MOREHEAD, Ky.---The U.S. does not need to go to war but needs to be strong to keep peace.

This was the message given by Brig. Gen. Robert L. DeZarn, adjutant general of Kentucky, when he addressed the nearly 300 delegates at the opening ceremonies for the 52nd annual Kentucky Boys State, Sunday, May 31.

The yearly program, sponsored by the Kentucky American Legion, is being held now through June 5 on the Morehead State University campus. The high school seniors will take part in mock government sessions designed to provide practical lessons in city and state government.

Gen. DeZarn, the state's highest ranking military officer, said the state cannot afford to be without combat engineers and military police in times of disaster and used a potential disaster to explain his point.

"If western Kentucky should have an earthquake--and pray that it doesn't happen--we still need to be prepared," he said. "This is something that would affect us all. The magnitude would be so strong as to be felt by the entire state."

Describing how Congress was authorized to limit the number of military persons in the army, the adjutant general said the recent proposed decrease would eliminate jobs for several thousand Kentuckians. "We cannot afford to lose the payroll, but the National Guard also is the force the governor uses in an emergency."

Reviewing the national arena, Gen. DeZarn stated that in one area around the equator, there were 30 shooting wars occurring each day. "Russia's economy is gone, but the weapons are still there," he said. "When they get hungry, we don't know what they will do." He told how the U.S. had bought weapons and speculated that some Third World countries also had made purchases.

He told the young men how he had just returned from the Pacific Rim--Korea, Japan and Hawaii--where he reviewed the readiness of the armed forces and the battle plan in that area as well as the economic situation.

Fielding questions from the Boys State delegates, Gen. DeZarn said he had not been in favor of abolishing the draft, but now, we have kept our standing army and "we have some truly fine military persons that I am happy to be associated with."

The adjutant general, who has spent more than 30 years in uniform, has served as engineer, artillery and armor commander. While he was in charge of Ashland's 201 unit, it was named the best unit of that type in the country.

Also welcoming the group was Jack James, president of the American Legion of Kentucky Boys State, who told the young men to learn diplomacy and teamwork to be better citizens and be more involved in the government.

"War is the failure of diplomacy on the part of the heads of government," he said.

The young men will spend the week learning about the state's political system by developing their own two-party system and electing state and city officials; serving as legislators, and introducing, debating and enacting laws as in the Kentucky General Assembly.

A graduation awards ceremony will conclude the week's activities on Friday, June 5.

The 7 p.m. event, to be held in the Crager Room, Adron Doran University Center, will be hosted by the MSU Foundation and the MSU Alumni Association.

Tickets are \$25 per person with \$15 credited as a gift to the Nelson and Wilma Grote Scholarship Endowment Fund in the MSU Foundation, Inc.

The reservation deadline is Wednesday, June 10, at 4:30 p.m. Checks should be payable to the MSU Foundation, Inc., UPO Box 1000, Morehead, KY 40351-1689. Reservations will be confirmed by telephone. The Grotes request no personal gifts and tickets will not be available at the door.

"This is an opportunity for everyone in the region to honor these two who have given so much of themselves to Morehead State University," said Alumni President Ted Coakley.

Dr. Grote, who will retire on June 30, became MSU's 11th president in July 1987. His career in education spans more than four decades, including 16 years at MSU and a total of 32 years in higher education.

MSU's Board of Regents recently awarded him emeritus status for "exemplary performance and strong personal leadership." He was granted an honorary doctoral degree last month. Dr. Grote led the University to unprecedented enrollment growth, a modernization of student housing and the campus utility system and improved faculty and staff salaries.

Although she never sought the spotlight, Mrs. Grote has been an avid supporter of Morehead State and the community. Because of her personal interest in women's issues, The Wilma E. Grote Symposium for the Advancement of Women was started at MSU last year.

"These two have been a team since they first came to Kentucky 36 years ago and we can't let them leave the campus without expressing our gratitude," Coakley added.

The Grotes plan to divide their retirement between Lexington and Seattle, Wash.

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Gov. Brereton Jones had to rearrange his schedule to allow time to visit the 1992 session of Kentucky Boys State--so he could fulfill a promise.

The governor, when he spoke to the group last year, said if he was elected governor, he would come back. When he made that commitment, he was not fully aware of the demands of being governor.

"But, it's not important that Brereton Jones is here," he told the group. "It's important that the governor of the commonwealth is here."

Believing that the future of the nation lies in its young people, Gov. Jones asked the young men to consider a career in public service. "If we don't have aggressive, honest people, our communities will not prosper."

"But," he cautioned, "should one choose public service, you must have an inner strength--like body strength. It takes a long time to develop, but you will need that," he said. "You have to have the commitment to do what is right."

Since he has been in office, Gov. Jones said he had been asked if he is having a good time. "If you're concerned about making things work, you have a lot of serious thinking to do," he said.

Fielding a variety of questions from the young men, Gov. Jones said that education is the key to success. He told them that we have lived beyond our means; suggested looking at public financing of political campaigns, and expressed concerns about health care. In dealing with the issues facing society today, he told the Boys State delegates, "you need to be part of the solutions."

The delegates also asked Gov. Jones about capital punishment, budget cuts at universities, desecration of the flag, the economy and jobs.

"It will be several weeks before we can make any announcements," he said of his recent overseas trip. "When the agreements are complete, the end result may be hundreds of jobs," he said. Gov. Jones said most jobs would be automotive oriented and would be an expansion of an existing company.

"I do not want to take credit for this," he said. "The Kentucky workforce deserves the credit because they have done such a fine job," he added, announcing that the head of Toyota considered Kentucky workers the "best in the world."

Kentucky Boys State, sponsored by the American Legion, has been held this week (May 31-June 5) on the Morehead State University campus. Activities will conclude with graduation ceremonies on Friday, June 5.

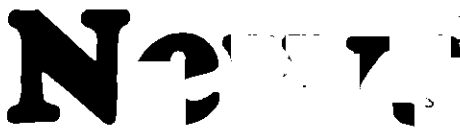

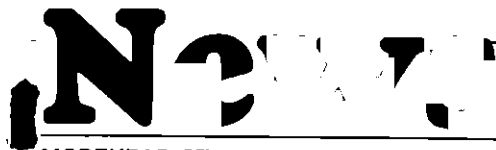

Three dramatical performances will be held during the weeklong celebration.

On Monday, June 22, at 1:45 p.m. in the Adron Doran University Center (ADUC) as part of the Celebration of Appalachian Women's Symposium, Carol Crowe-Carraco, who is a professor of history at Western Kentucky University, will present her one-woman show, "Mary Carson Breckinridge: Angel on Horseback."

The school, held at night because the majority of illiterates were employed during the day, was know as "The Moonlight School" and later became a model for adult education throughout the world.

Featured on Friday, June 26, at 3:30 p.m. in ADUC, as part of the Jesse Stuart Symposium, James Lowe, teacher of English in Barren County, will present his one-man show, "Yours Respectfully, Jesse Stuart."

Stuart, Kentucky's poet laureate and one of its most prolific writers, was also a teacher, a farmer, an environmentalist, and a worldwide spokesman for Kentucky's mountain people and their way of life.

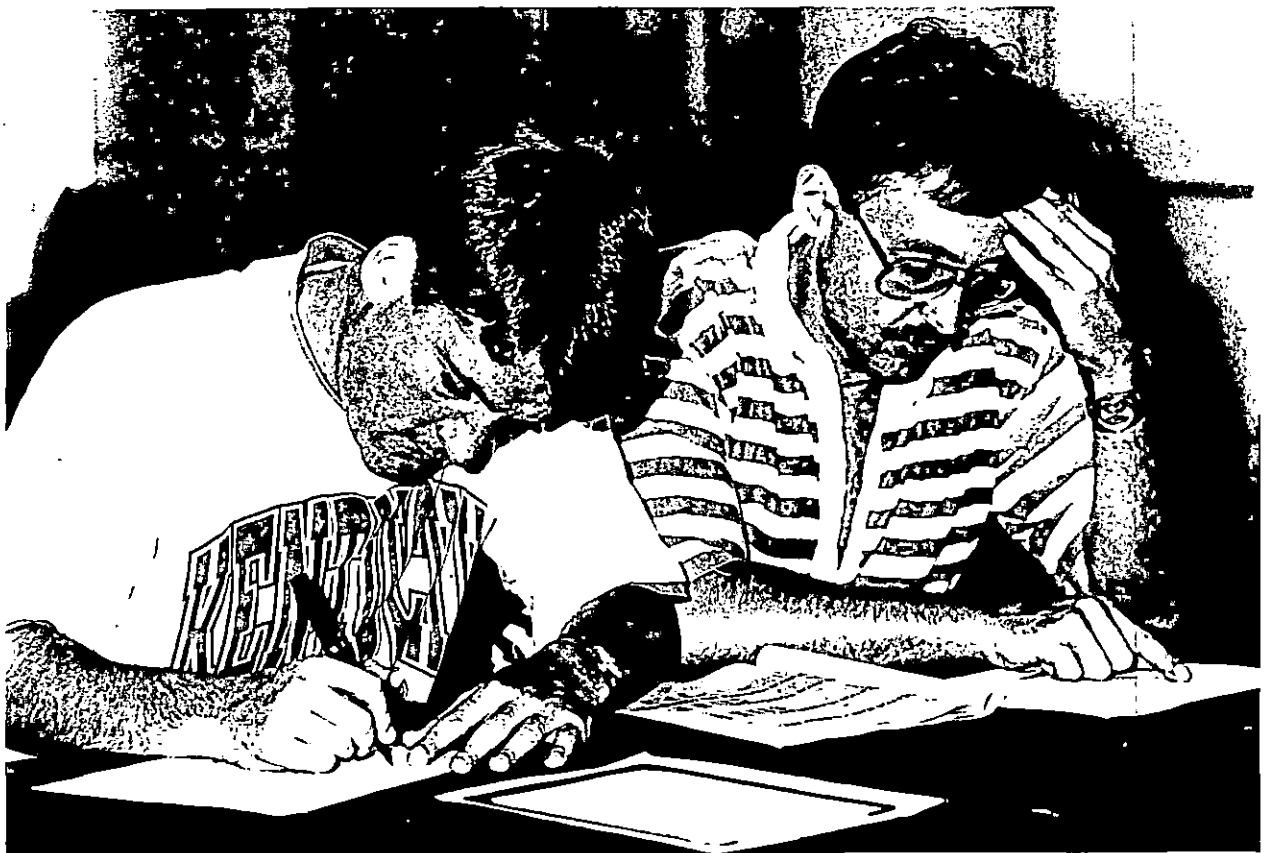

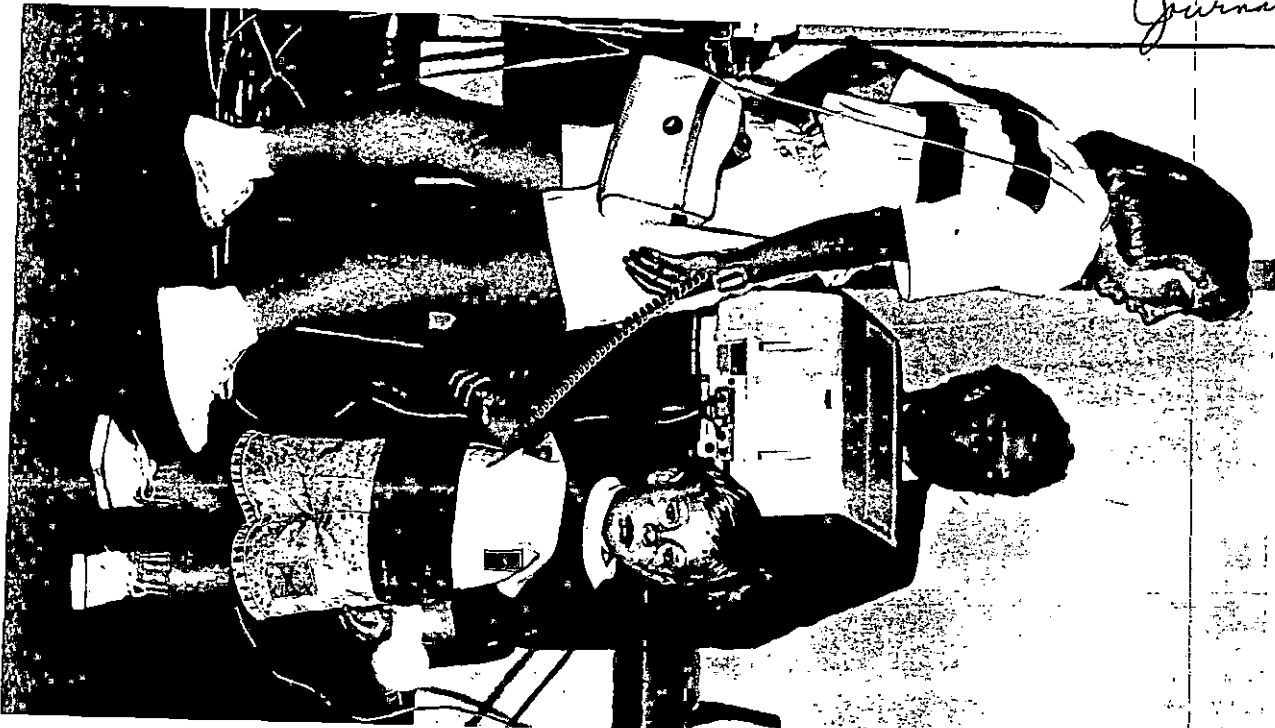

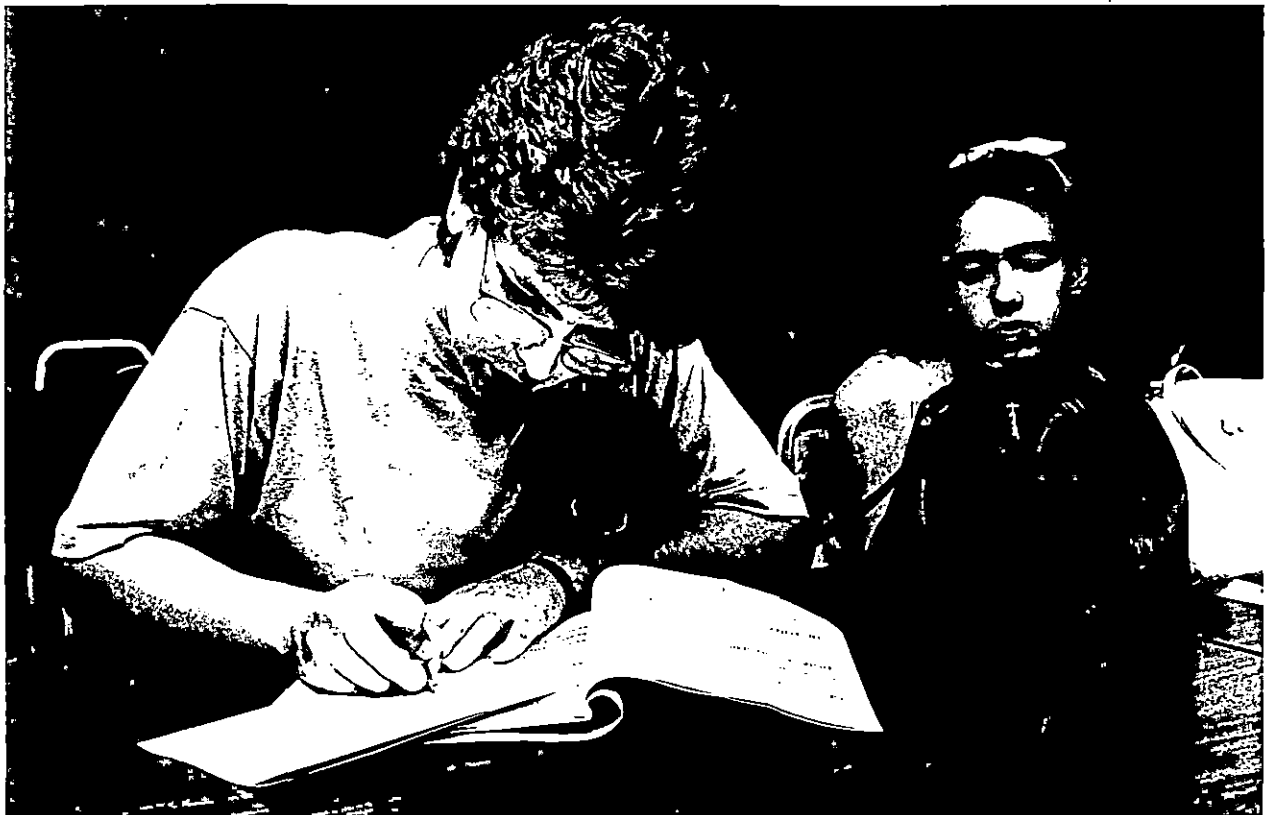

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Lyndall "Granny" Toothman, Morehead State University's 82-year-old artist-in-residence, will receive the fifth Appalachian Treasure Award at the opening reception of the University's 16th annual Appalachian Celebration.

The reception, set for Sunday, June 21, will be held in the Gold Room, Adron Doran University Center, beginning at 6:30 p.m.

The Appalachian Treasure Award is given to recognize an individual with unusual talents and dedication in promoting and preserving Appalachian culture. MSU President C. Nelson Grote will make the presentation to Toothman.

Toothman, who has been weaving and spinning at MSU since 1985, is best known for her weaving technique which uses a wide variety of hair types. She has given demonstrations of her craft throughout the United States and is a regular participant in the Appalachian Celebration where she has done numerous sheep-to-shawl demonstrations.

Born in West Virginia, Toothman lived in a log cabin during her early years. It was there she learned to make clothes, soap, toys and other items for her family as they lived through the hardships of the Depression.

In the late 1930s, Toothman began teaching weaving at the Alderson Women's Reformatory in W.Va., the first women's prison in the U.S. It was here she met Rose Kennedy, who came to visit her daughter Eunice who was doing a practicum at the facility to complete requirements for her college degree.

After 13 years at the prison, Toothman swapped her furniture for a pick-up truck and trailer and headed west, picking fruits and vegetables along the way.

She began working at amusement parks such as Knotts Berry Farm in California and Old Tucson in Arizona in the 1950s and Silver Dollar City in Missouri in the '60s.

While at Old Tucson, during the filming of the TV series "High Chaparral," her job was to entertain tourists between the scenes. It was a tourist who got Toothman more involved in the spinning process when she challenged her to spin the hair of three Samoyed dogs into yarn. Since that time, she has entertained thousands of festival/fair visitors by spinning almost any fiber they suggest.

She has spun the hair of more than 100 breeds of dogs, buffalo fur, yucca plants, Clydesdale mane, baby penguin and human hair. Last year she added a new type--the hair of a whale.

Where do whales have hair? According to Toothman, the tongue of the Baleen whale is 14 feet long and has hair down both sides. In the early days, the tongue was used to make staves for women's corsets.

According to the weaver, the hardest hair to work with is that from a chinchilla because it is so soft and fine.

Keeping samples of the hair types she has weaved, Toothman displays them on boards for viewers. She has sold four of these boards to Ripley's Believe it or Not: One is displayed in their Gatlinburg, Tenn., location while another went overseas to England.

The Appalachian artist continues to demonstrate her talents for festival goers. Earlier this year she participated in her 14th year at the Strawberry Festival in Plant City, Fla., and in October will make her ninth visit to John Rice Irwin's Museum of the Appalachias in Norris, Tenn.

The best part of her life is training others in her art. "I have taught hundreds and hundreds to weave," Toothman said. "So many of them have thanked me for making a mark in their lives."

But Toothman also is recorded in print. Having been associated for many years with Foxfire books, she appears in the winemaking edition and the Christmas Storybook. Their latest publication also includes one of her articles.

MSU's Appalachian Celebration, under way June 21-27, will feature a variety of events that focus on the traditions, heritage and crafts of the mountains.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---A recent acquisition to Morehead State University's Camden-Carroll Library will be of special significance to the region's genealogists.

The library has received the 1920 federal census for Kentucky on microfilm. It may be found on CCL's fourth floor with government publications and micrographics.

"The census is a research tool that provides additional help to people who are tracing their forebearers," explained Margaret Davis, CCL librarian.

"The lengthy delay between when the information was gathered and when the government made it public was a privacy factor. The government considered 72 years to be the normal life expectancy at that time," she said.

Arranged by state and then by county, the format and information in the 1920 census closely resemble that of 1910, but questions relating to unemployment or about military service during the Civil War were not included. Four new questions were added: one asking for the date of naturalization and three about the individual's mother tongue.

As a result of boundary changes from World War I, the city or province was requested of individuals born in or whose parents were born in Austria-Hungary, Germany, Russia or Turkey.

"That particular change will make it easier for people to track information on ancestors from those countries," Davis said.

The 1920 census takers listed people as residents of the place where they regularly slept, not where they worked or were visiting. Those with no regular residence were counted as residents of where they were living at the time. If family members were temporarily absent, census takers could either list them with the household or enter their names on the last schedule of that subdivision.

Traditionally, the compiling of census data was begun in April and was in conflict with the spring and early summer harvests. In 1920 at the request of the Department of Agriculture, the start-up date was moved to January. Department officials argued that launching the survey prior to harvest season would result in more people being at home.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---Enrollment for Morehead State University's Summer I term shows an increase over the same period last year, according to preliminary figures released today by the Office of the Registrar.

A total of 2,644 students are taking classes this term, an increase of 24 students or about 1 percent over Summer I 1991.

Gains of more than 13 and 17 percent respectively were seen at the freshman and sophomore levels as well as a 7 percent increase at the senior level.

For MSU President C. Nelson Grote, the increase means a personal record in his professional career remains unbroken. During his five years as president, MSU has reported enrollment growth in every summer term and regular semester.

"These constant enrollment increases that MSU has experienced is doubly meaningful for me," said Dr. Grote, who retires as the University's 11th president on June 30. "The MSU record means that in 21 years as head of institutions of higher education, I have never faced a declining enrollment," said Dr. Grote.

It was an evening of laughter intermingled with only a few tears, as more than 300 friends paid tribute to Morehead State University President C. Nelson Grote and Mrs. Grote as they prepare to leave their home of the past five years.

Old friends and new, civic and political figures, higher education and public school officials, current and former regents and a host of other Grote fans gathered in the Adron Doran University Center to wish them Godspeed.

Dr. Grote, who retires from the presidency on June 30, was subjected to irreverant roasting and sincere toasting during the program which followed dinner.

From a slide show emceed by Keith Kappes, MSU's vice president for University Advancement, to expressions of praise for Dr. Grote's efforts on behalf of higher education, the tributes flowed.

His legacy, Dr. Gary Cox, executive director of the Council on Higher Education, said of Dr. Grote would be "the reattachment" of MSU to its service region.

Speaking on behalf of past and present regents, former Gov. Louie B. Nunn, ex-chair of MSU's board, said that Dr. Grote's contributions at MSU and in the state had been tremendous and called him "a great president." Gov. Nunn headed the board that selected Dr. Grote.

The president was described by his colleague, Eastern Kentucky University President Hanly Funderburk, as "an effective spokesman for this University and for all regional universities to the CHE, to the legislature and the region."

Mrs. Grote's contributions to the University and community also were recognized with a presentation from Shirley Hamilton with MSU's Regional Development Services: a mock passport good for 100 years that guaranteed safe passage for her and "one guest through the Winchester Wall and into Eastern Kentucky."

In his remarks, President Grote told his well-wishers that "presidents don't really do things on their own, a great number of people are responsible for our accomplishments. We can only hope that MSU has been a better place because we were here."

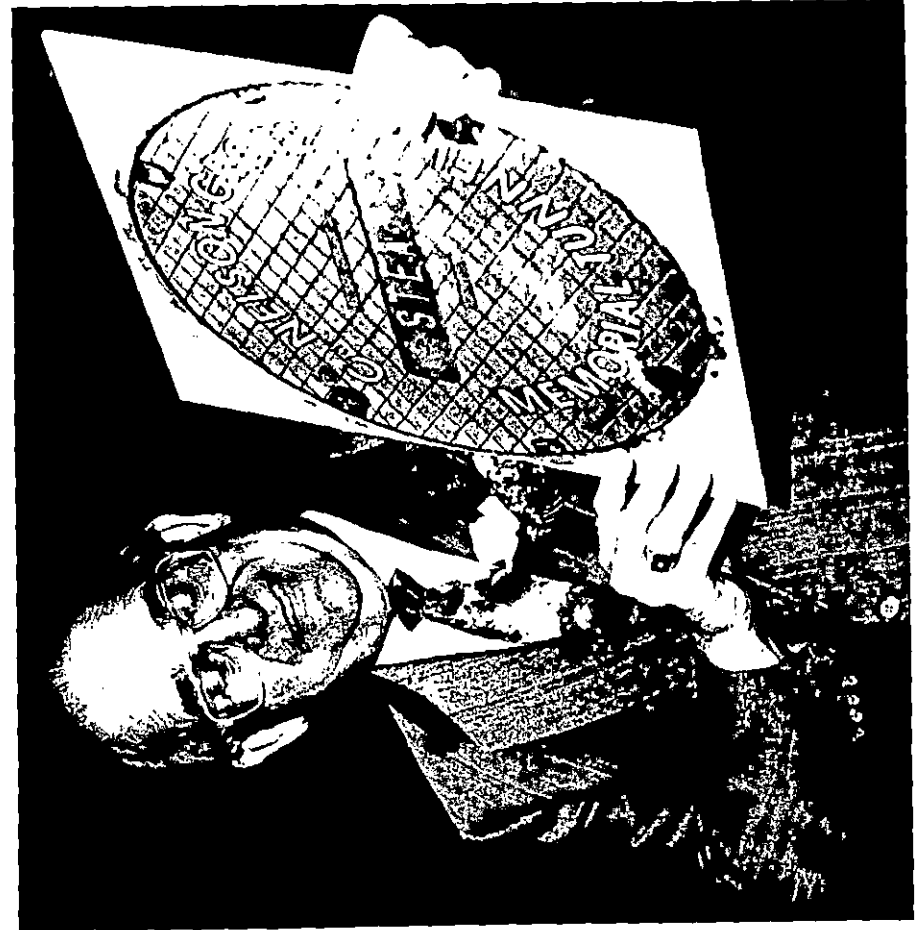

MOREHEAD, Ky.—Morehead State University Veterinary Technology Program's full accreditation status has been extended through Dec. 31, 1993.

The certification was granted by the Committee on Veterinary Technician Education and Activities (CVTEA) of the American Veterinary Medical Association following review of MSU's program.

"The faculty members are to be commended for their hard work in maintaining the high quality of this program," said MSU President C. Nelson Grote. "We have continuously met the rigorous standards set forth by the accrediting agency; this record stands for itself."

The program is designed to produce veterinary technicians that are qualified to assist in all areas of veterinary work, according to Dr. Scott Rundell, assistant professor of veterinary technology. "Because of the strong teaching environment, students learn practical skills that are well received in the marketplace," he said, noting that hundreds of program graduates have been placed in jobs.

One asset of MSU's program, that is not duplicated by very many other programs, is the resources available at the University farm. "Not many schools have the farm animal and equine population we have," Dr. Rundell said. "A great number of students, who come to Morehead State to study veterinary technology, come for this reason."

Another aspect that appeals to the students is the Pet Rehabilitation Program. While providing teaching cases as well as a public service, homeless and injured animals are accepted to be rehabilitated and placed in permanent domestic settings.

Upon completion of the program, some students assist in private veterinary practices, but in recent years, more are going into institutional settings, Dr. Rundell said.

The Vet Tech Program began as an associate degree offering at MSU in 1977 and has retained full accreditation status since that time. It is administered through the Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources in the College of Applied Sciences and Technology.

MOREHEAD, Ky.---An interdisciplinary four-year degree program in Early Childhood Development will make its debut this fall at Morehead State University.

Housed within the Department of Home Economics, the program has been designed to meet the personnel needs of the region's school districts as they comply with provisions of the 1990 Kentucky Education Reform Act.

Under KERA, all school districts now must offer half-day developmental programs to four-year-olds considered "at risk" and similar services to handicapped children between the ages of three and five.

MSU gave this program the "highest priority" in its strategic direction of helping to improve the educational level of Kentucky's citizens, according to Dr. John C. Philley, interim vice president for academic affairs.

"The University is committed to supporting the public schools as they implement KERA-related activities and the B.S. degree in early childhood development responds directly to KERA mandates," Dr. Philley said.

"The College of Applied Sciences and Technology is pleased to have an opportunity to join with the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences in responding to KERA," said Dr. Charles M. Derrickson, dean of the College of AS&T.

"The challenges to higher education in assisting with KERA cut across disciplines and afford all of us an opportunity to demonstrate our commitment to serving the region," Dr. Derrickson added.

"In MSU's service region more than 40 percent of the children are economically-deprived which means that there is a dire need out there for trained early childhood professionals," said Dr. Marilyn Sampley, department chair. "Right now there are more job openings in this field than there are graduates from pre-school instructional-related fields," said Dr. Sampley.

"And as more early childhood centers are established--both funded federally and by private enterprise--the need for trained professionals will increase," she added.

"MSU's program was created to fill this particular need," said Carolyn Taylor, MSU associate professor of home economics, who, with Dr. Sampley, developed the curriculum.

At present, the Kentucky Department of Education does not offer certification in early childhood, but a KDE task force was created and has recommended 11 competency areas in the field. "Our program includes coursework to meet those competencies which may become requirements once certification is established," said Taylor.

(MORE)

Currently, the interdisciplinary degree program's curriculum offers two options: one for teacher certification once that becomes available and another which is designed for those working in privately-franchised early childhood centers. The first option includes a minor in special education. Both of these options meet the recommended early childhood competencies.

Students graduating from the program will be prepared to plan, implement and evaluate early childhood programs; be qualified to administer early childhood development centers, and to work with children who have special needs.

The interdisciplinary curriculum includes a wide range of classes in child development, nutrition and family life as well as introductory level courses in art, computers, literature for young readers, music, psychology and elementary science.

In addition to in-class coursework, MSU's early childhood program provides a number of hours of observation in early childhood settings, field experiences and eight to 12 hours of a practicum.

MSU's Child Development Laboratory, which is accredited by the National Academy of Early Childhood Programs, will be one of the main sites for clinical experiences.

The University already offers an interdisciplinary two-year degree in early childhood which prepares students to work as paraprofessionals under the supervision of a teacher with the four-year degree.

"Our four-year degree program builds upon that two-year degree," said Taylor.

Among her professional achievements are an award-winning program to assist high risk students succeed which she designed and development of computerized systems for recruiting and tracking students.

Since the mid-1980s, MSU officials have been working closely with Prestonsburg Community College and other educators, as well as civic leaders, to identify the needs of the Big Sandy area's people, who have two years of college, and make additional work available to them leading to a four-year degree.

In 1989, the Council on Higher Education designated MSU's regional site in Prestonsburg as an extended campus center. With CHE approval, MSU is authorized to offer at least 75 percent of the upper division coursework leading to specific bachelor degrees at extended campus centers.

Currently at the Big Sandy ECC, MSU offers two plus two programs in elementary education, accounting, management and nursing as well as six graduate programs in education.

Unduplicated enrollment at the center for fall 1991 was 486 students and 39 classes were offered.
