted Coakley of Harrison, Ohio, describes the experience as "exciting and challenging."

"I never realized that there would be so much involved," he said, explaining that there was more responsibility than he had ever anticipated. During the past year, he has addressed graduating classes at commencement ceremonies, hosted various University functions and served on numerous committees. His latest responsibility is membership on the Presidential Search Committee which will select a successor for MSU President C. Nelson Grote who plans to retire next year.

Through it all Coakley maintains this has been "one of the best years of my life."

In the coming year, Coakley plans to further the programs the Alumni Association has in progress and incorporate some new ones. "Looking for 'lost alumni' (those who have lost contact with the University) will continue to be a priority," he said. "We hope to find ways we can better serve our constituency and will constantly help the University in any way we can."

When his leadership role is completed next year, Coakley hopes he will be remembered as "a president for all alumni not just a chosen few. I encourage former students--who haven't thought of returning in years--to come back to the campus and I am always spreading the good word about the University to future students," he said.

This is the same message Coakley has delivered for the last 12 years since becoming a member of the Association's executive council. Encouraged by a former Association president and close friend, the late Marvin Rammelsberg of Cincinnati, Coakley returned to his alma mater in 1979 for the first time since graduation.

"We were enthralled with the University and the changes we saw," Coakley said remembering that visit back to campus in 1979 with his wife Janet, who is also an MSU alumnus. "At that point, I realized what MSU meant to me," he said. He and his wife accepted appointments to the Executive Council, thus beginning a joint commitment to the University.

As the years passed, the Coakleys became more involved in the activities of the Association. After holding various chairmanships, he was named second vice president in 1985, first vice president in 1987 and assumed the role of president in 1989.

"Janet has been my inspiration through this whole process," Coakley said. "In addition to providing encouragement, she has constantly kept me on track."

Coakley has seen many changes at MSU but is pleased to note that today's students are receiving the individualized attention and instruction he got while attending college in the '60s and '70s. "I want Morehead State to always serve students from Eastern Kentucky because they need a regional university," he said. "If student enrollment continues to increase, my wish is that academic facilities also will be enhanced to accommodate that growing number of students." In addition, he would like to see admissions standards at the University continue to be upgraded to attract a higher quality of student.

Believing that higher education is even more important today than 20 years ago, Coakley is constantly encouraging students to continue their schooling. His advice is:

"Determine where you want to go with your life; decide what sacrifices you are willing to make, and remember that flexibility is the name of the game."

He has instilled this same philosophy in his four daughters who have set career goals: Amy is an elementary education major at MSU; Susan is studying communications at Ohio State University; Laura, a 10th grader, plans to become a marine biologist and Sara, an eighth grader, wants to be an environmental scientist.

Prior to this position, he taught in the Cincinnati system, Bardstown (Ky.) and Georgetown, Ohio, where he developed the business department at Southern Hills Vocational School.

A member of several professional organizations, he earned a master's degree from the University of Cincinnati. He also has completed course work on a doctoral degree at UC.

Praising the educational training he obtained while in college, Coakley credits his current position to the degree he received at MSU. "I owe a lot to this University and I volunteer in any way I can to pay back that debt," he said.

"It's an honor to be president of the Alumni Association," he continued. "It's fun! And it's great to come back to campus."

Coakley wants to share the advantages of being involved in the Association with other graduates of Morehead State. He believes the coming year will be a productive one for him and the executive council members. He encourages input from all alumni by asking that anyone with suggestions or concerns call him collect at 513-376-2254. He is seeking those who want to get involved because, as he says, "We really do care!."





MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University has become the repository for what many consider an Appalachian scholar's dream come true with the gift of 72 boxes of Jesse Stuart papers valued at nearly \$56,000.

Announcement of the new additions to MSU's Jesse Stuart Collection came today during the opening luncheon for the annual Jesse Stuart Symposium held at the University.

The gift from the late author's wife, Naomi Deane Stuart, was transferred from the Jesse Stuart Foundation to the MSU Foundation and will be housed with the University's other Stuart holdings in the Jesse Stuart Room of the Camden-Carroll Library.

Among the new archival acquisitions are manuscripts of published and unpublished works, working papers, travel journals and other materials, including notes and other documents in Stuart's own handwriting.

The documents were appraised at \$55,800 by Dr. Jerry A. Herndon, curator of Murray State University's Jesse Stuart Collection.

Representing the Stuart family at the luncheon and other symposium activities were the writer's brother and sister-in-law, James and Betty Stuart, his sister, Glennis Stuart Liles and her daughter, Melissa Liles.

Earlier MSU President C. Nelson Grote told the Stuart Foundation board of directors that the University was indeed honored to be entrusted with so much of the distinguished author's memorabilia.

"Jesse Stuart was a gifted writer, whose stories and poetry paid homage to the people of Eastern Kentucky, their integrity, their work ethic and their love of family and land," Dr. Grote said. "Mrs. Stuart's gift will be an invaluable resource to Appalachian scholars and others."

According to Mrs. Judy Thomas, chairperson of the JSF board of directors, the Stuart Foundation plans to place other archival materials in the collection at MSU in the future, but it will retain all copyrights.

While MSU has a long and distinguished record of educational service to Eastern Kentucky, about a decade ago it began expanding its partnership role with the region into the areas of economic development, community service and cultural preservation.

"Certainly, one of the University's most significant contributions to cultural preservation has been its support of the Stuart Foundation," said Dr. James M. Gifford, the foundation's executive director. "MSU assisted with its incorporation as a public, charitable and educational foundation in 1979 and has actively supported its endeavors," Dr. Gifford added.

In addition to assigning an MSU staff member to serve as executive director of the Stuart Foundation, MSU hosts the Jesse Stuart Symposium each year in conjunction with the Appalachian Celebration, maintains the Jesse Stuart Room in the library and, in 1986, presented a dramatization of "The Thread That Runs So True," one of Stuart's best-loved novels.

In the mid-1980s, only 19 of Stuarts' 60 books were in print and now, with assistance from MSU and the Ashland Oil Foundation, the Stuart Foundation has been instrumental in getting more than half of his works reprinted so that new generations will have them to treasure.

MSU'S FIELD DAY: A SUCCESS STORY

Farmers across the nation are looking for ways to increase the marketability of their products and sheep producers in Kentucky are joining in the search.

Morehead (Ky.) State University, in cooperation with the Bath and Fleming County Cooperative Extension Services, recently sponsored a sheep and forage field day demonstration for area sheep producers to learn the latest techniques and marketing strategies.

More than 75 farmers attended the demonstration, according to Kathy Meyer, MSU sheep specialist and coordinator of the activities. She describes the afternoon as "very rewarding."

A sheep and horse farm in Fleming County was the site for hands-on experiences in all aspects of sheep production. The Kentucky Department of Agriculture's mobile forage testing van was on hand to provide free forage analysis while Dr. Jim Henning, a University of Kentucky forage specialist, discussed forage quality and alternatives.

Dr. Monty Chappell, UK sheep specialist, discussed the wool situation on the national level and provided tips on how the handling of wool could be improved.

A highlight of the day was a demonstration by Marilyn Fischer of Simpsonville, a Romney breeder. Young and old alike were amazed with expertise of Bliss, her border collie, as the sheep were herded from one area to another.

Meyer, who has been with MSU's sheep program for almost a year, is pleased with the progress she has seen but would like to see improvement in the wool and lamb market.

Kentucky has joined the Ohio Teleauction System, coordinated by the Producers Livestock Association of Columbus, Ohio, in the hopes of selling more lambs. By means of a conference call, buyers can make purchases and area sheep are taken to one of two local pick-up points for transportation to where they are needed.

"We are in probably the worst financial crisis the sheep industry has seen in many years," Meyer said. "Lamb prices and wool prices have fallen at the same time."

Because of this, the sheep shearing and wool grading process has become more important. "The buyer will often pay substantially more for a fleece that has received the proper care," Meyer said.

Assisting in finding sheep shearers is but one of the services Meyer provides farmers. She has a number of clients she visits on a regular basis and is only a phone call away should assistance be needed.

To keep everyone abreast of the latest news in the sheep industry, Meyer sends out a newsletter, "Sheep Bleats," to more than 150 producers and interested individuals. She also holds meetings on a bimonthly basis in the 15-county area she serves and recently gave a cooking demonstration to home economics county agents on ways to prepare lamb and purchase lamb from producers.

In addition to the more than 50 clients she serves, Meyer looks after the 35-head flock at MSU's Derrickson Agricultural Complex. This flock is used for teaching students enrolled in agriculture classes at MSU.

"There are not as many new shepherds now as there was when the program was new," Meyer explains, discussing how the MSU program has evolved in the last few years. More of her time is spent "polishing" the producers that got off to a good start. With funding from the Appalachian Regional Commission, the project was begun in 1985 to find a profitable industry for the local economy.

Kentucky has a good terrain for raising sheep, Meyer said, noting the large number of high, rolling hills. With the forecasted decline in production of tobacco in the early '80s, the state's chief crop, there were numerous farms that needed to find an alternative source of income.

Sheep, unlike other farm animals, are adaptable, she noted. "That's why they are called 'sustainable agriculture,' because they can make money during hard times as well as good times."

Prior to World War II, Eastern Kentucky was a major producer of sheep. After the war, the number of sheep herders decreased as a result of several factors that wiped out flocks and lack of interest.

Initially, MSU started its sheep program to utilize existing resources--empty tobacco barns, fields for grazing and available labor. With starter flocks provided through a lease/payback agreement, sheep producers began to emerge throughout the region.

Today's sheep producers have it much easier than shepherds of the 1940s. "Predators and disease played a major role in the survival of a flock," Meyer said. "These can now be controlled to a degree, but fluctuating market prices force one to stay aware of current market conditions."

The sheep industry is a full-time, year-round responsibility for Meyer. "There's lambing from October to March; weaning; shearing in spring, summer and fall; breeding, and most of the lambs are sold in May, June, September and October," she said.



MSU'S SHEEP PROGRAM GIVES ECONOMY A BOOST

Morehead (Ky.) State University, in cooperation with the Bath and Fleming County Cooperative Extension Services, recently sponsored a sheep and forage field day demonstration for area sheep producers to learn the latest techniques and marketing strategies.

More than 75 farmers attended the program, according to Kathy Meyer, MSU sheep specialist and coordinator of the activities. She described the ground swell of interest in the area as a positive force.

Meyer has been with MSU's sheep program for almost a year and is pleased with the progress she has seen; however, she is concerned about the market price of her product.

"This is probably the worst financial crisis the sheep industry has seen in many years," Meyer said. "Producers must exert a greater effort to make their lambs and wool more marketable."

For this reason, the sheep shearing and wool grading process has become more important. "The buyer will pay substantially more for a fleece that has received the proper care," Meyer said.

Finding the right market for the wool and learning the techniques to get the most for the goods occupies a portion of Meyer's schedule. "When you're selling through a wool warehouse to a large company, like Burlington, it's important that all the fleece be cared for properly to make it attractive to the buyer," she added.

Since coming to Morehead State, Meyer has initiated some new programs--like the recent field day--but she has retained the role of consultant started by her predecessors. She communicates with approximately 50 farms on an as needed basis and with 30 sheep producers on a regular basis.

"The main concentration is on those farms who have participated in MSU's lease/payback program," Meyer said. "I also make time to call on those who have shown an interest in the sheep industry."

While the number of sheep producers in the area has increased substantially in the last five years, none of the farms depend solely on the income from the sheep as their livelihood.

To keep everyone abreast of the latest news in the sheep industry, Meyer sends out a newsletter, "Sheep Bleats," to more than 150 producers and interested individuals. She includes marketing tips, current lamb and wool sales and step-by-step information on how to be better sheep producers.

She also holds meetings on a bimonthly basis in the 15-county area she serves and recently gave a cooking demonstration to home economics county agents on ways to prepare lamb. Encouraging those in the neighboring counties to buy the meat is a continual thrust.

In addition, Meyer looks after the 35-head flock at MSU's Derrickson Agricultural Complex. This flock is used for teaching students enrolled in various agriculture courses at Morehead State.

"There are not as many new shepherds now as there were when the program was new," Meyer explained. "Now there are shepherds who have a good start making strides to become more efficient producers." With funding from the Appalachian Regional Commission, the MSU project was begun in 1985 to find a profitable industry for the local economy.

Kentucky has a good terrain for raising sheep, Meyer said, noting the large number of high, rolling hills. With the forecasted decline in production of tobacco in the early '80s, the state's chief crop, there were numerous farms that needed to find an alternative source of income.

Sheep, unlike other farm animals, do well in rugged terrain, she noted. "That's why they are called 'sustainable agriculture,' because they are adaptable and can make money during hard times as well as good times."

Today's sheep producers have it much easier than shepherds of the 1940s. "Predators and disease played a major role in the survival of a flock," Meyer said. "These can now be controlled to a degree, but fluctuating market prices force one to stay aware of current market conditions."




