MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University's Minority Teacher Education Program (MTEP) recently hosted a weeklong seminar for 14 students from Jefferson and Fayette County Public School systems.

Morehead State, with financial assistance from the Kentucky Council on Higher Education, provides opportunities for minority students to pursue career interests in teaching.

"The focus of the summer program is to get minority students on the campus, introduce them to the University and help determine their interest in teaching so they can prepare themselves academically," said Lisa Kelly, director of MTEP.

Louisville area seniors participating in the event included:

Addie Ferguson, daughter of Yolanda Ferguson; Anita Johnson, daughter of Arnetta Johnson; Gail Mayberry, daughter of Earscine Mayberry; Letitia Robinson, daughter of Elizabeth Robinson, and Rochelle Walker, daughter of Gloria Walker, all students at duPont Manual High School;

La Shay Cooper, daughter of Drs. John and Pandora Cooper, and Tee Wortham, son of Deatrive Wortham, both students at Southern High School; and

Nicole Brown, a senior at Butler Technical Traditional High School and daughter of Geraldine Brown, and Tara Brown, a senior at Doss High School and daughter of Barbara Brown.

Two additional students--Virgil L. At the welcome luncheon, MSU President C. Nelson Grote, who was instrumental in the establishment of MTEP, told the students participating in the workshop:

"Kentucky needs minority teachers. I encourage you to think about teaching as a profession. I have been involved in education for 40 years and if I had my life to do over I would still choose teaching."

Also present at the luncheon was Dr. Sylvester Kohut Jr., dean of the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences, who said:

"There is a critical shortage of minority teachers--not only in urban areas, but suburban and rural as well. MTEP identifies and recruits those minority students with an interest in teaching and prepares them so they can return to their respective school systems as certified teachers to help fill that void."

Should the students decide to attend MSU, their progress will be monitored by staff and academic support programs will be available to help insure their success.

Jerry Gore, director of Minority Student Affairs, made a brief welcoming statement which encouraged the students to continue to strive for a level of high achievement. "Good, better, best. Never let it rest until your good is better and your better best," is a philosophy he passed on to the participants.

The weeklong activities included an orientation to University services, student life and academic programs in addition to cultural enrichment experiences and side trips to historic areas.

The students attended sessions designed to develop writing skills, research/study skills and critical thinking as well as classes emphasizing math, science, computer skills and history. Students also observed a teacher education class at MSU.

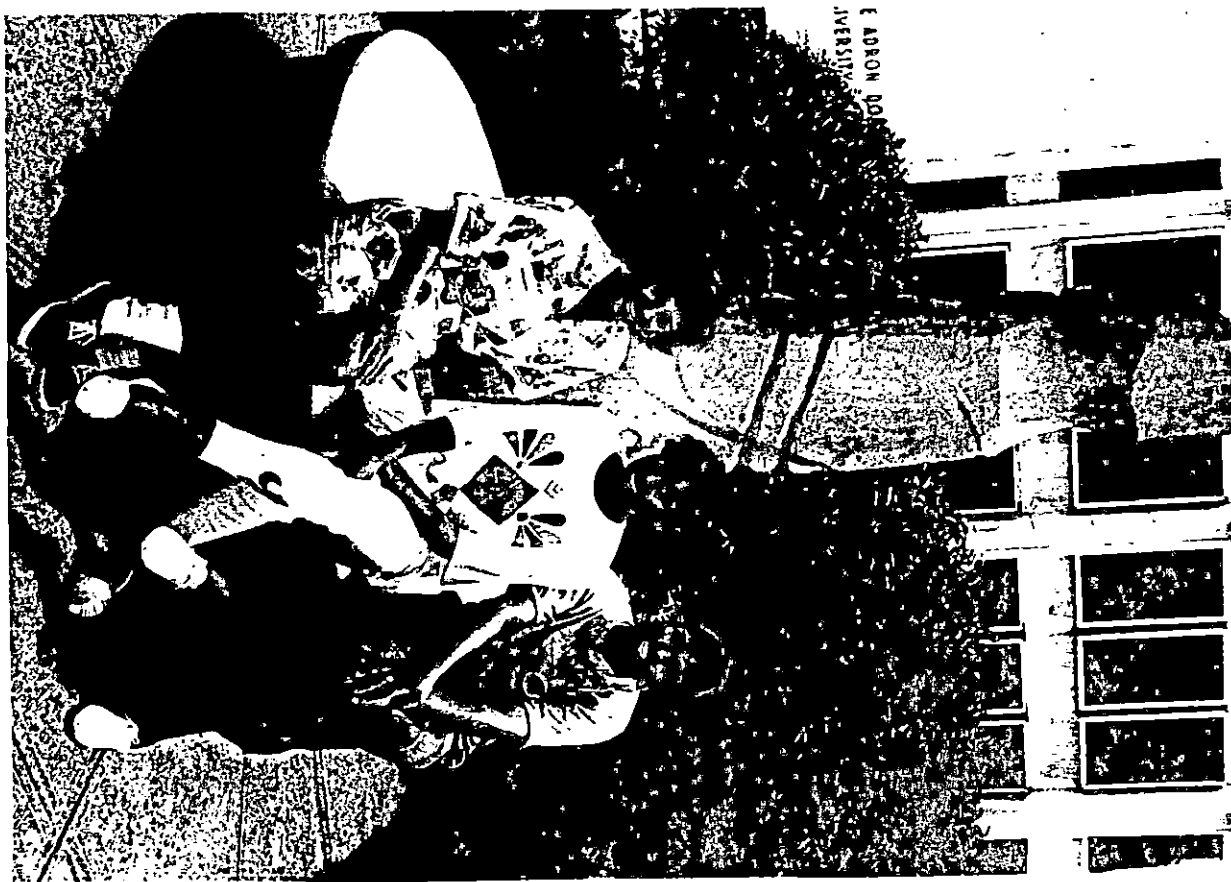

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University will be the site of a "Going into Business? Why--Why Not?" seminar on Thursday, July 18.

This is a pre-business planning program, designed to help potential business owners make objective decisions before investing their time and money.

Participants will learn what is needed to start a business and why some business ventures fail. Also included will be a discussion of questions to ask when buying an already established business.

The seminar is sponsored by the College of Business' East Kentucky Small Business Development Center, Morehead/Rowan County Chamber of Commerce, Mt. Sterling/Montgomery County Chamber of Commerce, Buffalo Trace Area Development District, Gateway Area Development District and the Kentucky Cabinet for Economic Development Small Business Division.

Registration is required in advance and will be limited to the first 20 applicants. The program will begin at 6 p.m. and there will be an \$8 fee for material costs. Arrangements will be made for the handicapped when requested in advance.

To be eligible for the Minority Student Leadership Award, applicants must be admitted to MSU as an entering freshman; be a Kentucky resident of predominantly black, Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan native, Asian or Pacific Islander descent; have demonstrated achievement in academic and/or extracurricular activities; priority to those with at least a 2.50 high school grade point average, and submit a completed scholarship application to MSU.

The award, valued at \$500 per year, is renewable if the student maintains a minimum cumulative 2.50 grade point average.

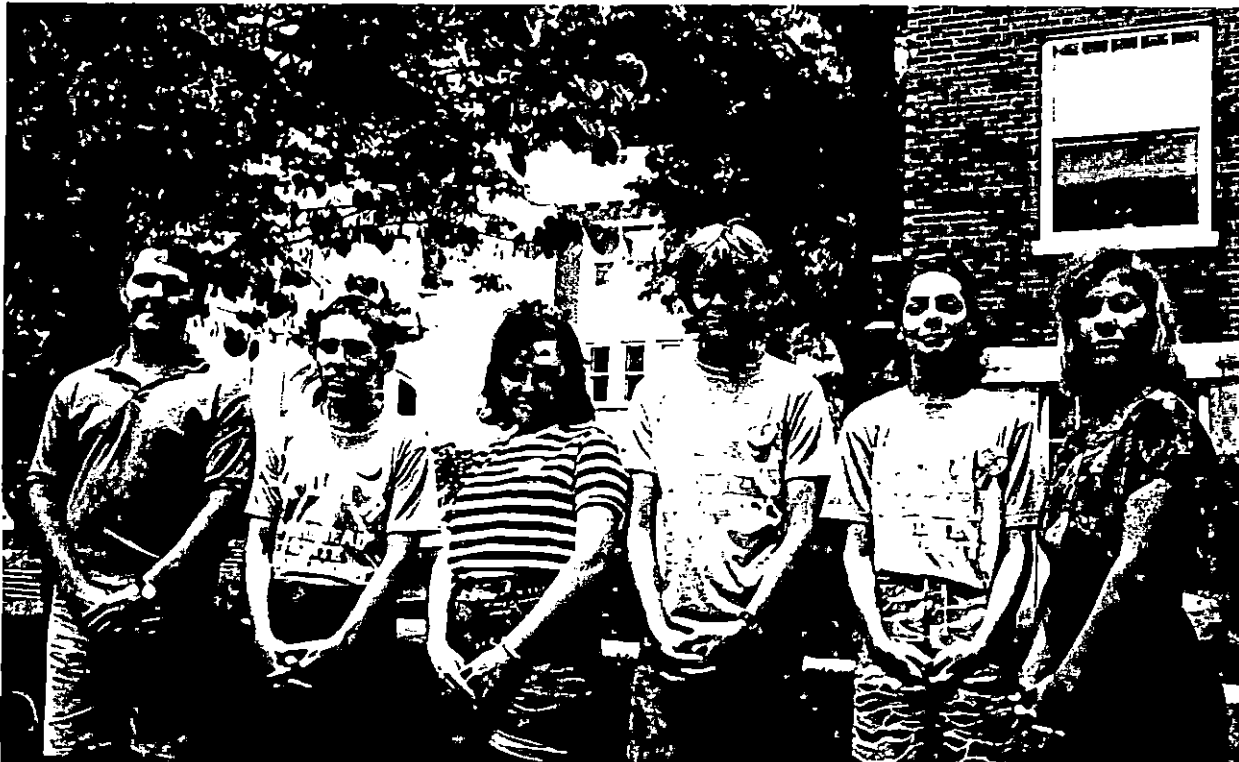

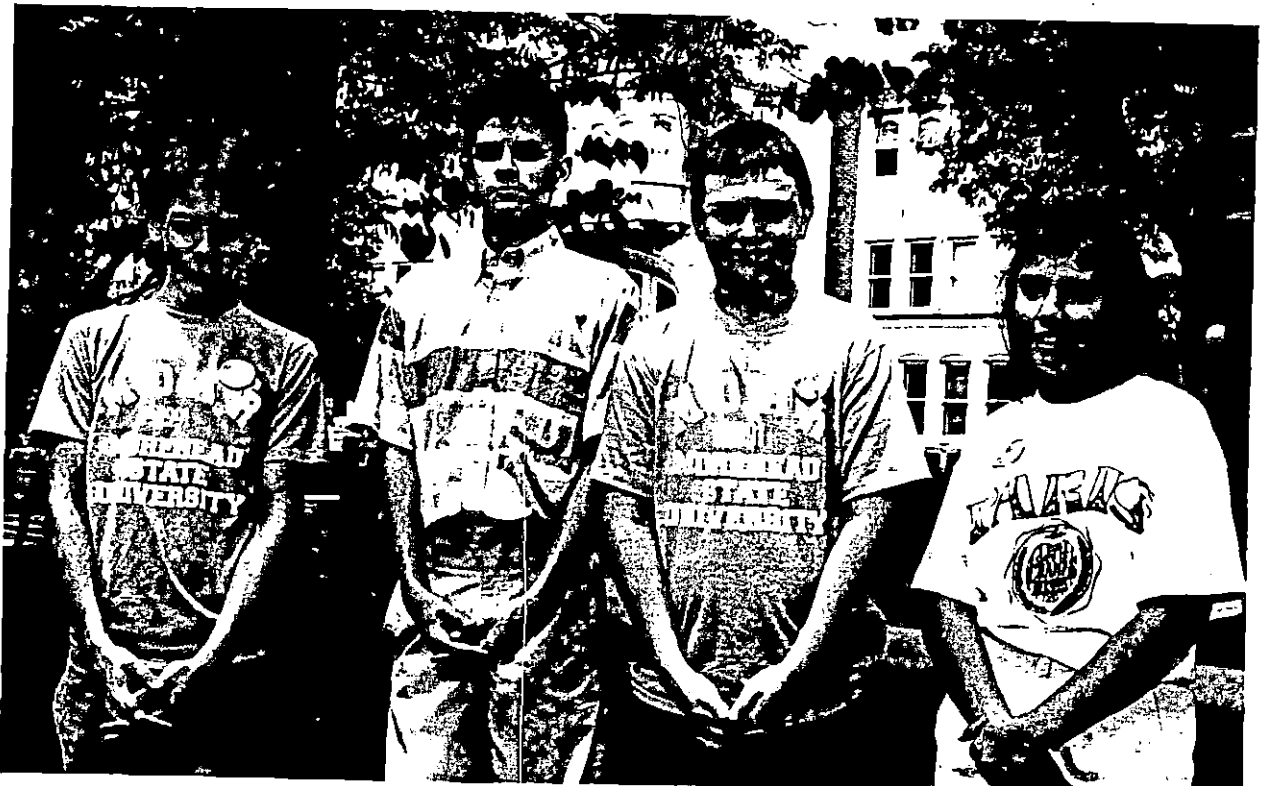

MOREHEAD, Ky. --Morehead State University recently hosted a special two-day workshop designed to assist Eastern Kentucky elementary and secondary teachers in meeting the six goals of the Kentucky Education Reform Act's 'common core of learning.'

"The sessions provided participants with some of the basic techniques which will help them integrate instruction in critical and creative thinking into course content," explained Dr. George M. Luckey Jr., MSU professor of philosophy and coordinator of faculty development.

"We tried to emphasize that all students can become good thinkers," Dr. Luckey added.

Approximately 80 public school teachers, MSU graduate students, MSU faculty and personnel from the Eastern Kentucky Correctional Complex received training sessions from two of the nation's top leaders in the field:

Sandra Parks Black, consultant, fifth grade teacher and co-author of "Building Thinking Skills" and "Organizing Thinking;"

Robert Swartz, professor of philosophy at the University of Massachusetts-Boston and co-director of the Center for Teaching Thinking of the Regional Laboratory for Educational Improvement of the Northeast and Islands.

"Those attending had the opportunity to develop lesson plans applying the skills and techniques they had learned to their individual instructional fields," Dr. Luckey added.

Sessions both days offered training in basic methods of infusing direct instruction in critical and creative thinking skills to curriculum. A smaller group attended a third daylong session designed to help teachers develop skills to train their peers in the process.

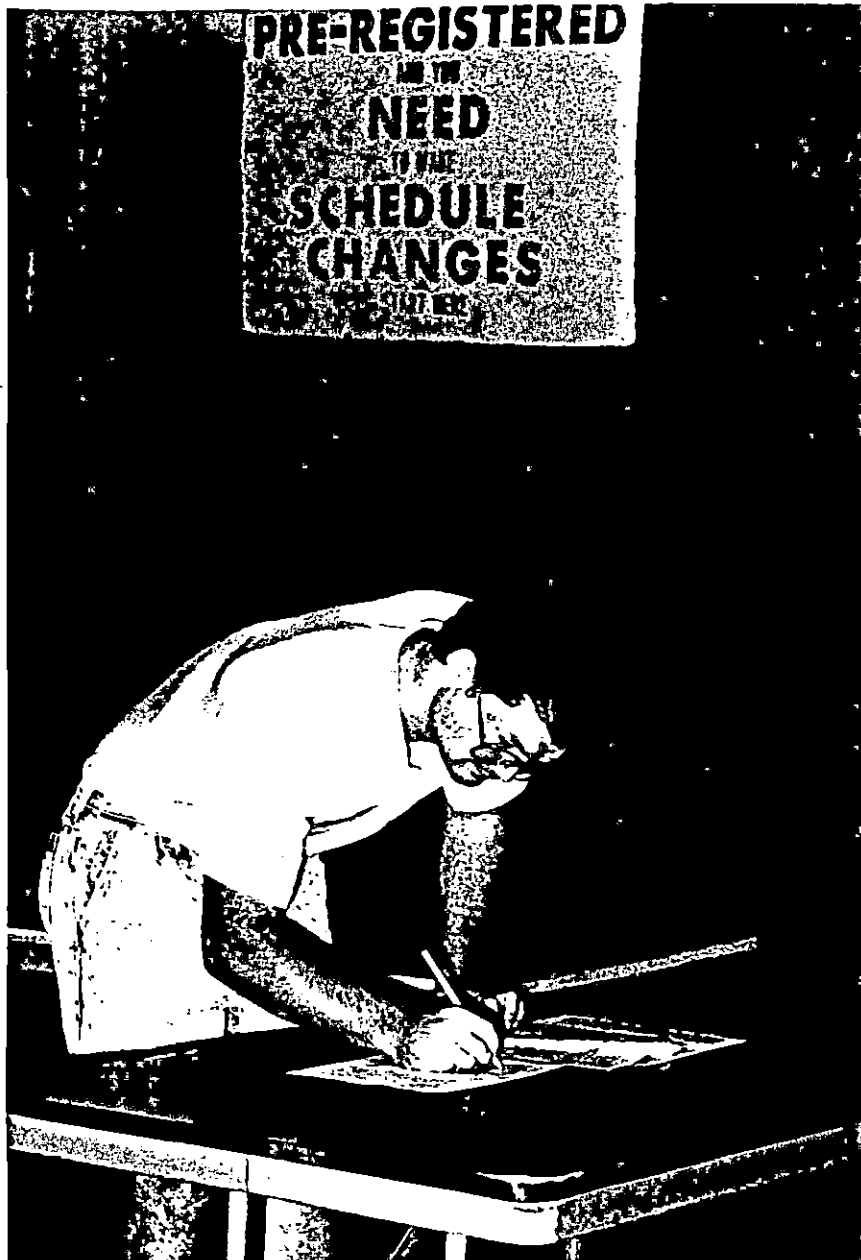

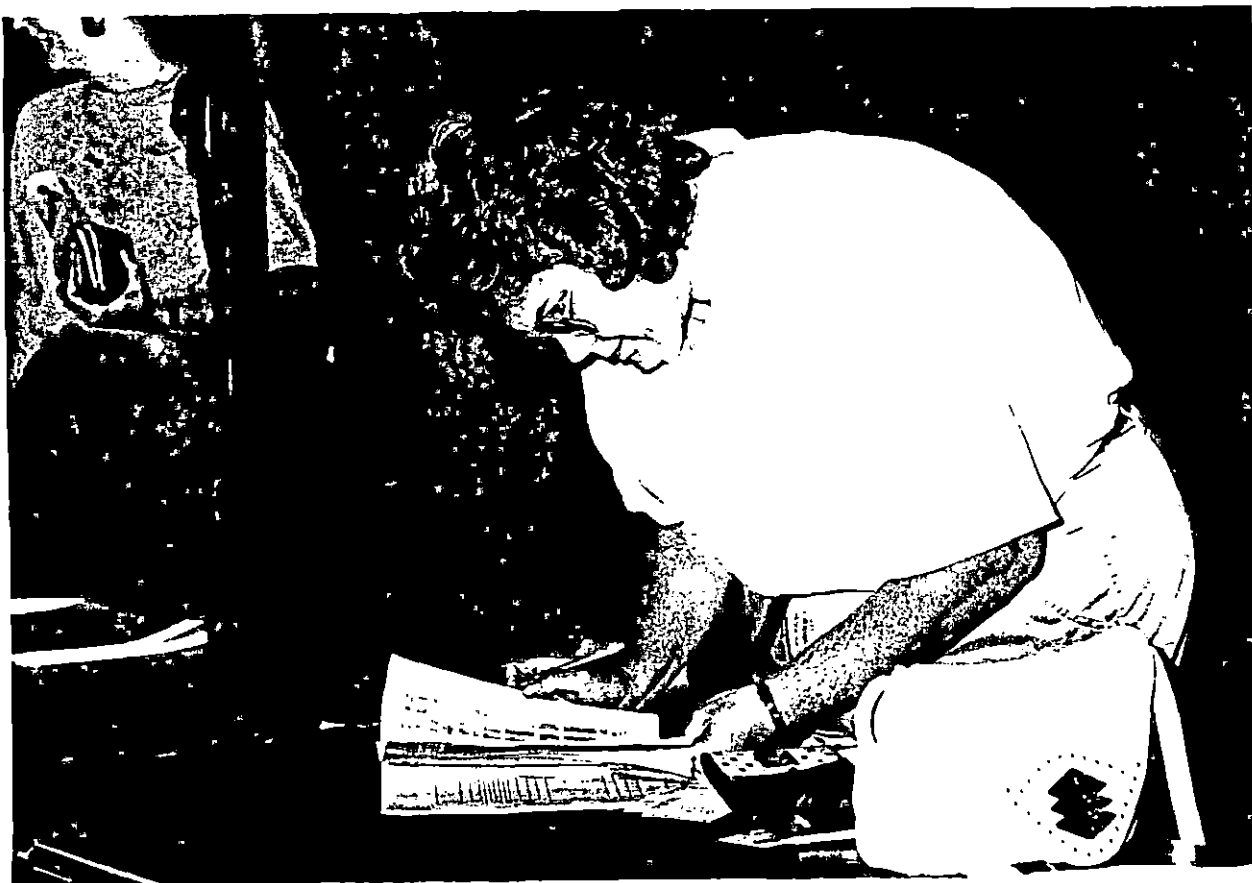

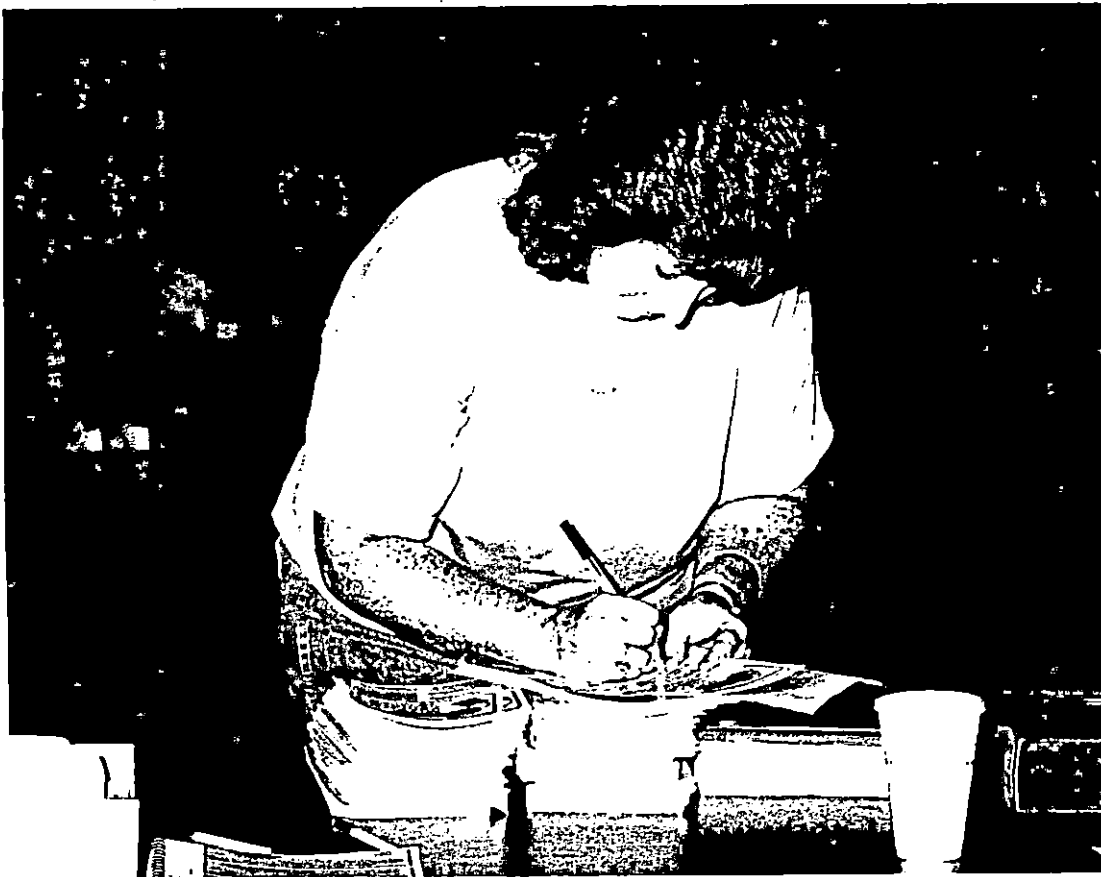

INEZ, Ky.---A surface coal mine reclamation project in which Morehead (Ky.) State University is a partner has received one of the nation's top reclamation awards.

U.S. Secretary of the Interior Manuel Lujan Jr. presented the award to the Martiki Coal Corporation in ceremonies at the Martin County mine site, overlooking nearly 800 acres of farmland which previously had been steep mountainsides before coal reserves were removed.

In a unique cooperative partnership, Morehead State University personnel provided the management and research expertise to turn the reclaimed land into verdant pasture and crop land. MAPCO Coal, the parent company of Martiki, and Pocahontas Development Corporation, a subsidiary of Norfolk Southern Corporation, provided funding for the project which began in 1982.

Lujan called the project "a perfect experiment that leads the way for others." Harry Snyder, director of the U.S. Office of Surface Mining, said it had been a "model program for years" that was finally getting its "just recognition."

Known as the Mountaintop Agricultural Complex, it includes 82,000 laying hens, 130 cross bred cows and 4,000 hogs. The farm enterprise and education/research facility utilizes animal fertilizers to improve grass and forage pastures. The reclamation and planning efforts also have created two large reservoirs which have greatly enhanced numbers of fish and wildlife.

Other dignitaries participating in the presentation ceremony were: Kentucky Senators Wendell Ford and Mitch McConnell; Representative Chris Perkins; Governor Wallace Wilkinson; Arnold B. McKinnon, president of Norfolk Southern; Dr. C. Nelson Grote, president of Morehead State University, and James E. Barnes, president of MAPCO.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Morehead State University has achieved a default rate of less than 5 percent on its Perkins Loan Program (formerly known as the National Direct Student Loan).

At the end of May, MSU's default rate for Perkins Loans, the primary student loan program, was 4.97 percent, representing an all time low for the institution, according to Michael R. Walters, MSU assistant vice president for fiscal services.

MSU is well below the 7.5 percent rate that the federal government considers acceptable for funding this program, Walters noted. Institutions exceeding that level become ineligible for federal funding under this student aid program, Walters said.

The Perkins program and the Stafford Loan Program (formerly the Guaranteed Student Loan) are two of the more commonly used student loan programs, but there is a major difference between the two.

The University is responsible for collecting loans made through the Perkins program, while Stafford collections are the responsibility of the lending bank.

Walters praised the efforts of F.D. Donaldson, MSU student loan collector, in adhering to the federal guidelines surrounding these collections. He called the resulting low default rate a reflection of Donaldson's management and organizational skills.

Loan funds collected under the Perkins program are rechanneled into the loan program, making funds available to other students who wish to attend MSU. Last year, MSU awarded more than \$500,000 in Perkins Loans to eligible students.

According to Porter Dailey, search committee chair and vice president for administration and fiscal services, the committee evaluated the candidates who came to campus for interviews and forwarded its recommendations to MSU President C. Nelson Grote.

Dr. Grote evaluated the strengths and weaknesses of those nominees and weighed this against the impending change in the University's administrative leadership, Dailey said.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---The Morehead State University Foundation has received an additional \$78,422 from the estate of a former faculty member, Dr. Norman Tant, who died in November 1986.

The residuary bequest pushes the total of the Norman and Deane Rust Tant Scholarship Endowment Fund to more than \$200,000, making it the largest bequest in MSU's history, according to Robert F. Howertown, the foundation's executive vice president.

The original bequest of \$100,000 had accrued nearly \$24,000 in interest for the fund which is co-named for Dr. Tant's wife, who died in July 1986.

The scholarship program, by Dr. Tant's design, aids students from Bath, Rowan, Menifee, Fleming, Carter and Elliott counties. Last fall the first awards of \$500 each were made to 12 students and an additional 12 awards are expected to be presented this fall.

"Dr. Tant's foresight in setting up this endowed fund was commendable," said MSU President C. Nelson Grote. "His gift will mean that future generations of students will continue to benefit from it as it enables them to pursue a university degree," he added.

Dr. Tant, a survivor of the Bataan Death March, taught at MSU from 1952 to 1977, when he retired as professor of library science and instructional media. He also served as chair of the Department of Library Sciences and was director of audio-visual education.

For several years, the Tants operated Deane's Jewelry in Morehead. In establishing the endowment prior to his death, Dr. Tant noted that the residents of the six counties targeted had supported his family businesses and that he and his wife wanted to help them in return.

"In recent years, we've noted an upsurge in estate bequests to the MSU Foundation by our alumni and other friends," said Howerton. "These and other individual gifts are helping MSU to better serve the people of its service region. We truly appreciate the generosity of our friends," Howerton said.

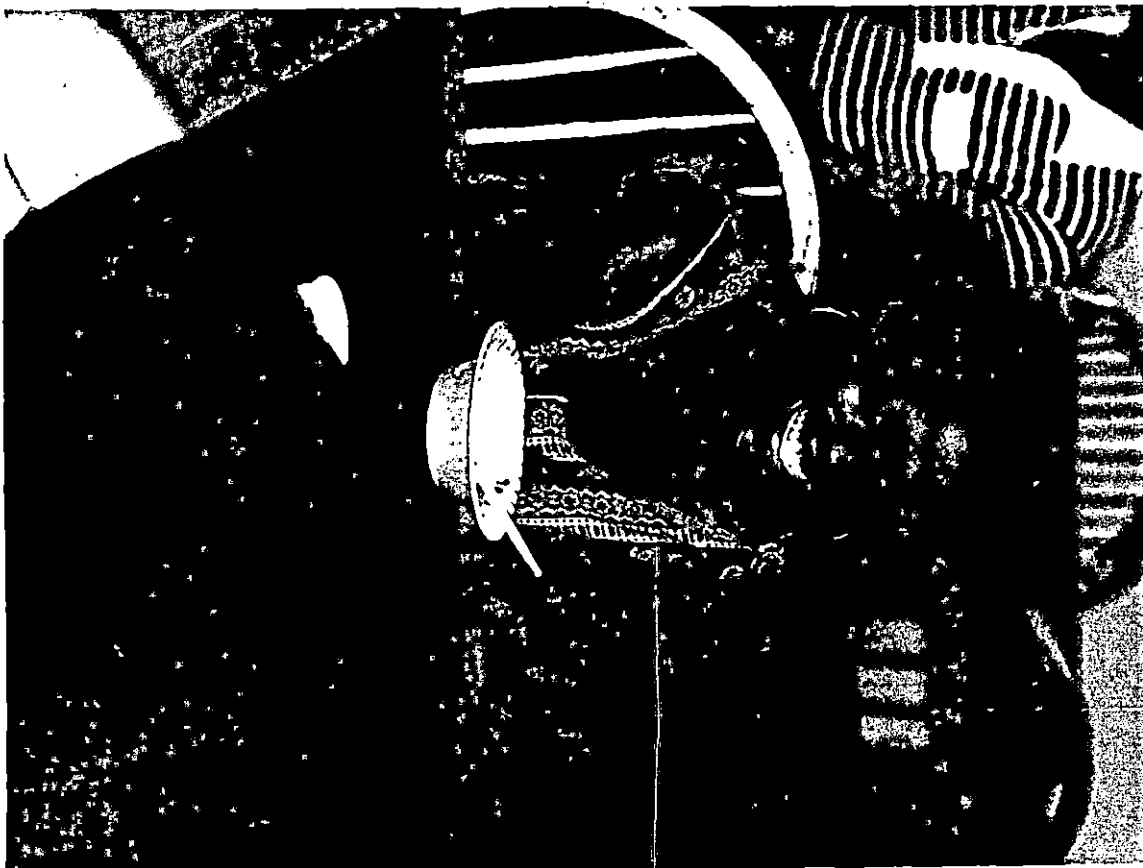

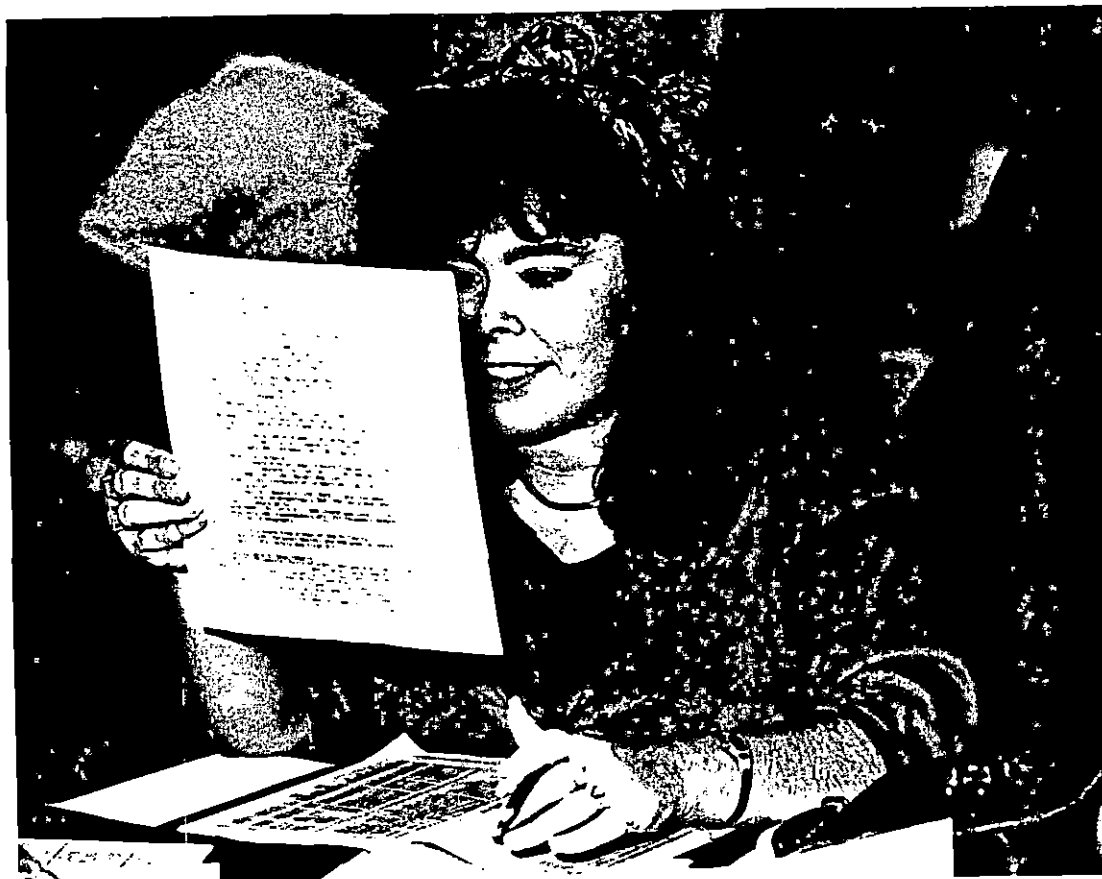

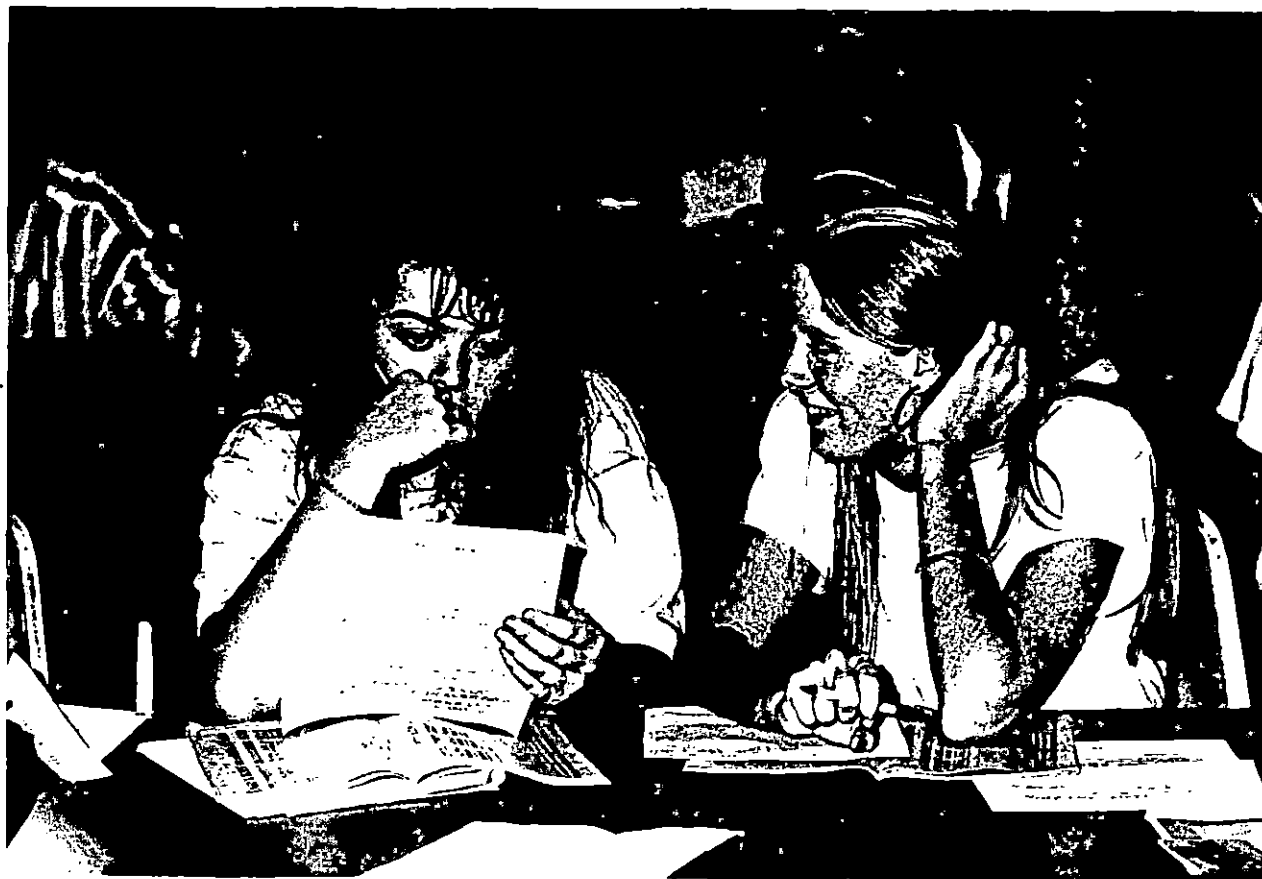

MOREHEAD, Ky.--The 1991-92 school year is fast approaching at Morehead State University and with it comes innovation, renovation and celebration.

At fall registration scheduled from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, Aug. 15-16, full-time students will encounter a new procedure that sends them to their major department to enroll for classes.

The system, designed to speed up the registration process, has been used for advance registration, but this is the first time it will be used for a fall semester, according to Gene Ranvier, registrar.

After completing a class schedule, students will pay fees Laughlin Health Building, based on the alphabetical system by last name.

All MSU classes, including evening and off-campus, will begin on Monday, Aug. 19.

When the residence halls open on Tuesday, Aug. 13, at 8 a.m., the newly renovated Thompson Hall will make its grand debut. Originally opened in 1927, Thompson Hall was in continual use until the fall of 1990 when it was closed for an interior and exterior facelift.

Similar in concept to Fields Hall, the "cluster-style" living accommodations will be designated an all female residence hall for graduate students and undergraduate honor students with at least a 3.0 grade point average.

A special orientation program for freshman and transfer students will be conducted from 9 a.m. to noon on Thursday and Friday, Aug. 15-16, in Duncan Recital Hall, while international students will meet on Thursday, Aug. 22, at 5:30 p.m. in Fields Hall.

Plans for minority students include a welcome picnic on Wednesday, Aug. 14, at 5:30 p.m., and orientation on Saturday, Aug. 17, at 2 p.m. Both activities will be held at the Cross Cultural Center.

To better meet student needs, some of MSU's academic areas have undergone reorganization. The Department of Psychology has added an area of concentration to its program of study which provides students additional coursework beyond a major in psychology.

In the Department of Information Sciences, the recently revamped Basic Business program, now called Comprehensive Business, is designed to include the teaching of basic keyboarding and computer skills in the middle grades. According to Dr. Marvin Albin, interim department chair, the program will now offer certification for grades 5-12.

For those who need help with college expenses, it's not too late to apply for federal grants, Fred Merritt, the new director of financial aid, said. The Pell Grant is based on eligibility and students who qualify can still receive money for this school year. The Stafford Loan Program is another means of funding available to students who can prove need.

"Most students don't get financial aid because they don't apply," Merritt added. "We encourage students to come by and fill out an application. They can't get assistance if they haven't filled out a financial aid application."

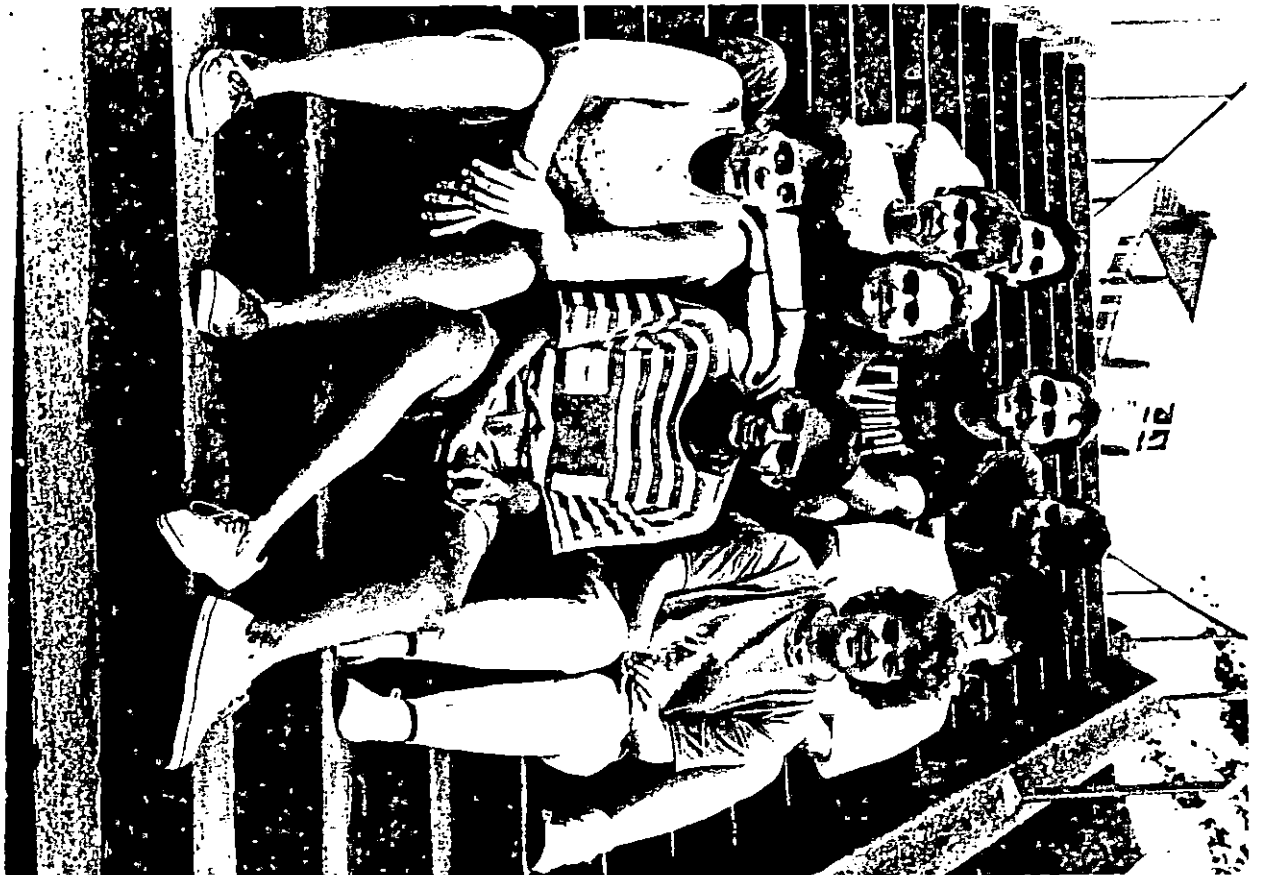
